Kharge vs Tharoor: Cong to witness contest for President post today

NEW DELHI, OCT 16

After 22 years the Congress is all set to witness a contest for the president post on Monday with senior party leaders Mallikarjun Kharge and Shashi Tharoor pitted against each other to lead the party with new vigour so as to fulfil the aim of defeating the Bharatiya Janata Party in 2024 Lok Sabha polls.

The voting will be done between 10 am and 4 pm, with the results will be declared on October 19.

"The delegates from all states will vote at their respective polling stations with a 'tick' mark for the candidate they support. Arrangements have been made for smooth polling," said Central Election Authority Chairman of Congress Madhusudan Mistry.

"Ballot boxes will reach Delhi on Oct 18 & counting of votes will be done on October 19. Polling booth set up at AICC as well, where over 50 people will vote. The whole polling process will be fair & free, no doubt about that," he added.

It is not the first time that a non-Gandhi leader is contesting for the party presidency post-Independence, Jitendra Prasad con-



tested for the post of president about 22 years ago against Sonia Gandhi in which Sonia emerged as a winner holding the mantle of the party for 20 years.

Sonia Gandhi is the longest-serving president of the party, having held the office for over twenty years from 1998 to 2017 and since 2019.

This time no member of the Gandhi family is contesting for the post of President.

This is the sixth time in its nearly 137-year-old history that polls will be held to elect the President of the party. In the 2017 elections, Rahul Gandhi became

the president unopposed.

"There's no problem with our ideology but I want to bring a change in our way of work... Mallikarjun Kharge is an experienced leader, if he wins, we'll work in cooperation naturally," Congress Presidential candidate Shashi Tharoor said ahead of the polls tomorrow.

Kharge, "It's my duty to strengthen the org & fight vindictive policies of BJP-RSS, they're dividing the country on basis of religion; they're dividing the backwards, scheduled castes, minorities. They see everything through an election point of

view."

"We've to fight from parliament to street. It's difficult as unemployment & inflation are there, GDP growth is falling, value of rupee is going down, petrol-diesel & essential commodities' prices are going up," he added.

More than nine thousand delegates will vote in this election. The state from which the delegate belongs will have to go to the Congress headquarters of that state and vote.

Apart from the Congress headquarters in the states, the voting facilities will also be available at the party's central headquarters at 24 Akbar Road.

In Delhi, those delegates can cast their vote who have obtained prior permission from the Central Election Authority to cast their vote in Delhi instead of their own state. Congress Working Committee members including Sonia Gandhi, Manmohan Singh and Priyanka Gandhi and some senior leaders will vote in the booth at the Congress headquarters. About 40 delegates involved in the Bharat Jodo Yatra, including Rahul Gandhi, will be able to cast their vote in the camp itself.

A polling station is being set up at the Sanganakallu campsite in Bellary.

PM dedicates Digital Banking Units across 75 districts



NEW DELHI: With an aim to promote financial inclusion, Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Sunday dedicated 75 Digital Banking Units (DBUs) to the nation.

Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman and Reserve Bank of India (RBI) Governor Shaktikanta Das also attended the launching ceremony via virtual mode.

The setting up of 75 DBUs in 75 districts of the country was done to commemorate the 75 years of independence of the country.

According to Prime Minister's Office (PMO), DBUs will be brick-and-mortar outlets which will provide a variety of digital banking facilities to people such as the opening of sav-

ings accounts, balance-check, printing passbooks, transfer of funds, investment in fixed deposits, loan applications, stop-payment instructions for cheques issued, applications for credit and debit cards, tax and bill payment and nominations.

The PMO statement said DBUs will enable customers to have cost-effective, convenient access and enhanced digital experience of banking products and services all through the year.

The DBUs are being set up to ensure that the benefits of digital banking reach every nook and corner of the country and cover all states and union territories. Eleven public sector banks, 12 private sector banks and one small finance bank are participating in the endeavour.

Hry CM holds Jan Samvad Prog, over 600 complaints resolved

Haryana Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal while taking strict cognizance of administrative irregularity of Food and Supplies Inspector, Satnarayan who had allegedly pressurized the villagers of Sotai village to withdraw their complaint, immediately suspended the said inspector.

"In future also, if any officer does not work within the fixed timeline or is found involved in malpractices, then strictest action would be taken. Every officer and employee should work with responsibility to ensure timely delivery of citizen-centric services to the general public," said Sh. Manohar Lal while addressing a Jan Samvad Programme held in Faridabad today.

During the programme, more than 600 complaints were raised before the Chief Minister. Of these, 158 complaints related to the Munic-

ipal Corporation and 89 related to the police.

The Chief Minister said that these complaints have been sent to the concerned departments and directions have been given to resolve them all at the earliest.

He said that some complaints have been resolved at the local level and the rest will be resolved after thorough investigation.

The data of the elderly and Persons with disabilities have been identified through Parivar Pehchan Patra and soon the pension benefits would be given to the verified beneficiaries, said the Chief Minister while responding to a grievance raised by an elderly regarding pension.

The Chief Minister also gave Rs 2500 each to Sh. Rattan Singh and Sh. Rattan Singh as their pension amount. He also assured them from next month onwards both will get the timely payment of their pension benefits.

Xi Jinping warns China will not renounce use of force to unify Taiwan; vows to strengthen military

As he is set for a record 3rd five-year term in power and perhaps for life, President Xi Jinping on Sunday warned that China will "not renounce the use of force" to unify Taiwan with the mainland and vowed to advance the modernisation of the country's military to "world-class standards" to protect national sovereignty, security and developmental interests.

Taiwan considers itself a sovereign state – but China views the self-



ruled island as a breakaway province that must be reunified. Beijing has not ruled out the possible use of force to achieve national unification.

"We will not renounce the use of force and will take all necessary measures to stop all separatist movements" in Taiwan, Xi said on the opening day of the week-long key once-in-a-five-year Congress of the ruling Communist Party of China (CPC), which is widely expected to confer an unprecedented 3rd five-year term on him.

Except for Xi, all the top leaders

of the party, including the number two leader Premier Li Keqiang, would be replaced or reshuffled during the Congress as the administration headed by 69-year-old Xi is completing a 10-year tenure.

However, the Congress is expected to endorse Xi's continuation as he has already been declared a "core leader" of the party on par with its founder Mao Zedong. Xi's continuation in power will formally end the over three decade practice of its top leaders retiring after completing two-five-year tenures.

DTO and collection agents held for taking bribe

Haryana State Vigilance Bureau has arrested a DTO for allegedly accepting bribe through collection agents from overloaded vehicles passing through Yamunanagar district. Rs 30 lakh has also been recovered from the possession of the accused. While sharing the information here today, a spokesperson of the Bureau said

that the arrested accused has been identified as HCS officer Subhash Chander posted as DTO Yamunanagar. In this case, 4 collection agents have already been arrested by the Vigilance Bureau, from whom Rs 36.93 lakh have been recovered. In this bribery case, Vigilance had so far recovered a total of Rs 66.93 lakh from all accused including collection agents Sandeep alias Sonu, Ankith Garg, Neeraj Gulati and Manik alias Lovely.

Khattar, Bishnoi rule out any strain in ties with JJP

Haryana Chief Minister Manohar Lal Khattar and senior BJP leader Kuldeep Bishnoi have ruled out any strain in ties with alliance partner JJP and asserted that the government was running smoothly.

Days before BJP candidate Bhavya Bishnoi filed his nomination papers for the November 3 Adampur by-election, the JJP, which is led by former MP Ajay Singh

Chautala, had expressed unhappiness over not finding any mention in the banners and posters put up at the campaigning. The BJP had maintained that the party at that time had not officially released any posters, banners or hoardings.

Shah blows bugle for MP Assembly polls

Even as Madhya Pradesh heads towards Assembly polls next year, Union Home Affairs and Cooperation Minister Amit Shah on Sunday fired a broadside at the Opposition in this divisional headquarters, which used to be a saffron citadel, by saying that Madhya Pradesh's populace had 'experienced' Congress rule and must now repose faith in Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

Addressing a public meeting, the visiting dignitary – during his approximately 20-minute-long speech – touched on work accomplished by the Centre in every sphere and drew comparisons with earlier dispensations. Among those present were Chief

"Mr Modi has not only ushered in the country's development but also solved quandaries. The populace desired to see an imposing Ram temple in Ayodhya but the Congress prevent-

ed that from becoming a reality. Without shedding even a drop of blood, the present government cleared the path for shrine construction. Even abrogation of Article 370 was an outcome of Mr Modi's firm willpower. The indignant are realising that somebody is thinking of them for the first time since Independence.

Congress regimes never contemplated regarding destinations such as Kedarnath, Ujjain and Kashi Vishwanath.

That party threw the country's cultural heritage into disrepair. During the Kamal Nath dispensation's tenure in this state, every scheme was put on the back burner but these programmes were resurrected by the Shivraj Singh Chouhan government." Mr Shah averred.

People of Gujarat have made up their mind to oust BJP- CM

BHAVNAGAR (GUJARAT), OCT16: Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann on Sunday asserted that people of Gujarat have made up their mind to give mandate in favour of Aam Aadmi Party by ousting BJP from power.

Addressing the gathering here the Chief minister said that winds of change blowing in favour of AAP have transformed into storm. Lashing out against Congress, the Chief Minister said that the party vociferously raising the issue of change in Gujarat but this party has been reduced to 'MLA Exchange Party' as most of its MLAs are being pounced by other parties. Slaming BJP for the miserable condition of common man in the state, Bhagwant Mann said that the saffron party is responsible for plundering the wealth

and the situation of roads are in pitiable situation, a situation which was in Punjab before 2022 polls. Bhagwant Mann said that the situation can change only if the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) is voted to power.

Listing the several path breaking initiatives of the Aam Aadmi Government in Punjab, the Chief Minister said that from July 1 onwards the Punjab government has provided 600 units of free power to people in every bill cycle. He said that as a result of this around 50 lakh households out of total 72.66 lakh, which was roughly 68.71 % of total) have got zero power bill in the month of September. Likewise, Bhagwant Mann said that more than 17,000 government jobs have been given to the youth in last six months.

Editorial

The best thing going

It is the kind of thing that makes you want to laugh out loud, except that the circumstances are far removed from anything like laughter. The President of the United States has expressed solidarity with the women of Iran and their anti-hijab protests. Take this statement of Joe Biden's press secretary Karine Jean-Pierre: Women should be able to wear what they want, free from violence or harassment. And yet, it is a little over 100 days since the United States Supreme Court nixed the constitutional right to abortion. Biden has fretted and fumed and called the Supreme Court out of control but there it is, and there it remains. As the US midterm elections approach, pro-life Republicans are putting a lid on their views on abortion. As for the Democrats, Celinda Lake, a veteran Democratic pollster and strategist, reportedly called the political debate over abortion rights the best thing going for the Democrats.

None of this is to put the gloss on Iran's supreme leader. It appears Ayatollah Ali Khamenei cannot see Iranian women's agency in any part in these protests. For him too, it is about politics, a design by the US and the occupying, fake Zionist regime [Israel] and those who are paid by them, and some traitorous Iranians abroad. And before you say the M word, look to Hungary, where fertility rate is low and population is on the decline. The Viktor Orban government, however, wants pure bloods only --- is not so welcoming to refugees --- and has offered a slew of incentives to women. No taxes for mothers with four children, reduced mortgage and car payments, new loans etc. etc. Their bodies are being used as a resource for national development, said Andrea Peto, a gender studies professor at a college in Budapest, who was quoted in The New York Times.

Some say the East India Company incentivised native women to procreate with their own to multiply and prosper. Job done, they were edited out of their chronicles. The violent narratives of Partition and 1971 were inscribed on the bodies of women like some cautionary notice. Any child of the Birangana is called Juddho Shishu or Child of War. As if to emphasise that they were sired by war --- real intention notwithstanding; making the matter of the womb apparently secondary. In 2012, the Pussy Rioters raised their voice against Putin's policies against women. When they sang, Don't upset His Saintship, ladies/Stick to making love and babies at Moscow's Cathedral of Christ the Saviour in 2012, they were thrown into prison, for hooliganism, by the State. And it goes on and on and on and on. In Kermanshah and Karnataka and more places than you can think of.

How oxygen levels may have accelerated animal evolution

A new research has shed light on one of the reasons why animal evolution accelerated millions of years ago and according to scientists it is the wild fluctuations in the oxygen levels a billion years ago that could be held responsible.

Scientists believe atmospheric oxygen developed in three stages, starting with what is known as the Great Oxidation Event around two billion years ago, when oxygen first appeared in the atmosphere. The third stage, around 400 million years ago, saw atmospheric oxygen rise to current levels.

What is uncertain is what happened during the second stage, in a time known as the Neoproterozoic Era, which started about one billion years ago and lasted for around 500 million years. During this time, early forms of animal life emerged.

The question scientists have tried to answer is - was there anything extraordinary about the changes to oxygen levels in the Neoproterozoic Era that may have played a pivotal role in the early evolution of animals - did oxygen levels suddenly rise or was there a gradual increase?

Fossilised traces of early animals - known as Ediacaran biota, multi-celled organisms that required oxygen



- have been found in sedimentary rocks that are 541 to 635 million years old.

To try to answer the question, a research team at the University of Leeds supported by the Universities of Lyon, Exeter and UCL, used measurements of the different forms of carbon, or carbon isotopes, found in limestone rocks taken from shallow seas. Based on the isotope ratios of the different types of carbon found, the researchers were able to calcu-

late photosynthesis levels that existed millions of years ago and infer atmospheric oxygen levels.

As a result of the calculations, they have been able to produce a record of oxygen levels in the atmosphere over the last 1.5 billion years, which tells us how much oxygen would have been diffusing into the ocean to support early marine life.

Dr Alex Krause, a biogeochemical modeller who completed his PhD in the

School of Earth and Environment at Leeds and was the lead scientist on the project, said the findings give a new perspective on the way oxygen levels were changing on Earth. He added: "The early Earth, for the first two billion years of its existence, was anoxic, devoid of atmospheric oxygen. Then oxygen levels started to rise, which is known as the Great Oxidation Event. "Up until now, scientists had thought that after the Great Oxidation

Event, oxygen levels were either low and then shot up just before we see the first animals evolve, or that oxygen levels were high for many millions of years before the animals came along.

"But our study shows oxygen levels were far more dynamic. There was an oscillation between high and low levels of oxygen for a long time before early forms of animal life emerged. We are seeing periods where the ocean environment, where

early animals lived, would have had abundant oxygen -- and then periods where it does not."

Dr Benjamin Mills, who leads the Earth Evolution Modelling Group at Leeds and supervised the project, said: "This periodic change in environmental conditions would have produced evolutionary pressures where some life forms may have become extinct and new ones could emerge."

Dr Mills said the oxygenated periods expanded what are known as "habitable spaces" -- parts of the ocean where oxygen levels would have been high enough to support early animal life forms.

He said: "It has been proposed in ecological theory that when you have a habitable space that is expanding and contracting, this can support rapid changes to the diversity of biological life.

"When oxygen levels decline, there is severe environmental pressure on some organisms which could drive extinctions. And when the oxygen-rich waters expand, the new space allows the survivors to rise to ecological dominance. "These expanded habitable spaces would have lasted for millions of years, giving plenty of time for ecosystems to develop."

In a good or a bad mood, focused or distracted, in dire or no need: our internal states directly influence our perceptions and decision-making.

While the role of motivation on the performance of behavioural tasks has been known for more than a century thanks to the work of psychologists Robert Yerkes and John Dilligham Dodson its precise effect on the brain remains unclear. A team has now revealed how motivation alters the neural circuits responsible for sensory perception preceding decision-making in mice.

Going to work early in the morning, choosing a restaurant at lunchtime: many of our decisions are motivated by needs, such as earning a living or satisfying our hunger. However, decision-making is a complex process, which can also be influenced by external factors, such as the environment or other individuals, and by our internal states, such as our mood, our level of attention or our degree of motivation. The laboratory of

Sami El-Boustani, Assistant Professor in the Department of Basic Neurosciences at the Faculty of Medicine of the UNIGE and recipient of an Eccellenza fellowship (SNSF), is studying the neural circuits involved in decision-making. In recent work, carried out in collaboration with Professor Carl Petersen's team at EPFL, his lab has studied the role played by a specific internal state -- motivation -- in perception and decision-making. For more than a century it has been known that a relationship between motivation and performance exists thanks to the work of American psychologists Robert Yerkes and John Dilligham Dodson.

Too much or too little motivation is detrimental to performance. However, the way in which this impacts our neural circuits remains unclear. "We wanted to observe how sensory information transmitted by neurons in the cortex is altered by the degree of motivation and to what extent the latter can

have an effect on learning and performance in a decision-making task," explains Sami El-Boustani, the lead author of the study.

The research team developed a behavioral paradigm involving mice in a controlled water consumption regime. They first trained these rodents to respond to tactile stimuli via two whiskers (A and B) and to produce an action - licking a spout - only for whisker A in order to obtain a drop of water. Following this training, these mice reacted mainly to the stimulation of whisker A, thus indicating their ability to discriminate between these two sensations. Finally, the researchers conducted these experiments at decreasing levels of thirst in order to vary the motivation of the rodents to participate in the task.

In a state of great thirst -- therefore of great motivation -- rodents performed poorly. They licked the spout indiscriminately, without distinguishing between the whiskers stimulated.

How immunity is impacted by fatty acid metabolism in plants

Would you be surprised to learn that a salad also includes fatty acids?

Although fatty acids, lipids, and fats may seem unappealing, they are essential to human life and to the plants we eat. They influence specific proteins in a way that controls how plants grow.

Plant fatty acids (FAs) are components of cell membrane structure and, among other things, the building blocks of certain hormones. Acyl carrier proteins (ACPs), which are present in all branches of life and support and lengthen the expanding FA chains, stabilise fatty acids during synthesis. By establishing a clear connection between FA biosynthesis and the plant defence system, a recent work by Zhenzhen Zhao (of The Ohio State University) and colleagues adds a new perspective to the role of FA biosynthesis in plants.

The results of the study, which were reported in Molecular Plant-Microbe Interactions (MPMI), showed that Arabidopsis plants lacking the Acyl Carrier Protein 1 (ACP1) were more resistant to the bacterial pathogen Pseudomonas syringae, demonstrating the crucial role that FA metabolism plays in plant immunity. According to the corresponding author Ye Xia, "Our research revealed the potential function of ACP1 in plant defence across commercially significant crops and demonstrated a direct relationship be-

tween FA metabolism and plant immunity." According to the study, ACP1 is necessary for preserving the homeostasis of hormones that influence a range of plant stress responses. ACP1 can now influence a variety of biotic and abiotic stressors due



to its impact on hormone signalling, which opens up a wealth of potential applications.

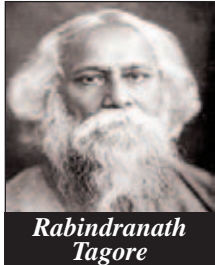
Since ACP1 performs a role in plant resistance that is different from that of its near family member, ACP4, this discovery also highlights the significance of investigating individual members of gene families that may have separate functions.

There are currently many economically significant crops that have ACP1 homologs. Future disease-resistant cultivars that can tolerate bacterial and other pathogen infections could be made by genetically modifying these significant crops to control the expression of ACP1.

NASA's SpaceX Crew-4 astronauts safely splash down in Atlantic

NASA's SpaceX Crew-4 astronauts, who spent 170 days in orbit aboard the Dragon spacecraft, completed the agency's fourth commercial crew mission to the International Space Station by safely splashing down the coast of Jacksonville, Florida on Friday.

NASA astronauts Bob Hines, Kjell Lindgren, and Jessica Watkins and ESA (European Space Agency) astronaut Samantha Cristoforetti returned to Earth in a parachute-assisted splash-down at 4:55 p.m. EDT.

Teams aboard SpaceX recovery vessels retrieved the spacecraft and astronauts. After returning to shore, all astronauts will fly to NASA's Johnson Space Center in Houston. Cristoforetti then will board a plane to Europe.

"Welcome home Crew-4! This international crew has spent nearly six months on the International Space Station conducting science for the benefit of all. Their work aboard the orbiting lab-



oratory will help prepare future explorers for future space missions," said NASA Administrator Bill Nelson. He added, "Working and living on the space station is the opportunity of a lifetime,

but it also requires these explorers to make sacrifices, especially time away from loved ones. Kjell, Bob, Jessica and Samantha, thank you for your contributions over the past six months to

science, innovation, and discovery!"

The Crew-4 mission launched at 3:52 a.m. EDT on April 27 on a Falcon 9 rocket from NASA's Kennedy Space Center in Florida. Less than 16 hours later, Dragon docked to the Harmony module's space-facing port. The astronauts undocked from the same port at 12:05 p.m. on Friday, to begin the trip home.

Hines, Lindgren, Watkins, and Cristoforetti travelled 72,168,935 miles during their mission, spent 170 days aboard the space station, and completed 2,720 orbits around Earth. Lindgren has logged 311 days in space over his two flights, and with the completion of their flight today, Cristoforetti has logged 369 days in space on her two flights, making her second on the all-time list for most days in space by a woman. The Crew-4 mission was the first spaceflight for Hines and Watkins. Throughout their mission, the Crew-4 astronauts contributed to a host of science and

maintenance activities and technology demonstrations. Cristoforetti completed two spacewalks with Roscosmos cosmonaut Oleg Artemyev to perform station maintenance and upgrades.

Crew-4 continued work on investigations documenting how improvements to the space diet affect immune function and the gut microbiome, determining the effect of fuel temperature on the flammability of a material, exploring possible adverse effects on astronaut hearing from equipment noise and microgravity, and studying whether additives increase or decrease the stability of emulsions.

The astronauts also investigated microgravity-induced changes in the human immune system similar to ageing, tested a novel water-reclamation membrane, and examined a concrete alternative made with a material found in lunar and Martian dust.

An all-round Namibia pulled off an upset for ages after defeating Asia Cup 2022 champions Sri Lanka by 55 runs in their Group A, round one match of ICC T20 World Cup 2022 at Geelong today. "Namibia has told the cricketing world today..." Nam "yaad rakhna!," tweeted Tendulkar. Coming to the match, put to bat first by Namibia, they were off to a shaky start. The intent was always visible in the innings but wickets kept falling at regular intervals. In 15 overs, Namibia was at 95/6. But they accelerated in the final five overs, scoring 68 runs. Jan Frylinck (44 off 28 balls) and JJ Smit (31* off 16 balls) helped their side reach 163/7 in 20 overs. Pramod Madushan (2/37) was the standout Sri Lankan bowler. Maheesh Theekshana, Dushmantha Chameera, Chamika Karunaratne and Wanindu Hasaranga took a wicket each. Chasing 164, Sri Lanka were caught by surprise by fantastic bowling from Namibia and some electric displays of fielding. Only captain Shanaka (29 off 23 balls) and Bhanuka Rajapaksa (20 off 21 balls) could score something decent as the Asian champs were bundled out for just 108 runs and lost the match by 55 runs. David Wiese (2/16) and Bernard Scholtz (2/18) were the leading bowlers for Namibia. Ben Shikongo and Jan Frylinck also took two scalps while JJ Smit took one. Frylinck was titled with the 'Man of the Match' award for his all-round performance. He scored 44 and took 2/26 with the ball.

Aus GP: Marquez claims 100th podium finish

PHILLIP ISLAND (AUSTRALIA), OCT 16 (UNI) After 357 days from last trip to the podium, Marc Marquez became just the fourth rider in history to achieve 100 premier class podiums after finishing second at the Australian Grand Prix while Pol Espargaro fought for the top ten. Marquez lined up in the centre of the front row of the grid for the 27 lap race. With clear track ahead of him, he charged off the line to tuck in just behind pole-sitter Jorge Martin for the opening half of the race as they avoided the frantic battle behind.

Chala Regasa, Irine Cheptai bag maiden Delhi Half Marathon crowns

NEW DELHI: Ethiopia's Chala Regasa and Kenya's Irine Cheptai took the honours at the Vedanta Delhi Half Marathon 2022, a World Athletics Elite Label Race, when they crossed the line in 60:30 and 66:42 respectively on Sunday. Meanwhile, it was an incredible photo finish in the Indian Elite men's category between defending champion Avinash Sable and Karik Kumar that received tremendous applause from the audience. The duo clocked an identical 64 minutes, but the top-billed Sable was declared the winner by the technical officials of the Athletics Federation of India after investigating the footage in a statement released by Delhi Half Marathon. There were no surprises in the Indian women's elite where Sanjivani Jadhav bagged the crown in the world's premier half marathon after two previous podium finishes. Regasa, 25, came out on top of a thrilling three-person battle over the final kilometre in the Indian capital, sprinting away from Kenya's Felix Kipkoeh and fellow Ethiopian Boki Dibaba with 400 metres to go to take the US \$27,000 first prize cheque.

SOUTH GEELONG : An all-round Namibia pulled off an upset for ages after defeating Asia Cup 2022 champions Sri Lanka by 55 runs in their Group A, round one match of ICC T20 World Cup 2022 at Geelong on Sunday.

This day will be one to remember for Namibia as the win was not a close one by any means, but rather a highly comprehensive one. Be it late death over 68-run stand between Frylinck (44) and Smit (31*) or electric fielding and bowling performances, Namibia outplayed Lankans in every department. Bowlers like David Wiese (2/16),

Ben Shikongo (2/22) and Bernard Scholtz (2/18) led the team from the front with the ball.

Chasing 164, a surprise awaited Sri Lanka. Opener Kusal Mendis was dismissed for just 6 by medium-pacer David Wiese in the 2nd over. Ben Shikongo, another medium pacer dismissed Pathum Nissanka (9) and Danushka Gunathilaka (0) on two consecutive deliveries, sending the opposition camp into panic. Sri Lanka was 21/3 in 3.3 overs.

Dhananjaya de Silva was joined by hard-hitting Bhanuka Rajapaksa and they took Sri Lanka through the remainder of their powerplay safely. SL

was at 38/3 in six overs, with Silva (11*) and Rajapaksa (9*) at the crease.

Medium-pace continued its domination in Lanka's innings as Jan Frylinck joined the party, dismissing Silva for 12 off 11 balls after being caught by Shikongo at deep backward square leg. Sri Lanka was 40/4.

Dasun Shanaka, the skipper joined Rajapaksa and they had to do some heavy repair works. The duo kept the scoreboard ticking and took Sri Lanka halfway through the innings safely. After 10 overs, Sri Lanka was at 72/4, with Rajapaksa (19*) and Shanaka (22*). It seemed Sri Lanka could bounce back in the match.

Just when things looked safe for SL, spinner Bernard Scholtz gave twin jolts to the Asia Cup champions, sending back Rajapaksa (20) and Wanindu Hasaranga (4). Frylinck also got his second wicket of the match, sending back skipper Shanaka for 29 off 23 balls.

The Asia Cup champs looked in a huge trouble, 7 down for just 88 runs in 14 overs. They needed to swing big, but with caution as 76 off 36 balls were needed, with only three wickets in hand.

Pramod Madushan was run out for a duck by Michael van Lingen and wicketkeeper Zane Green. SL sunk to 88/8 and Namibia was just two wickets away from pulling off a huge upset.

This day historic for us, want to qualify for Super 12 stage: Erasmus

An all-round Namibia pulled off an upset for ages after defeating Asia Cup 2022 champions Sri Lanka by 55 runs in their Group A, round one match of ICC T20 World Cup 2022 at Geelong on Sunday. "Incredible journey, last year was a special experience for us. We have started a great win, but lot of work to do throughout this tournament still. It has been a historic day for us. The opening day has been quite special but we want to kick on from here and qualify for the Super 12 stage. We understand the bigger picture as well. Credit goes to Pierre (de Bruyn) the way he has installed coaching to this team, one that is a winning culture and one that sticks together. With the limited resources, I do not think there is anyone else that could run such a tight ship," said Erasmus in a post-match presentation.

Iga Swiatek reaches San Diego Open final, defeats Jessica Pegula in semis

SAN DIEGO : World Number 1 tennis star Iga Swiatek of Poland advanced to the final of the San Diego Open after defeating USA's Jessica Pegula in the semifinal of the tournament on Saturday.

As per WTA, Swiatek defeated her opponent by 4-6, 6-2, 6-2. She came back from being one set down to clinch the next two sets comprehensively to seal her spot in the final, where she will meet the winner of the second semifinal between Danielle Collins and qualifier Donna Vekic.

She won her 63rd match of the season, equaling the total of Angelique Kerber for most WTA tour wins in past six years. She will become the fourth woman to finish the calendar year with more than 10,000 in WTA Tour Rankings after stars like

Victoria Azarenka, Maria Sharapova and Serena Williams.

There were three breaks of serve in the first set and momentum shifted



continuously. After back to back breaks, Pegula faced a third, saved two break points and levelled the match at 4-all after Swiatek missed a forehand wide.

In the next game, when Swiatek faced a break point, she double-faulted off the top of the net and Pegula served out the first set, prevailing on another Swiatek forehand that sailed wide.

The play faced a suspension of more than an hour due to rain and Swiatek came back firing to take a 3-0 lead and there was no looking back for her from that point. She managed to convert her second set point with a ringing forehand and the match headed into a decider of a third set.

Serving at 2-all in the third set, Swiatek managed to save all three break points against her and broke Pegula to clinch a 4-2 lead. A tired Pegula sent a forehand into the net and with that, Swiatek was sent into her ninth final of the year.

It would be nice for us to score in the tournament," he said. "Hopefully we can have another good performance. Brazil are a good team. And we also know that Brazil are fighting to ensure their place in the knockout stage. So, I think they are going to come out with all guns blazing," the coach added.

The Indian girls,

Dennerby said, are ready to play for their honour against Brazil.

"We will fight and try to score a goal. It would be nice to come out of this tournament with a goal," he said.

"We have worked on the final crucial pass - the actions around the opponents' box. That is also the hardest part in football--to learn exactly how to handle that kind of situation."

"The girls need to have a better understanding of decision making - we also have to work a little bit with the skills in those crucial moments, because in the end the result of all games are decided in the two boxes," the Swedish coach said.

AAP presents report card of 7 months, slams opposition

Presenting the report card of 7 months performance of Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), Cabinet Minister Aman Arora on Sunday said that Punjab government led by Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann has ushered a new era of politics in the state by eliminating the corruption and mafia culture patronized by previous government in the past 7 decades.

Addressing a press conference here at party's headquarter, Punjab Housing and Urban Development Minister Arora slammed previous Congress, SAD and BJP governments for pushing Punjab into colossal debt and said that most of their leaders were indulged in mal-practices and they filled their own coffers, but on the contrast, AAP government has adopted a zero-tolerance policy against corruption to bring back lost glory of the state. Listing the achievements of the AAP government, the Information & Public Relations Minister said that the Mann government took his-



toric decisions in seven months which the previous governments had failed to take in the over past 70 years of their regime.

He said that the AAP is generating employment as promised during poll campaigns. The government has regularised services of 9000 teachers and a process initiated to regularise the services of remaining 28000 contractual employees. The government has also started the process for 26,000 posts lying vacant in various government

departments in boards along with filling the 2500 posts of various cadres filled in the Police Department. He said that an anti-corruption helpline has been launched to combat the corruption in Punjab. "The one of biggest achievements of the Mann government is cracking down on corrupt leaders. In the past seven months, the state government has arrested over 220 influential people, senior politicians and bureaucrats who had looted the Punjab and were being patronized

by the successive governments," the Minister said while addressing the media. Replying to a media query over ongoing inquiries against opposition leaders, Arora said that unlike previous governments, AAP is not doing vendetta politics and actions will only be initiated against them after investigation team found them guilty in the probe.

Arora said that under the dynamic leadership of CM Mann, the state government has also taken a myriad of pro-farmers decisions including giving MSP on Moong as 3rd crop after procuring it at an MSP price of Rs.7275 per quintal.

He said that for the first time, load enhancement fees on tubewells slashed from existing Rs.4750 to Rs.2500 per HP as one time measure for farmers. The subsidy of Rs.1500 per acre has been given for Direct Seeding of Rice to save ground water from depletion.

Likewise, price of sugarcane enhanced Rs.20 per quintal from Rs.360 to Rs.380. The area under summer Moong has increased from 54,363 acres to 1,28,495 acres.

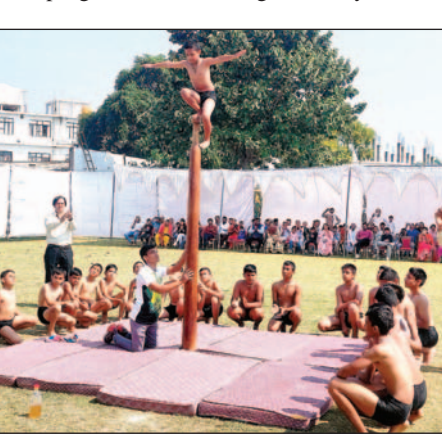
The annual festival celebrated in Gurukul
