## Punjab CM calls Assembly Session again on Sept 27

Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Thursday said that the state government has now decided to summon the session of state assembly on September 27 to discuss various issues of pertaining to state. In a statement, the Chief Minister said that the state government will approach the Supreme Court



of India against the arbitrary and anti-democratic decision of the Governor to cancel the permission of holding a

special session of the Vidhan Sabha, after giving permission for it. He said that it is an unfortunate move and they will move to the Apex court against this irrational decision. Bhagwant Mann asserted that this decision will be challenged in the Supreme Court for safeguarding the democratic rights of the people and federal rights of the states.

Training his guns against the Punjab Congress for

supporting 'Operation Lotus' of the BJP, the Chief Minister said it is ironic that Congress which is the biggest victim of this undemocratic operation is standing by the side of the saffron party. He said that Congress, Shiromani Akali Dal and BJP are hand in glove for this sinister move aimed at toppling the democratically elected government of Punjab. Bhagwant Mann unequivocally said that

Congress and BJP have marginalized regional parties adding that now they want that power should remain confined between them only.

However, the Chief Minister said that the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) has taken birth from an anti-corruption crusade and the party under leadership of Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal is gaining momentum with every passing day.

## Wall collapse claims 10 lives in Etawah

Seven children are among 10 killed in separate incidents of house and wall collapse in Etawah district of Uttar Pradesh following 24-hour of incessant rain, police sources said here. The district administration has confirmed that so far 10 persons have died and seven others injured in five incidents of house and wall collapse since Wednesday night. Police sources said that an old dilapidated house in Pathariya locality under Kotwali police station collapsed around Thursday



noon. "Five persons were buried under the debris in the incident. The rescue and relief operation was launched immediately and those trapped were taken out," they said. Police sources said that three children, including Aliya (7), 8-month-old Aahil and 13-month-old Suhana died in the incident. "Chanda (30) and Qadari Begum (69), who

were injured in the incident, have been admitted to the hospital," they said. Earlier seven people were killed and five others injured in similar incidents in the district since Wednesday. Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath has expressed grief over loss of lives and has announced a financial assistance of Rs 4 lakh each to the kin of the victims. Earlier, District Magistrate Avanish Rai said: "Late on Wednesday night around 1 am, a portion of a Kutch house in Chandrapura village in Civil Lines area collapsed after one of its walls caved in.

## NIA conducts nationwide raids against terror funding suspects

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) on Thursday conducted raids at multiple places across the country against suspect terror funding links and detained over 100 Popular Front of India (PFI) members, sources said. The multiple agencies conducted raids in 10 states so far and detained PFI activists. The raids are underway in Delhi, Rajasthan, Telangana, Uttar



Pradesh, Karanataka and Bihar among others, sources added. Suspected activists of PFI were detained from Delhi's Shaheen Bagh and Lucknow's Indira Nagar.

Earlier this week, the agency issued a statement and said that NIA conducted searches at multiple

locations in Telangana and Andhra Pradesh in a case registered against PFI cadres. Then the raids were carried out in Telangana (23 in Nizamabad, seven in Jagtial, four in Hyderabad, two in Nirmal, and one each in Adilabad and Karimnagar districts) and at two locations in Andhra Pradesh (one each in Kurnool and Nellore districts). The accused were allegedly organising camps for imparting training to commit terrorist acts.

## Ashok Gehlot confirms bid for Congress president

Rajasthan Chief Minister Ashok Gehlot on Thursday confirmed that he will file a nomination for the Congress presidential poll. Ashok Gehlot, however, clarified that he will never stay away from Rajasthan and will keep working for the state. "I will file a nomination, then the other process will be in place, and an election can also be held. This all



depends on the future," Ashok Gehlot said on Thursday. "I don't want to make a comment on anyone in particular. Let us see what situation unfolds in

Rajasthan, what decision Congress High Command takes, and what Rajasthan MLAs think. It all depends on this," Ashok Gehlot said, talking about the Congress presidential poll. The race for Congress presidential polls has heated up with Ashok Gehlot confirming that he will file a nomination for the top post, while MP Shashi Tharoor has also received Sonia Gandhi's 'okay' to run for Congress chief.

# Withdrawing special session at behest of BJP is a 'Black day' in the history: AAP

Condemning the move of the Punjab governor to withdraw his assent to hold a Special Session of the Punjab Vidhan Sabha, Punjab Finance Minister Harpal Singh Cheema on Thursday dubbed it a 'Black day' in the history of Indian politics.

Addressing a press conference here at Punjab Bhawan, Cheema said that the way the Punjab governor acted on the directions of BJP and withdrew the permission for the special session indicates that the BJP is trying to crush the country's Constitution and the institutions based on the beliefs of Dr BR Ambedkar. Accusing the Governor of working at the behest of BJP, Cheema said that the governor sought permission from the additional solicitor general of India after ignoring the AG office of Punjab and withdrew of his earlier order. On the other hand, the Punjab government led by Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann is following the constitution of India in letter and spirit. He asserted that AAP will not bend before the BJP as Con-



gress did. The Punjab government has called an assembly session on September 27 to protect democracy and its Constitution. During this session, the issues of electricity, and stubble burning will be discussed.

Attacking Congress for skipping Gujarat and Himachal Pradesh states during its 'Bharat Jodo' campaign, Cheema said that they have surrendered before BJP and working as their spokespersons to avoid central agencies investigations. Castigating the saffron party, Cheema said that the BJP is frightened of the growing popularity of AAP and they have now accepted this fact

that only Arvind Kejriwal led AAP is going to shake their regime in the 2024 elections.

"It is proved beyond doubt that today, the BJP is only scared of AAP. They somehow want to halt the progress of the party. But I want to reiterate that the BJP will never be successful in its dastardly agenda and soldiers of Arvind Kejriwal will continue to work for the betterment of the country," Cheema said. Launching a scathing attack on the opposition, Cheema said that Congress leaders including Leader of Opposition Partap Bajwa are working as a B-team of BJP. Instead of supporting the AAP government, which is fighting against their nefarious agenda of 'Lotus Operation', Congress leadership is relentlessly supporting BJP on this issue and questioning the state government.

He said that AAP is a party of people for the people, which has come out of the Anti-Corruption Movement. "We will fight against them and will work to make the country number one again. Democracy is not owned by the people, democracy is belongs to any party or person," Cheema added.

The Punjab Vigilance Bureau, during its campaign against corruption in the state, registered a case against the former Sarpanch Satnam Singh and Panchayat Secretary Sukhdev Singh for embezzlement in the funds of Gram Panchayat Sathiali, Block Kahnawan, Gurdaspur district and arrested the former Sarpanch in this case. Meanwhile, in a separate case, the Vigilance has arrested Baljinder Kumar Kanango, tehsil Khamano and a private person Satpal Singh Satta, resident of village Bhaini Kalan, Fatehgarh Sahib district, on the charge of taking bribe.

Disclosing his here today, the spokesperson of the Vigilance Bureau (VB) said during the investigation conducted by the Bureau, it was found that the duo, former Sarpanch and Panchayat Secretary, has embezzled Rs. 20,08,602 out of



the amount of grants and panchayat funds received from the government from the year 2013 to 2018 for the development works of Gram Panchayat at Sathiali. He informed that in the said case, the VB has registered a case FIR 18, dated 21.09.2022, against above mentioned accused former Sarpanch and Panchayat Secretary under Section 409, 120-B IPC and under Section 13(1)(a) and 13(2) of the Prevention of Corruption Act at the Police Station Vigilance Bureau, Amritsar. Further investigation of the said case was under

progress. The spokesperson further informed that in a separate case, the complainant Najail Singh had filed an online complaint on the VB toll free helpline and alleged that above mentioned Baljinder Kumar Kanango through Satpal Singh Satta, a private middleman retained by Kanango, has demanded bribe of Rs 10,000 for demarcation of land purchased at village Baispur in Fatehgarh Sahib district.

He also alleged in his complaint that the said Kanango has already taken Rs.3000 as bribe from him and is now demanding more bribe of Rs.10,000 through his agent Satpal Singh. He said that after the investigation of the said complaint by the VB, a corruption case has been registered against both the accused under section 7 and 7A of the Prevention of Corruption Act at Police Station Vigilance Bureau at Patiala and the duo accused have been arrested.

to HPECC & ET Scheme

The council of Minister meeting held here on Thursday under the chairmanship of state Chief Minister Jai Ram Thakur gave its consent to Himachal Pradesh Early Childhood Care and Education Tutor Scheme-2022 (HPECC&ET) for the children in the age group of 3 to 6 years in Government Primary School under the National Education Policy. The scheme envisages appropriate care and stimulation of the brain in the early years in order to ensure healthy brain development and growth. Special attention and priority would be given to districts and locations that are particularly socio-economically disadvantaged. It approved the Policy to hire pre-primary teachers.

The Education Department would frame R&P rules for their recruitment and till the time R and P Rules are finalized, the Department shall engage the tutors by outsourcing through HPSEDC. Those candidates who have done one-year diploma in Nursery Teacher Education/Pre School



Education/Early Childhood Education Programme, for these candidates, the Department would pursue framing of bridge courses as per norms to make them eligible. The Tutors will be paid a sum of Rs. 9000 per month. The Cabinet gave its nod to double the subsidy on Edible Oil (Fortified Mustard Oil and Fortified Soya Refined Oil) from Rs. 5 to Rs. 10 for OTNFSA beneficiaries and from Rs. 10 to Rs. 20 per litre for NFSA beneficiaries for seven months with effect from September, 2022 to March, 2023 to facilitate the consumers.

It decided to engage 499 para cooks and 563 para helpers in Forest Department for proper maintenance and catering of 499

forest rest houses and inspection huts throughout the State. The Cabinet gave its approval to World Bank funded Programme 'Himachal Power Sector Development Programme' with a total cost of about Rs. 2000 crore for timely monitoring, implementation and verification of the proposed PMU establishment in Directorate of Energy alongwith structure and functioning.

It also decided to regularize the services of water carriers working in Education Department, who have put in 11 years services (as part time water carrier and daily wager) as on 31st March, 2022 and 30th September, 2022. The Cabinet gave its nod to open new

September 28 is being celebrated as International Safe Abortion Day. Hearing the name of abortion, various thoughts come in the mind of most people and when a woman comes to know about having an abortion, she is considered a crime and a sin in many places. Abortion is also often considered as the reason for the decreasing number of girls compared to boys in the society. After the implementation of the PCPNDT Act 1994, which was designed to prevent the identification of the gender of the child in the womb before birth, many women are facing difficulties to get legal and approved abortion services and facilities according to the MTP Act, which is designed for abortion. They are forced to undergo unsafe abortion, which sometimes results in the death of women. According to the available data, there are approximately 5.6 crore abortions worldwide every year. According to official reports, about seven lakh abortions are performed in India every year, excluding those performed at private health



facilities and at home. 56 percent of abortions in India are unsafe and 8.5 percent of all maternal deaths are due to unsafe abortions and every day an average of 10 women die due to unsafe abortions. According to a report by the Leccent Global Health Journal, out of a total of 1.56 crore abortions in India, only 30.4 lakh abortions are performed in facilities with health facilities. According to the National Family Health Survey, about 20 percent of abortions in the country are performed in public health facilities, about 53 percent are performed in private health centers and about 27 percent are performed at home. About 19 percent of women who have had an abortion have some kind of problem after the abortion. In view of this, from the year 2015, September 28 is being celebrated as the International Safe Abortion Day. If we look at the background of this day, in the year 1990 it was celebrated as a day of action to declare abortion in Latin America and the Caribbean. In 2011, the Women's Global Network for Reproductive Rights declared it as International Day.

CS seeks public cooperation to make district dengue-free

**MOHALI, SEPT 22**

The inspection, spray and awareness campaign by the teams of District Health Department for the prevention of Dengue fever has been going on continuously since the month of January across the district.

Divulging the details, Civil Surgeon Dr. Adarshpal Kaur said that the health teams have surveyed a total of 2,95,634 houses and other places in the district since January, 2022. Mosquito larvae have been found in as many as 9784 houses and 1739 challans have been issued to the violators. She said that larvae have been found for the first time in most of the house, therefore the violators have been given a strict warning that action will be taken on finding the larvae again. During this period,



316 cases of dengue fever have been reported till date.

According to the civil surgeon, teams of health workers inspected a total of 941394 containers including coolers, fridge trays, pots, empty tires, boxes and other items during this period and larvae have been found in 12839 containers.

She added that the larvae of the mosquito that spreads dengue fever can turn into a dangerous mosquito in a few

days which can even kill a person. Generally people think that due to little cold weather these days dengue mosquitoes do not spread whereas even these days there is a danger of breeding of dengue spreading mosquitoes.

She said that there is no definite season for dengue fever but usually it is more prevalent from July to November, so caution is very much needed even during the months of October and November.

She asked people to be fully alert and vigilant against dengue and not to leave clean or dirty water anywhere in and around their homes. She also said that when the Municipal Corporation teams reach and start fogging, the doors and windows of the houses should be kept open so that the mosquitoes could be eradicated.

SSP further mentioned that police has recovered 2 laptops, 2 printers, 1 computer, 1 hard drive from the accused and police has also recovered vehicles which were being used though the fake documents created by accused including 1 four-wheeler vehicle, 4 cars, 2 bullet motorcycles, 1 scooter Bajaj Chetak, 1 scooty Honda and 5 fake RCs.

Sakhi: One Stop Center, operational inside the civil hospital Sangrur, has continuously been providing medical aid, police and legal assistance, psycho-social counseling and temporary accommodation to the female victims of any kind of violence. While divulging details in this regard, Deputy Commissioner(DC), Sangrur Jitendra Jorwal said that efforts were being made by the Sakhi: one stop center was bringing positive changes in the lives of women by providing required aid to the victims of domestic or any other kind of violence. Jorwal said that till now about 419 cases have been reported in this center, which is being run by Women and Child development department. He added that out of these, 401 cases have been resolved by the centre administration. DC said that in 223 cases mental



and social counseling has been provided to the victims, while in 124 cases police assistance and in 133 cases legal counselling has been given. He said that apart from this, in 27 cases medical assistance has been provided to women victims and 10 needy women have also been provided temporary accommodation. DC, said that any female, victim of domestic or any other kind of violence, would be assisted by the one stop center and her identity would also be kept confidential. He said that the victim can directly approach Sakhi: one stop center or lodge complaint by contacting on 01672-240760 or through e-mail at ocsangrur@gmail.com. Meanwhile, District Program officer, Gagandeep Singh said, "Victim females will be given proper advice by the counsellors present at the center and if any medical assistance will be required, they will be referred to the nearest government health institution.



EDITORIAL

India’s Peter Pans

I recently spent an evening chatting with a former student, an alum of our university now working in London. In a tone of solemn humour, she told me that during her tenure as a student, she and her peers spent endless hours gossiping and speculating about their professors, and of the (real and imagined) lives professors might be leading, on and off campus. News not quite from the wild, the confession still sounded shocking and sobering at the same time.

Of all human relationships that exist in the grey zone between the personal and the professional, teachers occupy a particularly sensitive space. Their professional business is also a deeply personal one, that of the growth and development of individuals, through its many stages — holistic in the younger years fusing the personal and the academic, more professional and discipline-driven in college, etching, once again, a complex entanglement of power and proximity around advanced research mentorship. The last has been made naked and blatant by the academic #MeToo movements worldwide.

Things get infinitely more complicated when you’re teaching, or learning from people who don’t look or sound like you. I’ve experienced this through my years of studying and teaching at various universities across North America. And through the various obstacles the alien has to encounter on campus — such as the disproportionate mentoring burden on the academic from socially disadvantaged backgrounds, the curious and contradictory sartorial expectations from professors from ethnic minority groups — I have come to realise that the toughest and most sceptical scrutiny is faced by women as they take on academic authority. The acerbic irony of this scepticism should singe our soul. Women, whom society trusts the most as caregivers and mentors to young children as evinced in their pervasive presence and primacy in the teaching of young children, face increasing resistance in positions of professional and intellectual authority at points of advanced and higher education. Even without going into the multiple obstacles a female academic or professional faces that men are exempted from, this belies society’s deeply entrenched resistance to accept women in academic leadership — a resistance unevenly distributed across different disciplines.

Concerns over recession grow in South Korea

Short-term interest rates have recently risen above long-term interest rates for the first time since the 2008 financial crisis. The short-term 3-year interest rates once increased higher than long-term 10-year government bond rates. Regarding this, concerns over a recession is growing in the financial market.

In general, the yield curve inversion can be interpreted as a premonitory phenomenon before the recession. The Bank of Korea (BOK) explained that it is because 3-year interest rates have risen sharply due to the tightening monetary policies of the U.S. However, experts say the yield curve inversion of long- and short-term interest rates can be prolonged as concerns over the recession are growing.

According to the financial market sources on the 21st, the 3-year government bond interest rate recorded 3.784per cent at 11:30 a.m. on the 16th, higher 0.01per cent than the 10-year bond rate of 3.774per cent in 14 years and 2 months since July 18, 2008. On the 20th, the interest rate of the 3-year government bond was 3.823per cent and the 10-year government bond was 3.836per cent, but the interest rate gap between the 3-year and 10-year bonds was 0.013per cent, narrowing from the previous day (0.035per cent).

The market sources are concerned that this trend could continue as the 3-year bond rate surpassed the 10-year bond rate once during the day. In general, a decrease in the long-term interest rate below the short-term interest rate is considered a sign of a recession. This is because the recession usually occurred within 1-2 years after the short-term interest rate surpassed the long-term rate. According to the BOK, the 3-year interest rate has been higher than the 10-year



interest rate only two times between November 2007 and January 2008 and in July 2008, when the country suffered from the global financial crisis. From November 2007 to January 2008, there were 37 days when the short-term interest rate exceeded the long-term rate, and 10 days in July 2008. On December 7, 2007, the gap between the short- and long-term rates widened to up to 0.11per cent.

The U.S. also saw a sharp rise in short-term interest rate a day before the results of the Federal Open Market Committee (FOMC), widening the gap between short- and long- interest rates to the lowest level in 22 years. On the 19th (local time), the 10-year U.S. government bond rates closed at 3.569 per cent, and the 2-year bond rate also closed at 3.970 per cent. During the day, the 10-year bond rate soared to 3.60per

cent and the 2-year jumped to 3.992per cent. The gap between the two bonds was 0.401per cent, the largest ever in 22 years since August 2000. This year, interest rates of 2-year U.S. treasury bonds have rapidly increased, widening the gap with long-term bond rates. Since the 2-year bond rates first surpassed the 10-year rates in early April this year, the 10-year interest rate has risen again, but 2-year bond rates have remained higher than 10-year bond rates for more than 2 months.

As monetary authorities said they would continue the price-oriented monetary policy and the U.S. Fed is expected to announce at least 0.75per cent base rate hikes at the FOMC meeting on the 22nd, BOK’s monetary policy normalization is expected to be faster than originally expected.

The BOK pointed out that the yield curve inversion of short- and long-term bonds is due to the U.S. tightening monetary policies, so there is no need to interpret it as a sign of an recession. In 2007 and 2008, both 3-year and 10-year bond rates decreased, but now both rates have increased.

"The 3-year bond rate is more affected by market expectations for future monetary policies than the 10-year bond rate," said Gong Dae-hee, head of the bond market team at the BOK’s Financial Markets Bureau. "After the base rates have increased for the first time since COVID-19 in August last year, both 3-year and 10-year interest rates have increased, but the 3-year bond rate rose faster."

He said, "Unlike the past, the 3-year bond rate rose faster than the 10-year rate due to base rate hikes and inflation concerns, so it is still too early to predict

an economic downturn with the interest rate gap. The U.S. Fed also said it is due to Fed’s aggressive rate hikes to curb inflation, not a sin of the economic recession."

On the other hand, experts are concerned that the short-term rate will remain higher than the long-term rate for the time being as the monetary policy to prevent high prices is needed and concerns over the recession are growing. This is because a rise in short-term interest rates is inevitable, while long-term interest rates are likely to lead to an economic slowdown.

In general, short-term interest rates are highly affected by monetary policies, so it tends to increase with base rate hikes.

On the other hand, long-term interest rates are not significantly affected by the base rate hikes, but affected by mid- to long-term inflation and growth outlook. When the base rate increased, the yield curve inversion could continue for the time being as the long-term interest rates decreased due to concerns over an economic slowdown.

Kim Sung-soo, an analyst at Hanwha Investment & Securities, said, "The yield curve inversion of short- and long-term treasury bonds was inevitable due to the still high price and growing pressure to raise interest rates. In the future, the inversion will become frequent, and this trend is expected to continue."

"In particular, the period of inversion is likely to be longer than in November 2007 to January 2008, the first yield curve inversion occurred," he said. "The inversion will continue due to weak economic fundamentals and high prices and currency rates in addition to extended tightening monetary policy period and prolonged economic slowdown."

Researchers discover harmful level of PFAS in school uniforms



According to a study, school-children in the United States and Canada are exposed to potentially hazardous levels of per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS) through their uniforms on a daily basis. The researchers discovered PFAS in all nine popular brands of "stain-resistant" school uniforms they tested. The majority of the products had concentrations comparable to those found in outdoor clothing.

The findings of the peer-reviewed study published in Environmental Science & Technology.

"PFAS don't belong in any clothing, but their use in school uniforms is particularly concerning," said Mar-

ta Venier, senior author and professor at Indiana University. "School uniforms are worn directly on the skin for up to eight hours per day by children, who are particularly vulnerable to harm." PFAS in treated uniforms may end up in children through skin absorption as well as from eating with unwashed hands, hand-to-mouth behaviors and mouthing of clothing by younger children. The fluorotelomer alcohols, which were the primary type of PFAS found in the uniforms, also pose an inhalation risk. Further, PFAS-treated uniforms are a source of PFAS contamination in the environment when they are worn, laundered, and discarded or recycled.

Fake Job Racket in Myanmar

There have been media reports related to ongoing Myanmar based fake job racket entrapping Indians for digital/crypto scam. An estimated 100-150 Indian nationals are stuck in Myawaddy area of Myanmar across Thailand. Our assessment is that most of the Indian nationals are from Kerala and Tamil Nadu.

Since the first reporting of the case in July 2022, the Ministry of External Affairs through its Embassies in Thailand and Myanmar has been taking necessary action to rescue such Indian nationals including facilitating necessary consular access to the rescued/released Indian nationals at Immigration Detention centers. Through the efforts of our Mission in Yangon, 32 Indian nationals have already been rescued from Myanmar. Both our Embassies in Yangon and Bangkok have issued advisories and have been regularly taking up the matter with the local authorities.

It has come to our notice that duped Indian nationals travel using the 'Visa on arrival' facility to Bangkok and are quickly transferred to Myanmar hence tracking their arrival and onward movement is not possible until the Indian Embassy is contacted by the victims or their relatives after being trafficked across the border. It has been revealed by some of the rescued

victims that such camps are located in Myanmar and mostly under protection of some armed groups. In many instances individuals had taken the offer and joined the camps despite being pre-warned by our Missions through regular advisories. It has also been noted that some Indians are voluntarily involved in scamming jobs and reportedly received good remuneration/incentive to lure other Indian nationals.

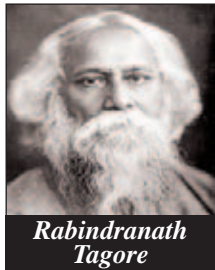
The target groups are IT skilled youth who are duped in the name of lucrative data entry jobs in Thailand through social media advertisements as well as by Dubai and India based agents. So far names of companies namely OKX Plus (Dubai based), Lazada, Super Energy group, Zhentian group have been identified offering these jobs. The trapped victims are allowed limited movement and restricted phone usage. They are forced to engage in digital scamming and crypto fraud activities. Fake FB/Instagram accounts and Ids are created in the name of Chinese girls which are further used to befriend with high network individuals from USA and European countries to dupe them in the name of Crypto Currency investment. Cases of some Indians managing to secure release after paying ransom to the tune of USD 3500 to 7000 have also come to our notice.

Malaria spike linked to amphibian die-off

A new study links an amphibian die-off in Costa Rica and Panama with a spike in malaria cases. The study demonstrates the importance of biodiversity to human health.

The study, published in the journal Environmental Research Letters, links an amphibian die-off in Costa Rica and Panama with a spike in malaria cases in the region. At the spike's peak, up to 1 person per 1,000 annually contracted malaria that normally would not have had the amphibian die-off not occurred, the study found.

"Stable ecosystems underpin all sorts of aspects of human wellbeing, including regulating processes important for disease prevention and health," said lead author Michael Springborn, a professor in the UC Davis Department of Environmental Sciences and Policy. "If we allow massive ecosystem disruptions to happen, it can substantially impact human health in ways that are diffi-



cult to predict ahead of time and hard to control once they're underway."

From the early 1980s to the mid-1990s, a deadly fungal pathogen called Batrachochytrium dendroba-

tidis, or "Bd," travelled across Costa Rica, devastating amphibian populations. This amphibian chytrid fungus continued its path eastward across Panama through the 2000s. Globally,

searchers combined their knowledge of amphibian ecology, newly digitized public health record data, and data analysis methods developed by economists to leverage this natural

the pathogen led to the extinction of at least 90 amphibian species, and to the decline of at least 500 additional species.

Shortly after the mass die-off of amphibians in Costa Rica and Panama, both countries experienced a spike in malaria cases.

Some frogs, salamanders and other amphibians eat hundreds of mosquito eggs each day. Mosquitoes are a vector for malaria. Scientists wondered, could the crash in amphibians have influenced the rise in malaria cases?

To find out, the researchers combined their knowledge of amphibian ecology, newly digitized public health record data, and data analysis methods developed by economists to leverage this natural

experiment.

"We've known for a while that complex interactions exist between ecosystems and human health, but measuring these interactions is still incredibly hard," said co-author Joakim Weill, a Ph.D. candidate at UC Davis when the study was conducted. "We got there by merging tools and data that don't usually go together. I didn't know what herpetologists studied before collaborating with one!"

The results show a clear connection between the time and location of the spread of the fungal pathogen and the time and location of increases in malaria cases.

The scientists note that while they cannot fully rule out another confounding factor, they found no evidence of other variables that could both drive malaria and follow the same pattern of die-offs.

Tree cover loss was also associated with an increase in malaria cases, but not nearly to the same extent

as the loss of amphibians. Typical levels of tree canopy loss increase annual malaria cases by up to 0.12 cases per 1,000 people, compared to 1 in 1,000 for the amphibian die-off.

Trade threats

Researchers were motivated to conduct the study by concerns about the future spread of similar diseases through international wildlife trade. For instance, Batrachochytrium salamandrivorans, or "Bsal," similarly threatens to invade ecosystems through global trade markets.

Springborn said measures that could help prevent the spread of pathogens to wildlife include updating trade regulations to better target species that host such diseases as our knowledge of threats evolve.

"The costs of putting those protective measures in place are immediate and evident, but the long-term benefits of avoiding ecosystem disruptions like this one are harder to assess but potentially massive, as this paper shows," Springborn said.

# Effective yoga poses for migraine relief!

Migraine headaches, whether mild or severe, should not be ignored. It is not just a symptom, and the seriousness varies from person to person, making it difficult to understand. On a scale of 0 to 10, 7 represents a severe headache. If you have a severe headache interfering with your daily activities, you should seek medical attention. The majority of headaches are mild. Ten of the hundred causes are serious, while the other 90 are self-limiting and do not require active intervention.

How To Get Started

Expert studies reveal that yoga can offer natural relief to migraine. Yoga is a centuries-old technique that encourages holistic living through a variety of postures and breathing techniques. A



few minutes of daily practise of these simple yoga postures will better prepare you for the next migraine attack. Following are some of the simple yoga techniques that offer effective remedies to migraine. Hastapadasana (Standing Forward Bend) This hand-to-foot position stretches every back muscle in the body. Stand with your feet together and your arms alongside your body.

Equalise your weight on both feet. Breathe in and raise your arms aloft. Bend forward and down towards your feet while exhaling. Maintain the pose for 20-30 seconds while breathing deeply.

Maintain a straight spine and legs by resting your hands on the floor, beside your feet, or on your legs. On the exhale, move the chest towards the knees, lift the hips and tailbone, press the heels down, and relax and move the head towards the feet. Continue to breathe deeply.

While inhaling, extend your arms ahead and upward and rise slowly to a standing position. Exhaling, raise the arms to the sides. Setu Bandhasana (Bridge Pose) This bridge asana Instantaneously soothes the weary back.

Lie down on your back. Fold your knees and place your feet on the floor hip distance apart, 10-12 inches from your pelvis, with your knees and ankles in a straight line. Keep your arms alongside your body, palms down. # Technology being used to identify accident prone areas: CS

Haryana Chief Secretary, Sh. Sanjeev Kaushal said that Haryana is using live map technology to identify accident-prone areas in the state. Using this technology, a grid is automatically generated for such places on the live map and the police gets information about such places immediately. He directed that the data of live map technology should be shared with all the stakeholder Departments like Police, Public Works, Health, Transport and Urban Local Bodies Departments so that special focus can be given on such accident prone areas to overcome the road accidents across the state.

While presiding over the meeting of Road Safety Fund Management Committee here today, Sh. Kaushal said that changing lane frequently by heavy vehicles is one of the major cause of accidents on highways. Therefore, sign boards should be installed on the left sides of roads for the movement of pas-



sengers and heavy vehicles and this rule should also be strictly followed. He further said that adequate lighting arrangements, sign boards and beautification work should be done on all the high-ways. Apart from this, reflective tapes and sign boards should also be set up to reduce the chances of accidents at blind spots and crossings during night time.

In the meeting, a budget of about Rs 36 crore has been approved for the road safety activities and to improve infrastructure this year. The Chief Secretary said that the budget should be allocated to the District Road Safety Committees

in a planned manner. He directed that the District committees should prepare a chart of the various activities to be carried out for road safety during this year and ensure the proper utilization of the funds allocated to them. In the meeting, a budget of Rs. 30 lakh has been allocated to the District Road Safety Committees in the state. Besides this, an amount of more than Rs. 3 crore has been allocated for various development works for Driving Training and Research Institute (IDTR) to be set up at Yamunanagar, Palwal and Sonapat. It was informed in the meeting that a road safety awareness campaign is being run by the Higher Education Department to make college students aware about road safety measures. For organizing various awareness activities and wide publicity of road safety rules, Rs 1.20 crore was allocated to the Higher Education Department for this campaign. Similarly, Rs 1.74 crore was allocated to the School Education Department for road safety awareness campaign.

Former Indian opener Wasim Jaffer lauded Indian skipper Harmanpreet Kaur for her outstanding unbeaten ton against England in the second ODI in Canterbury on Wednesday.



Captain Harmanpreet Kaur's explosive unbeaten hundred (143\*) and brilliant spell from pacer Renuka Singh (4/57) helped an all-round India defeat England by 88 runs in the second ODI of the three-match series at Canterbury to clinch the series on Wednesday. "When you're in form make it count, and that's what Harmanpreet is doing this year. Once again stands up in an important game. Congratulations on a special hundred @ImHarmanpreet #ENGvIND," tweeted Jaffer.

With this knock, Harmanpreet Kaur registered her fifth ODI century and became India's second-highest century scorer in ODIs, next to Smriti Mandhana (5) and former batter Mithali Raj (7). Harmanpreet's finest ODI performance was against Australia in the semi-final of ICC Cricket World Cup 2017, where she scored an unbeaten 171 off 115 balls with 20 fours and seven sixes. Coming to the match, in the first innings, India registered a massive 333/5 in 50 overs, their highest total on English soil. Captain Harmanpreet Kaur smashed an unbeaten 143 off 111 balls with 18 fours and four sixes and had a 113-run stand with Harleen Deol, who scored 58 off 72 balls. Opener Smriti Mandhana also played a crucial knock of 40 off 51 balls. Charlie Dean was the leading bowler for England with 1/39.

**NAGPUR:** When India takes to the field in Nagpur for the second T20I against Australia, they will be seeking a chance at a series-levelling win after their bowling let them down previously in Mohali. The second T20I between India and Australia will start on Friday at Nagpur. Australia is currently leading the three-match series 1-0 after a four-wicket win in first game in Mohali. India has a lot to look into while starting their practice sessions. Lack of consistency as an all-round unit has let it down in the last few matches. It has been a while since the top order consisting of KL Rahul, skipper Rohit Sharma and Virat Kohli have fired in unison. The pattern of one or two of them failing and the other one clicking has been going on a regular basis. It is time they fix this unfortunate pattern as they have to play against two world-

class sides, Australia and South Africa before the ICC T20 World Cup 2022. The form of middle-order players like Hardik Pandya and Suryakumar Yadav has been a boon for India this year and they would like to keep this going. Indian bowling has let them down since the last few of their outings, especially in death overs. It will be in India's interest that Jasprit Bumrah makes it to playing eleven this time to lessen the pressure on pacer Bhuvneshwar Kumar, whose failures in death overs since Asia Cup 2022 have received a lot of criticism. Spinner Yuzvendra Chahal's economy and lack of wickets is another concern. It will be interesting how much of a long rope he receives despite his lacklustre run recently. Wicketkeeper-batter Matthew Wade and newcomer Tim David are just as hard-hitting with their attacking batting. Combined with experience of Steve Smith, skipper Aaron Finch and Glenn Maxwell, the Aussie batting unit looks unbeatable.

UEFA Nations League: Scotland top group after 3-0 win over Ukraine

Glasgow : Scotland moved to the top of their UEFA Nations League group B1 after a 3-0 win over Ukraine at Hampden Park on Wednesday. This win acts as a band-aid for Scotland after they missed out on the World Cup, which will be held later this year from November to December. Steve Clarke's side broke the deadlock in the 70th minute with stand-in captain John McGinn striking gold for his side. This was followed by two goals from Lyndon Dykes in 80th and 87th minute.
