Sri Lankan protesters find millions from Prez's house

Protesters who stormed President Gotabaya Rajapaksa's house on Saturday amid the country's worst economic crisis claimed to have recovered a large sum of money from the mansion, local media reported.

According to Sri Lanka's daily newspaper, Daily Mirror, it was reported that the recovered money was handed over to the security units.

Several dramatic videos have been doing the rounds on social media after Saturday's upheaval where thousands of protesters stormed his official residence in the capital of Colombo, forcing him to flee to an unknown location. With the demand for President Gotabaya Rajapaksa's resignation, they stormed into the President's house, tore down security cordons placed by police, took a dip in the swimming pool and romped through his kitchen and home. In one of the videos on social media, protesters are seen counting the currency notes that they claimed were unearthed from the President's official residence, said the media outlet.



India stands with people of Sri Lanka: MEA

NEW DELHI: In its first reaction to the flurry of fast-paced developments in Colombo, India on Sunday said it stands with the people of Sri Lanka as they seek to realise their aspirations for prosperity and progress through democratic means, values and constitutional framework. Ministry of External Affairs (MEA) Spokesperson Arindam Bagchi said India continues to closely follow the developments in Sri Lanka and that it is aware of the many challenges that the country and its people have been facing. Embattled Sri Lankan President Gotabaya Rajapaksa on Saturday announced that he will resign after angry protesters stormed his official residence and set Prime Minister Ranil Wickremesinghe's private residence on fire. "We are aware of the many challenges that Sri Lanka and its people have been facing, and we have stood with the Sri Lankan people as they have tried to overcome this difficult period," Bagchi said.

3 arrested for setting PM's residence on fire

COLOMBO: Sri Lanka's Kollupitiya Police arrested three people in connection with the arson attack on Prime Minister Ranil Wickremesinghe's private house. The arrested people included a 19-year-old from Mount Lavinia and two persons aged 24 and 28 who were residents of Kadawatha and Galle, Daily Mirror reported citing the police. The police have mentioned that further investigation is being carried out by the Kollupitiya police to arrest the other suspects as well. Sri Lankan protesters broke into Prime Minister Ranil Wickremesinghe's private residence and set it on fire on Saturday, angered by the unprecedented economic crisis. Manohar Lal said that the State Government is making the Backward Classes Commission afresh. After its formation, this Commission will also take care of all the problems of the community. It will be ensured that the beneficiaries get the benefits of all the schemes through the Commission. Sh. Manohar Lal said that Lohgarh, the capital of Baba Banda Singh, will be developed and the inclusion of Baba Lakhi Shah Vanjara's name will also be ensured. He said that some people of this community come under Scheduled Castes and some are in backward class, we have written to the central government for-

warding the communities demands. The Chief Minister appealed that only those who are more vulnerable in the society should be included in Scheduled Castes. Sh. Gupta passed away at a private hospital in Haryana's Gurugram on Saturday after a prolonged illness. Her mortal remains were brought to Lucknow late at night. Her mortal remains were taken to the Pipra Ghat from Mulayam Singh Yadav's Vikramaditya Marg residence in a truck. Many SP leaders and supporters joined the funeral procession. Prateek Yadav performed the last rites of his mother. Mulayam Singh Yadav witnessed the last rites from inside his SUV and did not step out due to health reasons.

HP : 1 Covid death & 71 more test positive

DHARAMSHALA: One person in Kangra district died of Covid 19 Sunday and at least 71 fresh cases tested positive on Sunday for the lethal novel Coronavirus in one day, in Himachal Pradesh pushing the Himachal Pradesh state case load to 287535. The fresh cases included highest 19 from Chamba and followed by 24 in Kangra district. Spokesman of the Health Department told a news agency that all the 71 fresh cases who have tested positive today have been isolated as per the protocol.

The spokesman said Sunday there was one Covid death reported from Kangra district of this hill state the death toll has gone up to 4124. Dr. Gurdharshan gupta CMO Kangra told UNI that a 47 year old male from village Slate Godam, near Yol Cantonment tehsil Dharamshala district Kangra who was admitted to DRP Govt. Medical College Tanda.

Police seizes 35 country-made pistols, 6 desi katta from Palwal

Effecting one of the biggest ever seizures of illegal arms, Haryana Police has confiscated 35 country-made pistols, 6 desi katta alongwith 11 magazines from the possession of two accused in Palwal district.

Sharing the information here today, the Haryana Police spokesperson informed that arrested accused identified as Kilaur Singh and Jam Singh are native of district Barwani in Madhya Pradesh. During interrogation, the accused revealed that they procured illegal weapons from Barwani in Madhya Pradesh for supply to local miscreants in Palwal, Nuh and Delhi areas. The arrested accused are being thoroughly interrogated to know the buyers of the weapons.

Giving details of the operation, he said that a police team during patrolling in Hodal area got secret input that two youths who used to supply illegal weapons in



Haryana, Delhi, Rajasthan and Punjab would be coming with a large cache of illegal weapons. Acting swiftly, police established a naka. After some time, two men with bags in their hands were seen coming down from a truck, who were shocked to see the police party in front and started turning back but were nabbed. During the search of the accused, 41 illegal weapons including 35 country-made pistols, 6 desi katta and 11 magazines were recovered from their bags.

A case has been registered against them and a thorough probe is underway. In Palwal, police have so far recovered 168 illegal weapons in 111 cases registered in 2022 by nabbing 113 accused.

Gadkari calls for time-bound court rulings to save nation from financial loss

Highlighting the delay in rulings by the judiciary, Union Minister for Road Transport and Highways Nitin Gadkari on Sunday said that if the courts give verdicts within a time limit, the country can be saved from financial loss.

Speaking at an event in Nagpur, the Union Minister said, "An independent, impartial and fair judicial system is essential for a free and



fair democracy. If the court gives its decision within the time limit, then the country can be saved from the loss of lakhs of crores of rupees. I have seen big companies getting ruined due to delays in justice. And by the time they get justice from the government or the court, they become dead."

Gadkari said that when tribunals were discussed in the cabinet, he had put his point in front of the Union Law Minister and Prime Minister Naren-

dra Modi. "Often I say to Prime Minister Narendra Modi and the Law Minister that whatever decision is to be given, it is the right of the judiciary. No one should interfere with that or it should not be influenced by anybody. But there should be a time limit for the decisions so that country can be saved from economic loss."

Maharashtra Deputy Chief Minister Devendra Fadnis, Supreme Court judges Justice Bhushan Gavai Justice PS Narasimha and senior judges of the Mumbai High Court were present at the event.

Maharashtra rains: 9 dead in last 24 hours

MUMBAI, JULY 10

As many as nine people have lost their lives due to incessant rainfall and its related incidents in Maharashtra in the last 24 hours, the State Disaster Management Department informed on Sunday.

According to the Maharashtra SDMD, a total of 76 people have died since June 1 and as many as 838 houses were damaged due to the rain-related incidents in the state.

"At least 4,916 people have been shifted to safer locations, and 35 relief camps were

set up by the disaster management department and rehabilitation department," it said.

The SDMD said 125 animals have also lost their lives in rain/flood-related incidents in Maharashtra since June 1.

Several parts of Maharashtra have witnessed heavy rainfall over the past few days amidst the wet spell on the state since the onset of a torrential monsoon.

The capital city has been witnessing heavy rain since Monday following which areas are waterlogged and traffic movement has been affected.

Kuldeep Bishnoi meets Shah, Nadda

MLA from Haryana Kuldeep Bishnoi met Home Minister Amit Shah and BJP President JP Nadda on Sunday, setting out speculations that he may join the party.

Bishnoi was accused of cross-voting in the recently held Rajya Sabha polls in Haryana which resulted in the defeat of Congress nominee Ajay Maken, and was expelled from the Congress.

After meeting the BJP leaders, Bishnoi tweeted heaping praise on both the leaders. He called Shah a true leader, and lauded Nadda for taking BJP to unprecedented heights.

"Meeting Amit Shah ji was an honour and a pleasure. A true political leader, talking to him I could feel his aura and charisma. His perspective for India is amazing," Bishnoi said in a tweet. On his meeting with Nadda, in a tweet in Hindi, he said, "I am honoured to meet JP Nadda ji. His simple and polite behaviour makes him extraordinary. In his capable



leadership, BJP has achieved unprecedented heights. I pray for his long life and good health".

He also posted pictures with both leaders.

Bishnoi is the younger son of former Haryana CM Bhajan Lal. In the recently held Rajya Sabha election in Haryana, Congress candidate Ajay Maken lost even as his party had the required numbers due to cross voting by Bishnoi and another MLA's vote being invalid. Earlier today, Bishnoi, in a cryptic tweet said, "don't be afraid of making a second attempt, this time the beginning will not be from zero but from experience".

Ban on Manimahesh Yatra till July 13

HAMIRPUR/CHAMBA, JULY 10

The Chamba district administration has banned pilgrims from undertaking Manimahesh Yatra till July 13th.

This decision has been taken in view of the inclement weather conditions in Himachal Pradesh. A number of local pilgrims who were on their way to Manimahesh via Chamba were informed by the Chamba administration that they would not be allowed to move ahead from Chamba due to heavy rains as the bridge between Manimahesh near Dhanchau has been damaged. Roads have also been damaged in some places.

The administration has given instructions to the concerned departments to repair them.



The Meteorological Center has forecast bad weather in the state for four days. Therefore, the pilgrims who wish to undertake the pilgrimage should leave the safe place only after four days. Officially, Manimahesh Yatra is to start on August 2, but

devotees from other states including Punjab had started going on the Yatra in July itself. These days a large number of devotees are leaving for Manimahesh Yatra. Keeping in mind their safety, the administration has imposed a ban on travel.

Amarnath Yatra remains suspended

SRINAGAR: Amarnath yatra remained suspended for the second consecutive day on Sunday, as rescue operation was going on near the Cave Shrine to locate the missing persons. About 3000 pilgrims were waiting at Baltal camp, awaiting official orders to move towards the cave shrine for Darshan as the yatra temporarily remained suspended for the second consecutive day today from both sides. More than 1.13 lakh pilgrims had darshan at the holy cave shrine of Amarnath till Friday, officials said. A huge cloud burst near the Cave Shrine of Amarnath on Friday evening.

People angry with LPG price hike: Balla

Member of Haryana Pradesh Congress Committee and former member of Haryana Police Recruitment Board, Rajendra Balla said that by increasing the prices of LPG, the common man has broken his back and in this way the life of the common man is becoming more difficult due to the high inflation. Budget of kitchen is getting upset. The central government's Ujjwala scheme, whose government does not tire of beating the drums, the poor do not have the money to fill one cylinder after another. The rate of new connection of Ujjwala, which was earlier Rs 2900, has now been increased to Rs 4400, which is a blow to the general public. Rajendra Balla said that till the year 2014, during the



Congress government, the rate of gas cylinders was around Rs 400, which has increased to about Rs 1100 per cylinder in these 8 years. That is, there has been an increase of about Rs 700 in these eight years, which is not fair in any case. If the rate of one cylinder from independence to 2014 is about 400 and the Modi government has increased so much

inflation in 8 years from 2014 to 2022, it shows the insensitivity towards the middle class. Inflation is at its highest level. The increase in the prices of food items like mustard oil, ghee, sugar, rice, pulses, flour, and kitchen items day by day is due to wrong policies of the central government. Demonetisation and GST by the central government are the major reasons for inflation, which has made the life of the middle class difficult. The government is not paying any attention to this, nor is any concrete policy being adopted to deal with inflation. There is a lot of anger in the public against the government due to inflation, but the government is dividing the attention by raising the issue of false nationalism Hindu-Muslim to divide the attention of the public.

Symbolic address

Driving down Prithviraj Road, one of New Delhi's famously leafy avenues, I passed a lane that opened on to it. The street sign said "Aurangzeb Lane". Aurangzeb Road might have morphed into A.P.J. Abdul Kalam Road, but the emperor lives on, if only in a little feeder lane. Of the roads that commemorate Mughal emperors, all but one were named by the colonial State. The raj was keen to present itself as a successor to the Mughal State. Lutyens and Baker chose red and buff sandstone for the facades of their capitol buildings to allude to the signature red sandstone of the city's great Mughal period monuments: Humayun's Tomb, the Red Fort, Jama Masjid, Safdarjung's Tomb, to name the most obvious candidates.

The emperors aren't even-handedly remembered though. Babur, the founder, has a tiny road to himself, best known for two mithai shops. Humayun Road is a connecting road mainly used to get to Junior Modern School and Khan Market. Akbar Road is a properly grand avenue. Shah Jahan Road hosts the Union Public Service Commission, but it's real claim to our attention is the street vendor next to the UPSC who sells the best papdi chaat in India. After Shah Jahan Road passes a Parsi cemetery, it seamlessly transforms itself into Prithviraj Road, which might have been appropriate in the early years of the republic but verges on provocation now. Jahangir, the emperor sandwiched between Akbar and Shah Jahan, is the only one of the Great Moghuls who doesn't have a road named after him. A map of Delhi, circa 1959, shows a Nur Jahan Road, just off Minto Road, which might have been a kind of consolation prize. I asked an urban historian about Jahangir's omission. She hazarded the guess that this might have been down to the fact that Jahangir had never ruled from Delhi, being chiefly based in Lahore. This seems plausible but not, as Americans like to say, dispositive. Babur occupied Delhi after the first Battle of Panipat in 1526 but spent precious little time there, using up most of the next four years conquering his new empire before dying in 1530. The real dilliwallah in this lot was clearly Shah Jahan who took the trouble of building a proper city.

The one Mughal emperor commemorated by the republic was Bahadur Shah Zafar. Newspaper row in Delhi, home to The Indian Express and The Times of India amongst others, was named Bahadur Shah Zafar Marg in 1962. Zafar died in Rangoon in 1862 and the centenary of his death was the occasion for the road's renaming. His sons had been killed near Delhi Gate after the Mutiny, or to use Savarkar's famous phrase, the "first war of Indian independence", had been violently suppressed. Zafar had become the figurehead of that ferocious rebellion against the East India Company.

Abe's killing: The history of political violence in Japan

Our reaction upon hearing the news of the shooting of former prime minister Shinzo Abe was one of shock and incredulity in equal measure.

What followed was a frenzy of trying to piece news reports and gossip together to make sense of events, until his eventual death was announced a few hours later.

At first glance, Abe's assassination harks back to the 1920s and 1930s when the assassination of sitting and former prime ministers (Hara Kei, Hamaguchi Osachi, Inukai Tsuyoshi, Takahashi Korekiyo, Saito Makoto) was a feature of Japanese politics.

We do not readily associate political assassination and violence with democratic and pacifist post-war Japan.

In this light, it is not surprising that many reports focused on political violence in Japan as almost unheard of.

However, like any country, sudden and extreme acts of political violence are not without precedent in Japan.

During Abe's second period in power (2012-20), one of his most controversial initiatives was the reinterpretation of Japan's exercise of its right to collective self-defence. This was seen as part of a steady shift towards a more militarised Japan, and



resulted in two very public cases of people setting fire to themselves in June and November 2014 in protest. In the latter case, the person died. In Abe's first period in office (2006-7), mayor of Nagasaki Ito Ichio was shot and killed by a member of the Yamaguchi-gumi, Japan's largest organised crime syndicate, over a seemingly trivial matter of compensation for damage to his car.

In 1990, Ito's predecessor, Motoshima Hitoshi, was also the target of an unsuccessful assassination attempt by a right-wing extremist

over public comments he made regarding Emperor Hirohito's war responsibility.

In 2006, senior Liberal Democratic Party politician Kato Koichi's home was subject to an arson attack by a right-winger angered by comments Kato had made critical of prime minister Koizumi Junichiro's visit to Yasukuni shrine. The shrine has long been a controversial symbol of Japan's wartime legacy.

The failed coup-d'etat by world-famous writer Mishima Yukio in 1970 shocked Japan and had deep roots in

his own ultra-nationalist political views. Mishima had founded the Shield Society, a paramilitary organisation, two years prior to the coup, recruiting members with far-right leanings, who wanted to restore the Emperor's political powers. Famously, Mishima committed ritual suicide when the coup attempt failed.

1960 was a tumultuous year in Japanese post-war history as a result of the revision of the US-Japan security treaty. Abe's grandfather, Kishi Nobusuke, was the victim of a failed assassination attempt in July of that year.

Later the same year, Japan Socialist Party leader Asanuma Inejiro was stabbed to death by a radical ultra-nationalist student. Asanuma was an outspoken critic of Japan's ties to the US and also sought closer relations with Communist states in Asia. A photograph of the attack won the Pulitzer prize.

These examples are all actions of individuals. Japan is also not a stranger to organised political violence by groups of people.

The most devastating incident of post-war political violence, was undoubtedly the Tokyo sarin gas attacks in March 1995. At the hands of a religious cult, Aum Shinrikyo, key subway stations serving political centres in Tokyo were targeted with the aim to initiate the end of the world.

The nerve agent claimed 14 lives, and injured more than 1000 people. The cult leader, Asahara Shoko alongside key members of the cult, were executed in 2018. During the 1970s and 1980s Japan saw domestic terror at the hands of a series of left-wing revolutionary groups. Most famous of these was the Japanese Red Army (JRA), who hijacked planes, attacked embassies and businesses, as well as civilians.

The wanted posters for individuals involved with the JRA still appear at Japanese train stations, and recently Tokyo police have made videos reminding the populace that members are still on the loose.

As the numbers show, gun crime is rare in Japan so political violence is shocking and extreme.

However, as is the case in other countries (one need only think of the murders of MPs Jo Cox and David Amess in the UK), it is sadly far from unheard of.

Sadly, Shinzo Abe is only the most recent in a long line of politically motivated attacks. Unfortunately, the highly visible nature of criminal prosecution in Japan gives perpetrators a large platform to announce their views.

This doesn't just happen in Japan. The judicial process has been used for political grandstanding in recent cases across Europe and the US, with the Breivik case in Norway as a particularly harrowing example. The same may happen in Japan in due course. Many words will be written about this event over the hours, days and years to come but at this point in time our sympathies are with Abe's family.

Prominent former Tibetan political prisoner Jigme Gyatso dies

Jigme Gyatso, a prominent former political prisoner, died on July 2, according to the Washington-based advocacy group International Campaign for Tibet (ICT). Jigme Gyatso, 56, faced multiple detentions in the past for his protests against the Chinese government's oppression in Tibet. He had openly expressed his thoughts on oppression in Tibet and his personal experience of Chinese security forces torturing him and other Tibetan detainees.

Gyatso had been unrecoverably ill since his release in October 2016 after serving five years in prison on a conviction for "inciting separatism." Facing further health complications, he was hospitalized in Xiling in May this year and passed away on July 2.

"Owing to torture and other cruel and inhumane treatment during his detentions, his health conditions had become unrecoverably complicated after his release from prison in October 2016. He was suffering from diabetes, hypertension, and heart, liver and eyes diseases. Low-quality health care provided to him by prison medical personnel during his incarceration, after his appeal for medical parole was rejected, and his inability to access professional private care after release based on his identity being blacklisted made Jigme's health deteriorate steadily over the years," the Washington based group said. According to the ICT, Jigme Gyatso's death is part of a pattern of torture and mistreatment in Tibet. In May 2020, the Tibetan monk Choekyi



died after torture in custody. In August 2020, a 36-year-old mother of three named Lhamo died in custody after apparent beatings.

In 2015, the International Campaign for Tibet documented the cases of 29 Tibetans who suffered torture and mistreatment while in custody, many of who died as a result of their ordeals. Jigme is known for his defiant video testimony in 2008 that was shot in Tibet, providing an authoritative account exposing the Chinese government's oppression in Tibet.

In the video, he identifies himself and gives a detailed account of the cruel methods Chinese security forces use to oppress the Tibetans who exercise their freedom of expression, torture methods used on him and other Tibetans and conditions in detention centers.

China lures university students for spying ops against western targets

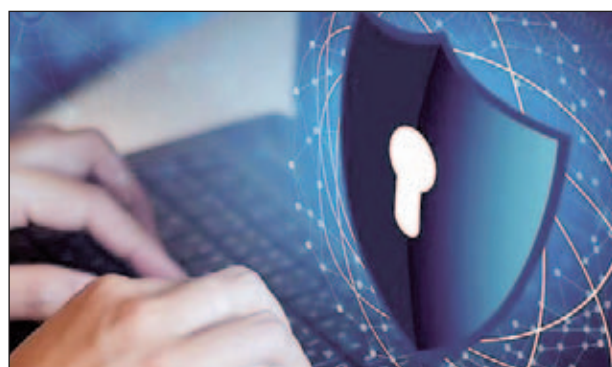
Hainan Xiandun, a Chinese technology company, is actively recruiting Chinese university students as English language translators even after US law enforcement agencies accused Beijing of setting up such companies as a "front" for spying operations against western targets.

Hackers with suspected links to China's intelligence agencies are still advertising for new recruits to work on cyber espionage, even after the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI) indicted the perpetrators in an effort to disrupt their activities.

In another covert move by China, Beijing is luring job seekers into committing state-sponsored espionage on western targets along with persuading them to translate confidential stolen papers collected from various government agencies.

To hire these Chinese university students, the country is hiding the information of the real duties that they will have to perform after they are hired, reported Hong Kong Post.

The students are led into working for a top-secret technology business where they are identifying potential Western targets for espionage and interpreting stolen papers as part of Beijing's massive intelligence apparatus.



About 140 possible translators, mostly recent graduates who studied English at public colleges in Hainan, Sichuan, and Xian, have been targeted for this job.

In China province of Hainan, people applied for job postings for a business called Hainan Xiandun.

In a shocking revelation, translation tests on confidential papers collected from US government agencies were part of the application process. There were also directives to research people at

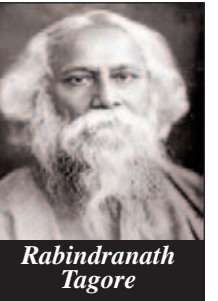
Johns Hopkins University, a major target for espionage gathering. According to a 2021 US federal indictment, a Chinese firm Hainan Xiandun served as a front for the Chinese hacking organization APT40.

Western intelligence services earlier reported that APT40 has been sent by China's Ministry of State Security to infiltrate colleges, businesses, and government organisations throughout the US, Canada, Europe, and the Middle East. In a bid to stop the malice, last July, the US investigation bureau, Federal Bureau of Investigation indicted three state security officers in the province of Hainan to halt Hainan Xiandun's oper-

Study shows how society thinks about risk

Many of our daily activities involve some level of risk, be it to our work, our finances or our health. But how is risk perceived in society and how do individuals think about risk? Dr Dirk Wulff and Professor Rui Mata, researchers at the Faculty of Psychology at the University of Basel say, "There is great scientific interest in the phenomenon of risk." "But disciplines like psychology, sociology, and economics define it in different ways," explains Dirk Wulff.

According to Wulff, little attention has been paid until now to the fact that the meaning of risk can differ from individual to individual depending on goals and life experience. He feels it is important to understand how different people think about risk in order, for example, to



gauge attitudes to new technologies or societal challenges.

To investigate this, the researchers have developed a new method based on

word associations and an algorithmic process that maps the representation of risk for different groups and individuals. The researchers adopted a new approach,

employing a snowball word association method. Participants were asked to name five things they associated with the term risk and then, in turn, five things they associated with these associations. Using this method, researchers surveyed a nationally representative sample of 1205 people, with equal representation of men and women and different age ranges.

An algorithm was used to generate a semantic network of risk from the 36,100 associations. It identified the following components: threat, fortune, investment, activity and analysis. The semantic cluster "threat" (danger, accident, loss, etc.) was the component most prominently associated with risk, closely followed by "fortune" (profit, game, adventure). "Up until now, studies have mostly focused on the negative components of risk and ig-

nored the fact that it can also have positive associations," Wulff comments.

The method is designed to map both individual and group-specific differences in risk perception. The psychologists investigated the differences between men and women and between different age groups. Overall, women and men and people of different ages appeared to share similar thoughts about risk. Nevertheless, there were some differences: a higher proportion of older people than younger people and a higher proportion of women than men associated risk more closely with threat and less with fortune. The researchers also posed the question: Do people from different language regions think about risk in a similar way? To investigate this, they compared the semantic network of risk that emerged from the

German survey group with those that resulted in two other languages - Dutch and English. There were some small differences in the frequency of associations. For example, in Dutch the term risk tended to be more closely associated with threat and in English more with fortune and finance.

Overall, however, the results indicate that there are some universal correlations in risk representation that transcend language boundaries. "Our study lays new foundations for examining the question of how people think about risk," says Wulff. "It could play an important role in helping to provide a better understanding of how different social groups interpret risk, enabling risk communication strategies to be improved to combat social polarization."

Bring uniform excise policy for BJP-ruled states: Bharti to Nadda

AGENCY BHOPAL, JUL 10

Senior BJP leader Uma Bharti has written a letter to party president J P Nadda, demanding a uniform excise policy for all BJP-ruled states, and also announced a silent protest outside liquor shops in Madhya Pradesh till October this year as well as a march in Bhopal on October 2, on the occasion of Mahatma Gandhi's birth anniversary.

In the letter dated July 9, the former Madhya Pradesh chief minister also criticised the existing excise policy in the BJP-governed MP, claiming it can lead the state towards destruction in every way.

Bharti, who shared the letter on Twitter on Saturday evening, has been seeking prohibition in MP since sometime. She had earlier hurled a stone at a liquor shop in the state capital Bhopal and thrown cow dung at a liquor outlet in Niwari district.



The BJP leader, in a statement, said she has held meetings with decision-makers within the party, and is confident that such interactions will soon yield results. From now on till October, I will stand alone in front of liquor shops and ahataas (liquor drinking facilities adjoining shops). I will march with women on the

streets of Bhopal on Gandhi Jayanti (October 2), she said. The former Union minister said liquor prohibition is a social issue, and not a political one. It is not personal issue for me either. Therefore, whoever supports it can do this in personal capacity, she said. Bharti also said prohibition

was not an ego issue for her, but a social issue associated with women and their families, and it was also about the future of youth.

In the letter to Nadda, Bharti demanded that a uniform excise policy for all the BJP-ruled states be prepared in consultation with senior leaders.

The policy should address issues like serving liquor in open ahataas, wine shops near educational institutions and religious places, besides those near labourer settlements and places where women gather, she said in the letter. The Madhya Pradesh government allows liquor consumption in open ahataas. Drunken driving is illegal, but people drive their vehicles after consuming liquor in ahataas, she stated.

On June 14, Bharti had thrown cow dung at a liquor shop in Orchha town in Niwari district. In March, she had hurled a stone at a liquor vend in Bhopal's Azad Nagar.

People demands to break dilapidated water tank built in 1975 at village Bhabat

The villagers have demanded demolition of the tank built in 1975 at village Daulat Singh Wala Bhabat in Zirakpur and Mohali districts. The villagers have already submitted a memorandum to the city council administration in this regard but no action is being taken on it. Villagers Keshav Achint, Manoj Sharma, Billu Sharma, Dinesh Verma, Gagan Agarwal, Chiku Ghai, Vikasdeep Singh, Sachin Jindal, Happy Prabhat besides Councilor Bittu Longia and Councilor Lucky and hundreds of other villagers told reporters. The condition of the water tank at Bhabat is very bad and its foundations are very weak. The water tank, about 150 feet high and 25 feet wide, used to quench the thirst of Prabhat village and nearby villages. But now for the last several years the tank has stopped filling up due to its dilapidated condition and water is being supplied from door to door through tubewells. The foundations of this water tank have become so weak that rods



are now visible in many places. People fear that if the tank collapses, there could be huge loss of life and property due to which they have repeatedly approached the administration to demolish the water tank. In the year 2019 letter No. 1709 dated 22.02.2019 was requested by the Municipal Council Zirakpur to Sub Divisional Engineer Water Supply and Sanitation Sub Division Dera Bassi quoting old letters and PWD B&R technical report was sought but today almost three years later No action taken. People have demanded that if the tank is not dismantled as soon as possible, they will struggle which will be the responsibility of the department.

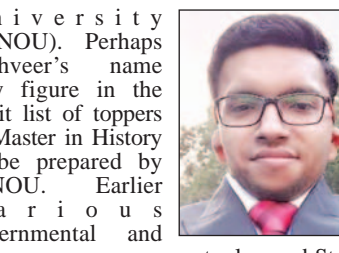

Lahore: Pakistan are looking to use the tri-series against Australia and Ireland as the perfect warm-up for the upcoming Commonwealth Games in Birmingham. Bismah Maroof's side will fly to Europe this week ahead of four T20 matches in Belfast against tricky opponents in the lead-up to the eight-team Commonwealth Games tournament that commences at the end of this month. Recent rain in Rawalpindi and Islamabad has made life tough for Pakistan's ever-improving side, with many recent practice sessions at home moved indoors to escape the additional challenges set aside from the unpredictable weather. But Bismah said preparations have still been good for the upcoming busy period of cricket. "Our preparations have suffered a bit due to the persistent rains as we could not play practice matches, we had to hence shift our focus to fitness more. We tried to make most of the indoor facility we were provided and that did come as a good help to the side amid the weather challenges," Bismah said in a statement. "We have a good team combination with youngsters like Tuba Hassan, Ayesha Naseem and Fatima Sana providing real energy, skill and talent, they are the ones for the future and this tour is a real opportunity for them to make a big impression," she added. Pakistan's first match of the tri-series is against Australia in Belfast on July 16, before three more games at the same venue within a five-day period. Bismah said she was hoping to acclimatise quickly to the European conditions during the tri-series and then aiming to pinch at least one victory during the Commonwealth Games.

Men's T20 WC Qualifier B gets underway in Zimbabwe

Harare: The captains of the eight teams in ICC Men's T20 World Cup Qualifier B are determined to prove they belong to the big stage when the hotly anticipated tournament kicks off in Zimbabwe this week. Eight nations will duel for a spot in this year's ICC Men's T20 World Cup in Australia as the hosts bid to book their place in the event for the first time in six years. Jersey, Singapore and the United States will hope to topple Craig Ervine's side in Group A while Hong Kong, Papua New Guinea, Uganda and the Netherlands make up the other half of the week-long tournament. Zimbabwe did not participate in last year's ICC Men's T20 World Cup in the United Arab Emirates and captain Ervine hopes bouncing back on home soil can reinvigorate the cricketing nation. "It has been many years since we've been involved in the World Cup, which is disappointing. There's a lot at stake for us as a country and if we're able to qualify again, all of a sudden the pieces of the puzzle start coming together again," said Ervine in a statement. "It's always very exciting to be playing at home in front of your home crowd and when you start to get results, you start to pull people together. That's definitely something we need to find again - we want to start pulling Zimbabweans together, win some games and make it exciting for them to watch us," he added.

Team USA seeks T20 World Cup berth in Australia



HARARE: USA vice-captain Aaron Jones is hoping to fulfil a childhood dream and lead his country to a first ICC T20 World Cup in

Australia later this year. To qualify for the 20-over showcase Down Under, Jones and the USA must first negotiate a tricky qualifying tournament in Zimbabwe and finish in the top two at the Qualifier B event that commences on Monday.

It won't be an easy task, with the USA taking on Jersey, Singapore and hosts Zimbabwe in the group stage of the eight-team tournament before a possible cut-throat semi-final clash against a different opponent from the opposing group.

But Jones is confident in his team's ability, with the USA having displayed their capabilities with impressive performances during two warm-up match victories against Jersey at the start of this month. It's enough to have Jones thinking about the possibility of reaching the pinnacle of T20 cricket at the World Cup in Australia later this year and what may actually lie ahead for the USA given they will feature in the 2024 event as tournament hosts. "If we could get to World Cup so you get to the highest level of cricket, to compete with the West Indies, Australia, India, all the teams that are playing full member cricket for sure, it would open a lot of doors."



Wimbledon: Australian pair wins men's doubles title

LONDON: Australian pair Matthew Ebden and Max Purcell defeated defending champions Nikola Mekic and Mate Pavic in a five-set thriller to claim their maiden Grand Slam title in Saturday's Wimbledon final.

The Aussies, who saved eight match points across two matches in reaching the championship match, recovered an early break in the fifth set against Nikola Mekic and Mate Pavic in a thrilling 7-6(5), 6-7(3), 4-6, 6-4, 7-6(10-2) triumph.

"People say as a kid they dreamed of winning Wimbledon. I don't even know if I did that," the 34-year-old Ebden said in the champions' post-match press conference.

"I wanted to be a professional tennis player, I wanted to get to the Top 10. I started believing these last years we could win Slams and I could do it. But you never know if it will actually happen," Ebden said

"To fall on our back and know

we've won Wimbledon. I said to [Max], he's only 24 and he's won Wimbledon, I was like, 'If life's done, I'm done. I'm good,' he added.

"We've tried to win every match in straight sets," Ebden said. "Every team since the first round, we've had a bloody tough draw, played unbelievable teams every match. Multiple Grand Slam winners, other title winners. The level of doubles is super strong. We're sitting here [having] won the title, but first-round we could have been out with one point. The level is insane," he said.

In Saturday's title-deciding tie-break, a Purcell return winner cut the line to open up a dual mini-break lead at 5-2, and another made it 9-2 as the Aussies flew through the finish line. An Ebden ace -- the team's fifth of the match -- sealed the deal after four hours, 11 minutes, leading the Australians to celebrate with a synchronized fall to the Centre Court turf.

Will win a Grand Slam for sure, says Ons Jabeur

After facing a defeat in the Wimbledon final against Elena Rybakina on Saturday, Ons Jabeur said she wants to win a Grand Slam title.

The No. 17 seed Rybakina created history by becoming the first-ever Asian Wimbledon champion, defeating Jabeur of Tunisia in the final in of women's singles category.

With this, she also became the first-ever Kazakh Grand Slam singles champion, defeating her Tunisian opponent by 3-6, 6-2, 6-2 in a final that lasted for 1 hour, 48 minutes.

Jabeur has had a career-best

season, winning three titles, rising to second in the WTA rankings and reaching a maiden Major final.

"I'm not ready probably to be a Grand Slam champion. I know that I'm going to come back and win a Grand Slam for sure," Jabeur said in a post-match presentation.

Jabeur has praised Elena Rybakina for not making any 'big celebration' after losing the Wimbledon final to the Kazakh on Saturday.

"Elena is one of the best players of the younger generation. She deserved the Grand Slam. Her game speaks of her for her. She is doing a great job, I hope she continues like this," she added.

"It's nice to play with Elena, honestly. Even if you lose to her, she didn't make any big celebration. I have to show her (laughs). She is the kind of player that she is," said Jabeur.

But first, some much-deserved downtime for Jabeur back home in Tunisia. Jabeur's run to the Wimbledon final inspired a nation, a region, and a continent, and she's been promised quite the welcome when she returns.

"I'm not sure what to expect. I cannot wait to meet Tunisians. They're really amazing. They always support me. Right now I need their support to really continue and do better," Jabeur said.
