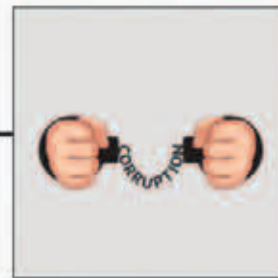

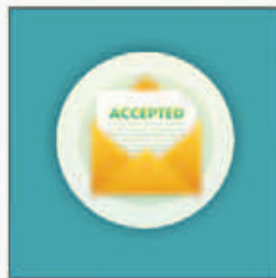

Two sisters raped and hanged in UP, 6 arrested

LAKHIMPUR KHERI, SEP 15

In a grim reminder of 2011 Nighasan case, two sisters belonging to Dalit community, were raped, murdered and their bodies were hanged from a tree in Lakhimpur Kheri district here in Uttar Pradesh, a senior officer said here on Thursday.

Superintendent of Police Sanjiv Suman said that six persons have been arrested in this connection.

He said that the bodies of the minors were found hanging from a tree in the Nighasan area on Wednesday evening.

"The police have arrested six persons in this connection. On being quizzed the accused said that the victims were friends with them," he said.

The SP said that one of the ac-



cused Chottu introduced the victims with Junaid, Suhail and Hafizurrehman. "On Wednesday afternoon the trio went to meet the victims from where Junaid, Suhail and Hafiz took the girls on the pretext of bike ride," he said. He said that the accused took the victims to fields where they made physical relationships with the girls against their wishes. "After this the

Victims father seeks death penalty for culprits

LAKHIMPUR KHERI: A day after the two Dalit minor sisters were found hanging from a tree in Lakhimpur Kheri district of Uttar Pradesh, the father of the victims on Thursday demanded justice stating that the "culprits should be hanged."

My daughters were abducted from the house and then they were raped and murdered. I demand justice, and the culprits should be hanged," said the father of the victims.

He has also questioned the police action and demanded compensation.

girls insisted on the accused to marry them. The accused have revealed that perturbed by the persistence of the girls, they strangled them with the scarf and killed them," he said. The SP said that later the accused called their acquaintances Kareemuddin and Arif alias Chhote on the spot and with their help hanged the bodies of the victims from the tree and escaped.

"While four were arrested late on Wednesday, two others, including the main accused Junaid, were arrested on Thursday morning after a brief encounter. "Junaid has sustained bullet injury in this leg," he said. He said those arrested have been identified as Junaid, Suhail, Hafizurrehman, Arif alias Chhote, Kareemuddin alias DD and Chottu.

Putin survives assassination attempt

Russian President Vladimir Putin has survived an assassination attempt, according to a report in Euro Weekly News. It said that the information was released on the General GVR Telegram channel on Wednesday. The outlet, however, added that it is not known when the attempt took place. Rumours around Mr Putin's health and threat to life have been swirling around since Russia invaded Ukraine in February this year. As far as the Russian President is concerned, he publicly disclosed in 2017 that he has survived at least five assassination attempts. According to the account on the Telegram channel, the left front wheel of Mr Putin's limousine was hit by a loud bang, Euro Weekly reported, adding that the car was quickly driven to safety even as smoke

emerged out of it.

The Russian President was unharmed in the incident, but the outlet said that a number of arrests have been made. Other news outlets like news.co.au also reported about the incident saying that Mr Putin was travelling back to his official residence in a decoy motorcade amid security concerns. "On the way to the residence, a few kilometres away, the first escort car was blocked by an ambulance, the second escort car drove around without stopping (due to the) sudden obstacle, and during the detour of the obstacle," according to an update on posted on channel as reported by the outlet. This comes a week after a



group of politicians from St Petersburg appealed to the State Duma to bring charges of state treason against Mr Putin and strip him of power, citing a series of reasons including Russia's military losses in Ukraine and the damage to its economy from Western sanctions.

Pb VB books officer, three Panchayat secretaries for embezzlement

The Punjab Vigilance Bureau during its ongoing campaign against corruption in the state, has registered a corruption case against a Social Education and Panchayat Officer (SEPO) and three Panchayat Secretaries on charges of embezzlement in the funds of Gram Panchayat Manawa, Tarnataran district amounting to Rs 8,85,000. In this case the Bureau has arrested two Panchayat Secretaries.

Disclosing this here today, a spokesperson of the State Vigilance Bureau (VB) said in this regard the Bureau has registered a case against Lal Singh, SEPO, holding charge of Block Development Panchayat Officer (BDPO) Valtaha, Panchayat Secretary Rajbir Singh of Gram Panchayat Manawa,

Village Development Officers (VDO) Paramjit Singh and Sarj Singh under FIR No. 16, dated 14.09.2022, under sections 406, 409, 420, 468, 471 and 120-B of I.P.C. and 13(1) (A), 13 (2) of Prevention of Corruption Act at Police Station VB, Amritsar. In this case, Panchayat Secretary Rajbir Singh and VDO Paramjit Singh have been arrested.

Giving more details, he informed that the above mentioned officials at the helm of affairs of Gram Panchayat Manawa, block Valtaha have auctioned village land measuring 24 Acres 07 Kanal 09 Marla on annual contract for farming for Rs 7,35,000 in the year 2019-20, but the amount of said contract had not been deposited in the bank account of Gram Panchayat Manawa till date despite paid by the contractor.

Water level in Punjab, Himachal reservoirs is much better

JALANDHAR, SEP 15

Due to heavy rainfall in the catchment areas of Himachal Pradesh, the water level in the three reservoirs of Punjab and Himachal Pradesh is much better as compared to last year. On Thursday, the water level in Bhakra dam's reservoir was 1,668 feet, 30 feet higher than last year's level of 1638 feet at the same time. The reservoir level in Ranjit Sagar Dam is 1711 feet which is 48 feet higher than the level of 1663 feet during the corresponding period last year. Similarly, the Pong dam had a water level of 1384 feet which is 34 feet higher than last year's level of 1350 feet. As per Central Water Commission (CWC) weekly report, the total live storage available in reservoirs of Punjab and Haryana is 12.42 billion cubic meters (BCM) which is 84 per cent of the total live storage capacity of these reservoirs. The storage during the corresponding period of last year was 53 per cent and the average storage for the last ten years during the corresponding period was 78 per cent of the live storage capacity of these reservoirs.

5 killed, 17 injured in twin Rajouri accidents

At least five people have died and 17 injured in two separate road accidents in Rajouri district of Jammu and Kashmir.

Police said that a bus ferrying passengers on way from Poonch to Jammu, met with an accident near Bhimber Gali in Manjakote area as it plunged into a deep gorge.

"Five people have died and 12 suffered injuries in the mishap," police said.

They said that a rescue operation has been launched and the injured have been shifted to hospital.

Earlier, seven people sus-

tained injuries when a cab they were traveling in skidded off and fell into the gorge in Rajouri district.

The cab was on its way from Bai Nambal village of Kotranka towards Rajouri when it met with the accident as the driver lost control near Mandir Gala, police said.

The injured were rushed to hospital and all were stated to be stable.

The injured persons have been identified as Basharat Ahmed, his wife Guddi Begum, Mehreen Kouser, Sayeeda Tabassum, Dilshad Ahmed, Gulnaz Akhter and Suleman Ahmed. Police have registered a case and started the investigation.

Govt all set to fulfill long pending demand of border villages

SHASHI PAL JAIN CHANDIGARH, SEPT 15

The Punjab Government led by Bhagwant Mann is set to construct two pontoon bridges on the Ravi River at Darya Musa village and Kot Rajada village of Block Ajnala in District Amritsar by the end of September 2023. Once these bridges become operational, farmers are not required to use boats for ferrying their cattle and other light agri-machinery towards their agricultural lands across the river.

These bridges are to be installed at a cost of Rs. 4.62 crore, which will ensure easy access to the residents especially farmers of a dozen villages located near international border in Ajnala segment. This development will also provide a big relief to the people as they were demanding the same since a long time.

Stating this, Punjab Public Works Minister Mr. Harbhajan Singh ETO said that the area of Ajnala block is at a close proximity to the international border and people were facing several hardships to



cross over the Ravi river for their daily works and agricultural purposes. In view of security measures stipulated for the border area, the Minister said, permanent bridges cannot be constructed, that's why the State Government has decided to provide these pontoon bridges. The bridges to come up at village Darya Musa and Kot Rajada will ensure direct benefit to the farmers and residents of several villages, he added. After the construction of the bridges, said the Minister, farmers will be able to easily come and go across the river

with their tractor trolleys for the purpose of sowing and harvesting their crops. ETO said that the Punjab government has given administrative sanction of Rs 236.02 lakh and Rs 226.34 lakh respectively for the construction of both pontoon bridges and tenders had already been floated in this regard. Notably, the pontoon bridge is a floating bridge specially constructed for pedestrians and light vehicles. The proposed bridges can be used for vehicles weighing less than 10 metric tons and the facility will remain available for a period of nine months in a year. During the monsoon season, these bridges will be removed and kept at a safe place and will be re-established at the same place after the end of the monsoon season, said the Minister. ETO further said that with the availability of the pontoon bridge, the people crossing the Ravi River would also get the benefit of timely medical assistance, when needed. He said that these bridges will also be beneficial for bringing and transporting animals because at present farmers use boats to bring and take animals.

CS directs to speed up recruitment process for over 26,000 govt jobs in Punjab

Aiming to generate maximum employment for youth of Punjab, the Chief Secretary Vijay Kumar Janjua has emphasized on speeding up the recruitment process of over 26,000 government jobs in a meeting with the top officials of various departments.

He said that the government led by Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann is creating many employment opportunities for the youth of Punjab from day one after forming the government. In order to prevent the youth from going abroad in absence of em-

ployment, the Chief Secretary squarely instructed to all departments to complete the recruitment in a time-bound manner to achieve the goal of providing employment to maximum number of youth in Punjab as desired by the CM Mann. He said that special attention should be given to the completion of the recruitment process in all the departments in time so that maximum number of boys and girls can be given employment opportunities. He unequivocally directed concerned officials to ensure that the entire recruitment process should be carried out in a transparent manner. During the meeting, the Chief Secretary was informed that the recruitment process is going on for 26,454 posts in different 24 departments.

Among the departments where the recruitment is underway includes Home Department (Police), School Education (Teacher Recruitment), Health, Power, Technical Education, Finance Department, Rural Development, Cooperative Department and Water Supply Department. The Chief Secretary said that with the new recruitment, where young men and women will get employment, the performance of the government will be nourished at the administrative level as well.

Jail Authorities were asked to provide the proper medical facilities to jail inmates. The Kitchen & the meal of the Jail inmates were also checked and the grievance of the jail inmates relating to the meal provided in jail were heard and redressed.

Punjab & Delhi governments join hands for stubble management

NEW DELHI CHANDIGARH, SEPT 15

The Punjab and Delhi governments have joined hands to combat stubble burning by managing the straw in the fields by spraying Pusa bio decomposer on 5000 acres in Punjab as a pilot project.

In a press statement, Punjab Agriculture and Farmers' Welfare Minister Kuldeep Singh Dhaliwal said that high-level meetings were held in New Delhi on the issue. Earlier in the day, Dhaliwal had met Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal regarding the management of the pollution caused by stubble burning in New Delhi who assured full support to him. Later, he held deliberations with Delhi's Agriculture Minister Gopal Roy. He said that



this project would be done jointly by the governments of both states. The Agriculture Minister said that under the process, Pusa bio decomposer will be sprayed on the stubble following which the stubble gets mixed in the soil hence the farmers will not need to burn the stubble. He said that the Punjab govern-

ment has made adequate preparations to prevent the pollution caused by paddy stubble under which types of equipment are being provided to the farmers on subsidy, awareness drives and surveillance teams have been formed in all districts.

Targeting Union Government for turning down cash incentive proposal to farmers for not burning stubble, he called the step anti-farmer, anti-Punjab and said that the state government had proposed to give Rs 2,500 per acre to paddy growers suggesting that the Centre will pay Rs 1,500 per acre while Rs 1,000 per acre will be borne by Punjab and Delhi governments.

ASF confirmed in swine sample from Dhanaula in district Barnala

CHANDIGARH: Punjab Animal Husbandry, Fisheries and Dairy Development Minister Laljit Singh Bhullar, on Thursday, informed that African Swine Fever (ASF) has been confirmed in swine sample sent from village Dhanaula of Barnala district, after which the area was declared as an Infected zone. He said that three suspected samples from district Sangrur have been found negative. The Cabinet Minister said that after confirmation from the Indian Council of Agricultural Research (ICAR) -National High Security Animal Disease Institute, Bhopal, the area from 0 to 1 KM of radius from the epicenter in village Dhanaula has been declared as "infected zone" while 1 to 10 KM (9 KM) area declared as "surveillance zone". Thus, No live or dead pig, its meat or any related material shall be taken out of or brought into the infected zone. The officials of the department have also been instructed to keep a strict vigil in the surveillance zone, he added. Giving details of six previously affected districts of the state, Animal Husbandry Minister Laljit Singh Bhullar said that after completing swine culling in declared infected zones to prevent further spread of the disease in the districts of Patiala, Fatehgarh Sahib, SBS Nagar, Fazilka, Faridkot and Mansa, all the samples sent again from these areas have been found negative. Urging pig farmers to restrict movement of swine from one place to another, the Cabinet Minister said that they should also be strictly prohibited pig traders or businessmen from visiting their farms and prepare swine feed on their own at their pig farms as this disease can only be prevented by adopting precautions.

KPT police catches Big fish of drug racket - Sarpanch of Lattianwal village arrested



SULTANPUR LODHI (MK SHARMA): In a big push to the campaign against the drugs in the district Kapurthala, Sultanpur Lodhi police today arrested the Balbir Singh who is the Sarpanch of village Lattianwal under NDPS act as the arrested drug dealers revealed the role of sarpanch in drug deals.

SSP Navneet Singh Bains said that during the investigation of drug cases related NDPS act, the arrested smugglers have revealed that Balvir Singh, Sarpanch of village lattiaawal was also involved in the drug racket. They also revealed that Balvir Singh has a major share in the seized drugs. Acting swiftly on the information collected during the investigation in these cases, the police has arrested Sarpanch Balvir Singh, SSP added. He also said that it was also found that Sarpanch Balvir Singh was facing many drug related NDPS and crime related cases. Hailing the efforts of police officials, SSP said that the drive against drugs would be more strengthen in coming days.

be run by Punjab Prisons Development Board.

Only 'good conduct' inmates and remand prisoners and those following the required criteria of the jail manual, will avail the facility. The family members can also enjoy meals with the inmates and undertrials. The inmates and prisoners involved in high-risk category including gangsters and other serious offences will not be able to avail this facility. Bains, later addressing the gathering, said that the Punjab government had been making the jails as real 'Sudhar Ghars' from where inmates could be transformed and they could lead a normal life after release from jail.

Only upper caste to be in ambit of Schedule Tribe Hatee Community: CM

Himachal Pradesh Chief minister Jai Ram Thakur hailed the historic decision of Union cabinet to declare the Hatee Community to be included in the ambit of Schedule Tribe adding that schedule castes living in 154 gram panchayat and 389 village wouldn't be under the ambit of the decision.

Addressing a press conference here Thursday Chief minister said 1,59,716 people would benefit from the decision, however, 91,487 people who belonged to schedule caste community would be excluded from the new provision.

Chief Minister said four Assembly constituency including Shilahi, Pachhad, Poanta Sahib and Renku of Siramaur district would benefit from the provisions. He said 58 gram panchayat including 95 villages of Shilahi having around 66775 population (excluding 30456 SC population), 34 gram panchayat and one nagar panchayat of Pachhad including 141 village having 27261 (excluding 21594 SC population), 18 gram Panchayat and 31 village of Poanta Sahib having 25323 population (excluding 94496SC population) and 44 gram panchayat having 122 villages with population of 40357 (excluding 29990 SC population) are covered in the provision.



Chief Minister said government would also consider to provide the status of Schedule Tribe to Jonsar Babar Transgiri area of Utrakkhand soon. He said notification for providing Tribal status for upper caste Tribal Community would be considered soon by completing all modalities.

He said people of Schedule caste and others Community in Sirmaur district were not being covered under the new provision and draft to not include them in the Hatee Community was being sent by the state government. He said people of SC community opposed the new provision as they are against to withdraw the special provisions of protection under SC atrocity act.

He said people belonging to SC community not include in the Hatee Community provision of Schedule Tribe as they want to remain in the existing provision of SC Act.

HP HC nixes transfer of school teacher

UNI SHIMLA, SEP 15

Holding a Demi Officio note issued by BJP member of Parliament Suresh Kashyap an encroachment in the jurisdiction and authority of the Administrative Authority by the MP, Himachal Pradesh High court has quashed a transfer of school teacher being done on political grounds.

In a five page order passed by the division bench of justice Tarlok Singh Chauhan and justice Verinder Singh on September 12 copy of which was supplied to media here today said aggrieved petitioner was transferred on the perusal of D.O. Note but the station(s) to which he could be transferred is suggested on the basis of same D.O. Note.

Court quashed the impugned order of Director Elementary Education of August 16, 2022, stating that transfer could not be sustained and is accordingly set aside. Court also found said DO note issued by BJP MP effected transfer, amounts to encroachment of the jurisdiction and authority of the Administrative Authority and, therefore, clearly is not sustainable as the question as to who and where is to be posted is the sole discretion of the Administrative Authority.

Respondent Kapildev who secured the DO against the petitioner defended him. The counsel for respondent Kapildev Advocate Sanjeev Bhusan stated that it is due to extreme hardship that he had approached the Member of Parliament for his transfer. The father of respondent No.3 died on 09.06.2020, and after his death, it is he, who is required to take care not only of his mother, who is currently 71 years of age and suffering from multiple ailments, but also his daughter, who is 16 years of age and suffering from a rare disease i.e. Leukocytosis and currently under treatment at Kidney Hospital, Jalandhar.

It is more than settled that as regard to the case of individual hardship, it is for the employer to decide the same and reference could conveniently be made to the judgment of the Supreme Court in Rajendra Roy vs. Union Of India and anr (1993) 1 SCC 148. In the given facts and circumstances of the case, court disposed the petition by directing respondent Director Elementary Education take a decision of transfer thereupon within a period of 10 days from today giving transfer on the other choice station of respondent Kapildev.

BJP releases sting operation alleging corruption in Delhi excise policy

NEW DELHI, SEPT 15

Bharatiya Janata Party on Thursday released a sting operation showing the alleged corruption by Delhi's AAP government in "handing over contracts for liquor licenses" under the excise policy introduced by Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal.

Addressing a press conference, BJP Delhi unit chief Adesh Gupta claimed that a total amount of Rs 100 crore was given by liquor giants to AAP in cash, to be used for elections in Goa or Punjab. BJP aired a sting operation in their press conference which claims to show proof of AAP's complicity in the alleged Delhi liquor scam.

The sting aired by BJP claims that "total amount of Rs 100 cr was given by liquor giants to AAP in cash, to be used for elections in Goa or Punjab."

Sting aired by BJP claims AAP's policy killed small retailers and only let giants live. "License earlier for Rs 10 lakhs, was



brought up to Rs 5 crore so no small player exists. Govt was not getting money from retailers, only wholesalers, so they stopped fixing a quota for wholesalers," the BJP added.

The sting aired by BJP further claimed that while earlier commission for wholesaler or supplier was of approximately 5 per cent and it was now made 12 per cent adding that the same policy was applied in Punjab but at 10 per cent rather than 12.

The excise policy was passed in Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal-led Delhi Cabinet in the middle of the deadly Delta Covid-19 pandemic in 2021. The Delhi government's version is that the policy was formulated to ensure the generation of optimum revenue, eradicate the sale of spurious liquor or non-duty paid liquor in Delhi, besides improving user experience. The CBI had filed a case against alleged corruption in the 2021-22 excise policy. The excise policy was subsequently withdrawn by the AAP government.

Last month, CBI raids on Manish Sisodia's official residence in connection with the alleged corruption in implementing Delhi's Excise Policy.

Sisodia was among 15 others booked in an FIR filed by the CBI. Excise officials, liquor company executives, dealers, some unknown public servants and private persons have been booked in the case.

It was alleged that irregularities were committed including modifications in the Excise Policy and undue favours were extended to the license holders including waiver or reduction in license fee, an extension of L-1 license without approval etc.

EDITORIAL

Go beyond incremental progress

The decision on phased withdrawal of Indian and Chinese troops from one of the friction areas in the Ladakh region is a positive development but there is no reason to drop the guard as Beijing refuses to recognise the status quo as it existed in April 2020, when the current military standoff began. The agreement on disengagement of frontline troops in the Hot Springs area along the Line of Actual Control (LAC) came after months of protracted negotiations between the military commanders of the two countries. While the move is the right step towards restoration of peace, there is a need to resolve all the pending border disputes once and for all, as suggested by the Indian side. China continues to complicate the matters by claiming that the status quo was created by "illegal trespassing on the Indian side" — a contention that goes against the ground realities. Restoration of the status quo and the violation of agreements and protocols for border management through China's action of amassing troops along the LAC are among the key issues raised by New Delhi.

Hot Springs is only the third friction point where the two countries have agreed on the disengagement of troops, during the 16th round of Corps Commander level meeting, but the bigger problems at the friction points of Depsang and Demchok remain to be addressed, largely due to the intransigence of the Chinese side. China has persistently refused to accept these two locations as friction points, contending they are not part of the current face-off.

The site of the latest disengagement is near the area where at least 20 Indian and four Chinese soldiers were killed in the June 2020 clash. The disengagement process has been slow because China is not in favour of completely pulling back from the friction points. India, on the other hand, wants withdrawal of troops from friction points leaving only reserve troops and material just behind the disputed areas. China has been rapidly ramping up both civilian and military infrastructure all along the LAC, including airports, railway facilities, roads and missile bases and conducting military drills in border areas that have focused on rapid deployment of troops from other regions.

This is causing alarm on the Indian side and does not augur well for resolution of the pending disputes. The infrastructure built by the Chinese in the last two years suggests they are in no mood to withdraw forces and return to a pre-2020 military position. The legacy disputes in areas like the Depsang Plains in northeastern Ladakh and Demchok in the southeastern part remain unresolved. With the PLA trying to shift the LAC westwards, the unresolved areas could turn into new flashpoints. A new crisis in eastern Ladakh or elsewhere along the LAC would undo the gains made in the form of disengagement over the last two years.

One more planet in the Universe

All astronomers concur that planets are created in protoplanetary discs, which are the bands of gas and dust that encircle newly formed, young stars. Even though the universe has hundreds of these discs, it has been challenging to observe genuine planetary birth and development in these settings. Currently, astronomers at the Center for Astrophysics | Harvard & Smithsonian have created a novel method to find these elusive newborn planets, along with "smoking gun" proof of a small Neptune or Saturn-like planet hiding in a disc.

The Astrophysical Journal Letters today published a description of the findings.

According to Feng Long, a postdoctoral scholar at the Center for Astrophysics and project leader, "directly finding young planets is highly tough and has thus far only been effective in one or two situations." Because they are encased in substantial amounts of gas and dust, planets are always too dim for us to see them.

Instead, they must look for signs that a planet is forming beneath the dust.

Long notes that in recent years, "many structures have appeared on discs that we think are caused by the existence of a planet, but it could be caused by something else, too." "We need new methods to examine and provide evidence that a planet exists."

Long chose to revisit the LkCa 15 protoplanetary disc for her research. The disc is situated in the Taurus constellation, 518 light



years away. Previous research employing ALMA Observatory images showed proof of planet formation in the disc.

Long dug over fresh, high-resolution ALMA data on LkCa 15, mostly from 2019, and found two faint characteristics that weren't there before.

Long found a dusty ring with two distinct, brilliant clusters of material circling within it at a distance of around 42 astronomical units from the star, or 42 times the distance between Earth and the Sun. The material was divided by 120 degrees and appeared as a small clump and a bigger arc.

Long used computer

simulations to analyse the situation and determine what was accumulating the material. He discovered that the objects' sizes and placements were consistent with the presence of a planet.

She explains, "This arc and clump are separated by around 120 degrees." That degree of disparity is significant mathematically; it doesn't just happen.

Long points to locations in space known as Lagrange points, where two moving bodies, like an orbiting planet and a star, form stronger zones of attraction where matter may gather.

According to physics and the things involved, Long says, "We're

seeing that this material is not simply floating around freely, it's stable and has a preference where it wants to be put."

In this instance, the L4 and L5 Lagrange points are where Long found the arc and clump of material. A small planet hidden between them at an angle of 60 degrees is what is producing the buildup of dust between locations L4 and L5.

The findings indicate that the planet is between one and three million years old and is around the size of Neptune or Saturn. (When it comes to planets, that is a youthful age.)

Due to technological

limitations, it might not be feasible to directly image the small, young planet anytime soon, but according to Long, additional ALMA studies of LkCa 15 can offer more proof in support of her planetary discovery.

She also expects that astronomers will use her novel method for finding planets in the future, which relies on material that preferentially gathers around Lagrange points.

I sincerely hope that this approach can be extensively used in the future, she adds. The only restriction is that because the signal is weak, very deep data is required.

Questions over role of secret services in Pak

The constant reports of enforced disappearances in Pakistan have raised questions over the role of the special committee, constituted by the former chairperson of the Human Rights Commission of Pakistan, which was supposed to investigate such cases. Former senator and ex-chairperson of the HRCPF Afrasiab Khattak speaking to DW news said that in his term in the Senate, he formed a special committee to investigate the enforced disappearances.

As per the media outlet, he said that the committee found the country's intelligence agencies, notably the Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI), were involved in the enforced disappearances.

"I approached the Defense Ministry with the suggestion to form a transparent law to bring secret services agencies under the domain of law. Despite multiple reminders, the defense ministry didn't respond to my request. Secret agencies don't want to follow any legal procedure which ends their authority and impunity," Khattak said.

People being forcibly disappeared is a serious and longstanding issue in Pakistan.

On May 11, Feroz Baloch, a student of Arid Agriculture University Rawalpindi was allegedly headed to the university library. But, according to the reports, he never made it to there and went missing. His whereabouts remain a mystery to till date.

The disappearance of Feroz Baloch has raised awareness of people going missing. DW

news reported that since 2000, when then-military ruler General Pervez Musharraf overthrew Prime Minister Nawaz Sharif's government to form his authoritarian regime, the issue of enforced disappearances has risen to prominence.

Hundreds of thousands of people from all spheres of life started to disappear. In March 2011, the Commission of Inquiry on Enforced Disappearances (COIOED) was formed to work on the issue.

According to recent figures released by COIOED in July 2022, a total of 8,696 cases of missing persons have been reported. While 6,513 of these cases have been solved, 2,219 are still pending, as per DW news.

Despite efforts by civil society, there is no end to the issue of enforced disappearances in Pakistan, as the State continues to use it with impunity.

Former senator and ex-chairperson of the Human Rights Commission of Pakistan, Afrasiab Khattak, told DW that in his term in the Senate, he formed a special committee to investigate the enforced disappearances. The committee found the country's intelligence agencies, notably the Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI), were involved in the enforced disappearances.

The irony is that successive Pakistan governments have pledged to end the practice of enforced disappearances, however, there is no end to it, reported Canada-based think tank, International Forum for Rights and Security (IFFRAS).

Russian embassy suspends all consular services after explosion near embassy



After a recent explosion near the Russian embassy in Kabul, the embassy has stopped all consular services, including the issuance of visas and other documents, according to a statement released on Tuesday, Khaama Press reported.

According to a message posted on the Russian embassy's Telegram channel, the suspension of the consular services and visa issuance comes right after a massive explosion occurred near the embassy.

The applicants are not to visit the embassy "until further notice," Khaama Press reported.

"We are working on options for issuing documents accepted. No new applications are accepted, no consular services are provided, no new visas are issued," the Russian embassy's statement read.

As a result of the explosion, two members of the Russian diplomatic mission were killed after an explosive device was detonated by an unidentified insurgent early

on September 5. The explosion occurred at the Russian embassy's entrance, near the consular department in Kabul inflicting 10 other civilian casualties.

This Kabul explosion comes days after at least 20 people were killed in a blast that rocked a mosque in northwestern Afghanistan during Friday prayers. In recent months, a number of blasts have been reported in the capital city of Kabul, claiming dozens of innocent lives.

This series of blasts comes on the heels of one year of Taliban rule in Afghanistan. Rights groups said the Taliban had broken multiple pledges to respect human and women's rights.

After capturing Kabul in August last year, the Islamic authorities have imposed severe restrictions on women's and girls' rights, suppressed the media, and arbitrarily detained, tortured, and summarily executed critics and perceived opponents, among other abuses.

Rights groups say that the Taliban's human rights abuses have brought widespread condemnation and imperilled international efforts to address the country's dire humanitarian situation.

Women's mental health more sensitive to exercise than men's

According to recent research from Binghamton University, the State University of New York, women's mental health during the COVID-19 pandemic was more likely to be impacted by physical activity frequency than men's.

The effect of dietary and lifestyle choices on mental health is a topic that Lina Begdache, an assistant professor of health and wellness studies at Binghamton University, explores. Her team recently examined the effects of exercise frequency, day of the week, and various pandemic stages on mental discomfort, with apparent disparities between men and women.

2,370 people responded to the survey, and the results were examined. The poll asked 41 questions about demographics,



education, eating habits, sleep, physical activity frequency and

pattern, and mental health status. Additionally, the pandemic was

divided into three distinct phases: before, during, and late COVID-19,

where "during" denoted the lockdown time and "late" characterised the relaxation of restrictions.

Researchers discovered that women needed moderate exercise to achieve mental well-being during the pandemic, a time of high levels of stress. In contrast, frequent exercise was beneficial for men.

"Stress on the body occurs during exercise. But because it frequently has pleasant connotations, it is seen as eustress [moderate or normal stress], according to Begdache. "The exercise's benefits are lost when it is overused, which is distressing. Men and women secrete different amounts of the stress hormone (cortisol) in reaction to intense exercise, it is well known.

According to Begdache's research, women should modify their workout regimens while feeling uneasy to keep their minds in a stable state and their spirits high.

Women are more likely than men to report experiencing stress, which shows that they have a lower stress tolerance, according to Begdache. Therefore, frequent exercise may increase stress levels and have a bad effect on mental health.

The researchers also discovered that, depending on the day of the week, exercise frequency modifies mental health. While women's mental health tended to decline on weekdays, men were more likely to experience mental health problems on the weekends. This can result from the necessity to manage

obligations as a mother while working and homeschooling their kids.

Additionally, the study shows a link between complete inactivity and mental anguish in both men and women. Increased exercise frequency and relaxation of COVID limit improved mental health. Increased exercise frequency fuelled the urge to concentrate on weight control because weight gain was a problem during the lockdown and also gave people's life more structure.

Zeynep Ertem, an assistant professor of systems science and industrial engineering at Binghamton University, and Anesh Danesharasteh, a graduate student there, also contributed to this study.

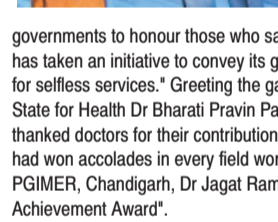

NIT Rourkela to Host CSAB-2022 and co-host JoSAA-2022



CHANDIGARH: National Institute of Technology Rourkela (NIT Rourkela) is conducting the centralized seat allocation process for the year 2022 for admission to various undergraduate programs at NITs, IITs, SPAs (School of planning and architecture) and some GFTI (Government funded technical institutes), all

collectively called the 'NIT+ System'. seats in the NIT+ system, if any. The registration for JoSAA rounds of seat allocation will commence on 12 September 2022. The CSAB-special rounds will begin on 24 October 2022 after the completion of JoSAA rounds. The whole counselling process is expected to be completed by 06 November 2022. It is estimated that approximately 2.2 lakhs applicants will participate in JoSAA and CSAB special rounds. There will be a total of 54477 seats for JoSAA. All 23 IITs, 31 NITs, 26 IITs, 30 GFTIs, 3 SPAs and one IITEST will select applicants through JoSAA counselling. Explaining the importance of CSAB, Prof. Mukesh K. Gupta (Chairperson, Local Organizing Committee, CSAB 2022) said, "This year, a few changes have been made for ease of candidates.

Though we have become self-sufficient in food grains, certainly we have paid a big price for this self-sufficiency. We indiscriminately used chemical fertilizers, weedicides and pesticides to achieve self-sufficiency in food grains. Due to this the land, water, and air got polluted. Simultaneously because of this indiscriminate



use, the agriculture production cost has increased but productivity has decreased. This is the reason that today farmers, especially the youth have preferred not to take up farming, said Sh. Manohar Lal.

The Chief Minister said that natural farming is the honour and a way of serving mother earth along with being a key means of bringing prosperity to our lives. Adopting natural farming will not only reduce the farming cost
