259 grams of heroin recovered in Sirsa, one accused arrested

CHANDIGARH: - Haryana Police has arrested a person on the charges of drug peddling and recovered 259 grams of heroin worth lakhs of rupees from him in Sirsa district. Police have also recovered Rs 22,600 in cash from his possession. Giving detailed information in this regard, a spokesperson of Haryana Police said that the arrested accused has been identified as Sagar Kumar, a resident of Patti Ratha Vas, village Dhudhiyan Wali, district Sirsa. A team of Anti-Narcotic Cell, during patrolling and checking, was going towards village Dhudianwali via bus stand, where a car was seen coming. On seeing the police, the driver of the vehicle tried to escape. On the basis of suspicion, police nabbed the driver and when searched, 259 grams of heroin and cash of Rs 22,600 were recovered from his possession.

No hike in power tariffs in Haryana: CM

CHANDIGARH: Chief Minister, Sh. Manohar Lal said that unprecedented power reforms have been carried out in Haryana in the last 8 years; which have garnered appreciation from Union Power Minister, Sh. Raj Kumar Singh and have also been studied by the central government team.



As a result of this, the focus has been on reducing the line losses and today the line losses have come down to 13.43 percent, which used to be 25 to 30 percent in the previous governments. The state government has made elaborate arrangements to ensure regular power supply to the consumers. Giving relief to the consumers, the state government has not made any change in the electricity rates. The Chief Minister said that the power tariffs are decided by the Haryana Electricity Regulatory Commission and not the government. The Commission has also issued the orders for electricity rates for the year 2023-2024, which has been posted on its website. He said that today the number of electricity consumers of all categories is more than 76 lakh.

The Chief Minister said it has been a great example of power management, that despite the less availability of electricity many times; the state government provided complete electricity to the consumers.

Punjab takes major stride for checking depletion of ground water table

HYDERABAD: Taking a major leap forward for checking the depleting ground water table in the state, the Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann today announced to explore the feasibility to replicate Telangana model for the conservation of this precious



natural resource and recharging the water table in the state.

The Chief Minister, who along with the officers of the Irrigation department, analyzed the Telangana model of water conservation here, said that it is a revolutionary model that is aimed at recharging the water table holistically. He said that the Telangana government has constructed small dams in the villages for conserving the ground water across the state. Bhagwant Mann said that as a result of this the ground water level has increased upto two metres in the villages.

The Chief Minister said that need of the hour is to channelise canal water in Punjab for saving the ground water for the coming generations. He said that the sole motive of examining this model is to check the depletion of ground water level for the sake of future generations.

Revival of cinema turns spotlight back on J-K, over 150 films shot in last 2 years

SRINAGAR: Once popular with filmmakers for its scenic locations and pristine landscape, Jammu and Kashmir fell behind in the pecking order of shooting destinations as militancy peaked.

However, with the revival of cinema, Jammu and Kashmir has been the centre of attraction for filmmakers over the last couple of years.

Following the implementation of the new Jammu and Kashmir Film Policy in 2021, the Union Territory has been emerging as a preferred shooting location for the film industry and more than 150 films and web series have been shot in the UT in less than 2 years.

After recording a sharp upturn in the number of tourists and air traffic in 2022, the UT is being promoted at all global fora to further explore the tourism potential of Jammu and Kashmir. Owing to the efforts of the Depart-

ment of Tourism and other stakeholders over the past two years, Jammu and Kashmir is now opening up for meetings, incentives, conferences, exhibitions and tourism (MICE). Over the past couple of months, many corporate delegations have visited Kashmir and many more visits are lined up for the coming season. Executives of travel companies visit the valley with their clients, helping Kashmir emerge as a corporate tourism destination as well. According to the administration, the UT has all the infrastructure, services and tourism packages required for MICE tourism. In addition to introducing adventure activities, it is working in a holistic manner to attract tourists across all segments through promotions, roadshows, and events. A senior official told local media that the administration was also working on a regular basis to maintain the interest of tourists.

DC gives instructions to complete work of Aadhaar updation soon

DALJEET AJNOHA HOSHIARPUR, FEB 16

Bhavna Garg, Deputy Director General, Unique Identification Services Authority of India, said that Aadhaar issued more than 10 years ago (before 2015) is mandatory to be updated with proof of identity and home address. She was addressing the meeting of the Aadhaar Monitoring Committee constituted at the district level along with Deputy Commissioner Komal Mittal at the District Administrative Complex today. During this, she also reviewed the Aadhaar registration of 0-5 years and 06-15 years.

The Deputy Director General said that if the Aadhaar card is found to be fake after checking with the QR code app, then a case of fraud



should be registered against that person immediately. She said that while using Aadhaar in government institutions, the concerned officers should get QR code.

Through the code app, Aadhaar will have to be confirmed to be genuine/fake. She asked to make arrangements for registration in health institutions for Aadhaar based registration of new born children in the district. She said that since the biometric of new born children is not mandatory, their registration will have to be

done at the time of birth itself. Bhavna Garg asked the District Education Officers to expedite 100 percent registration of the 6-15 years age group.

She said that if someone has already been registered for Aadhaar in the 0-5 years category, then his biometrics should also be updated in the 6-15 years category. She said that the copy of Aadhaar card should not be kept on record in the office so that it could not be misused and the last four digits of Aadhaar or Virtual Aadhaar could be used.

Was. The National Education Policy, 2020 also reaffirms the recommendation to increase public investment. The Standing Committee on Human Resource Development/Education has repeatedly noted that the Department of School Education is allocated much less funds than it proposes. The shortfall in the years 2018-19, 2020-21 and 2021-22 was Rs 15,500 crore, Rs 22,700 crore and Rs 43,000 crore respectively. In other words, the department received 76 per cent, 72 per cent and 56 per cent of the funds sought in these years, respectively. The Standing Committee on Human Resource Development (2020) has stated that the budget allocation for universities is inadequate compared to their infrastructure, faculty and number of students enrolled. It affects the implementation of Yogesh Kumar Gupta Nape said that the Standing Committee on Education (2021) has expressed concern over the sharp decline in GER at the higher secondary level.

Swamy pleads SC to hear plea seeking national heritage status for Ram Setu

Senior Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) leader, Dr Subramanian Swamy, mentioned his case on Thursday before the Supreme Court bench seeking national heritage status for Ram Setu, to which, the SC agreed to list the matter after the Constitution Bench hearing. "After the Constitution Bench, We will list it. See the higher the powers, the higher is the responsibility," the bench of the Supreme Court, headed by the Chief Justice of India (CJI) Dr Dhananjaya Yeshwant Chadrachud said and assured Dr Swamy that the matter would be taken up for hearing. The former Rajya Sabha Member of Parliament (MP) and also a senior leader from the BJP, Dr Subramanian Swamy mentioned his plea, before the CJI Bench of the Supreme Court, seeking national heritage status for Ram Setu. Dr Swamy



sought urgent listing of his petition. CJI Dr Chandrachud agreed to list his matter after the Constitution Bench hearing. The Solicitor General (SG) Tushar Mehta, representing the Central government, had on January 19, told the Supreme Court that the process to declare 'Ram Setu' a national heritage monument is currently underway in the ministry of Culture. Swamy had earlier, told the Apex Court that the case has been pending for eight years before it, but the government has not been able to respond on the plea. In his petition, Dr Swamy had urged the Apex Court to pass order and direct the "Union of India (UOI) along with the National Monuments Authority

(NMA) to declare Ram Setu as an Ancient Monument of National Importance." Dr Swamy had also urged the top court to pass order and direct "Union of India to engage Geological Survey of India and Archeological Survey of India to conduct a detailed survey in respect to Ram Setu as an Ancient Monument of National Importance." Dr Swamy said that he has already won the first round of the litigation in which the Centre accepted the existence of 'Ram Setu' and added that union minister concerned had called a meeting in 2017 to consider his demand to declare the Setu as a national heritage monument but subsequently nothing happened. Ram Setu is a chain of limestone shoals between Pamban Island, also known as Rameswaram Island, off the south-eastern coast of Tamil Nadu, and Mannar Island, off the north-western coast of Sri Lanka.

Strange exclusion

Amartha Sen once said a country doesn't become fit for democracy; it becomes fit through democracy. Perhaps this idea was incorporated in the Constitution while granting universal adult franchise in a country with a significant illiterate population. R.K. Sidhwa, a member of the Constituent Assembly, called it the greatest risk. Interestingly, he also remarked that the Constituent Assembly took the risk as democracy would be futile without universal adult franchise.

The right to vote was kept outside fundamental rights. However, Article 326 of the Constitution provides that every person not less than 18 years is entitled to be registered as a voter. This is subject to disqualification in the Constitution or as provided under any law by the appropriate legislature on the grounds of unsoundness of mind, non-residence, crime and corrupt or illegal practice. An entitlement to be registered as a voter carries the presupposition of the right to vote. However, the Supreme Court, in a catena of decisions, has consistently held the right to vote as a statutory right provided under Section 62 of the Representation of People Act, 1951. This provision lays down that every person who has entered the electoral roll of any constituency is entitled to vote and also lays down restrictions on it. Reading this provision, the Supreme Court concluded that the right to vote is neither a fundamental nor a constitutional right; it is a statutory right.

This position has been maintained since the 1952 decision in the NP Ponnuswami vs Returning Officer. In 1982, the highest court went a step further in Jyoti Basu vs Debi Ghosal to observe that the right to vote is fundamental to democracy. However, outside of the RPA, there is no right to elect, no right to be elected, and no right to dispute any election.

Apex court judges who regard the right to vote as a constitutional right have always found themselves in the minority. In PUCL vs Union of India, Justice J. Reddi held that the right to vote exists because of a constitutional mandate; hence, it cannot be viewed merely as a statutory right. In 2012, Justice J. Chelameswar observed that certain constitutional provisions — Article 326 providing for adult suffrage, Article 325 enabling an anti-discrimination clause with respect to the general electoral roll for every constituency and Articles 81 & 170 permitting direct election to the Lok Sabha and legislative assemblies — are sources of the right to elect. Cumulatively, they vest a right in all citizens (18 and above) to participate in the electoral process, subject to limitations as may be imposed by law.

African nations wary of China's soft loan trap

Witnessing the living example of Sri Lanka's economic crisis, African countries, which are caught in China's soft loan trap, are fearing that Beijing won't bail them out, Pardafas.com reported.

China's offer to ease Sri Lanka's financial woes with a two-year moratorium on its debt repayments has shocked Sri Lanka and the global community with financial experts stating that the debt relief offered by China to Sri Lanka still falls short of the overall burden on the country. The Export-Import Bank of China has offered to ease Sri Lanka's financial woes with a two-year moratorium on its debt repayments, according to a reviewed letter.

The economic meltdown and toppling of the Rajapaksa family regime in Sri Lanka has infused fear among South Africa countries.

According to Sri Lanka-based Daily Financial Times, experts and analysts opined that EXIM Bank's outstanding debt is only 4,023 million US dollars whereas Sri Lanka owes a further 3,000 million US dollars to China including 2,950 million US dollars to China Development Bank (CDB).

This moratorium would enable Sri Lanka to seek a 2.9 billion US dollars loan from the International Monetary



Fund, the Export-Import Bank of China said. China's 2-year moratorium on debt payments is not in parity with IMF's debt sustainability analysis of Sri Lanka with a 10-year debt moratorium and restructuring period of 15 years. Chinese EXIM banks have expressed their willingness to offer a 2-year debt moratorium. This would spell further economic pain for the Island nation.

According to analysts, "Ideally China, if it wants to live up to what it claims to be to Sri Lanka, it should give a broader expression of support in terms of debt relief." Others opined that Sri Lan-

ka will have to deal separately with CDB since it is categorized under "Commercial" creditors. The Export-Import Bank of China has offered to ease Sri Lanka's financial woes with a two-year moratorium on its debt repayments, according to a reviewed letter.

China's efforts to take advantage of its Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) to widen its economic and geopolitical clout has put at risk the already burdening yet developing countries having unsustainable debt by increasing their dependency on Communist China. The media reports revealed that South

Africa countries are worried about a vicious cycle of downgrades by the rating agencies, and rising trade imbalances.

Sri Lanka owes at least 7 billion US dollars to China in debt including loans from the Chinese Development Bank with the numbers reaching another level if private debt is also included. The Chinese high interest money was used to build unsustainable white elephant projects all over the country including Hambantota port, Mattala Rajapaksa International Airport and Norocholai power station. The economic crisis in Sri Lanka is a lesson to Nepal,

Bangladesh, Maldives and Myanmar and many African countries which have often fallen into Beijing's debt trap. China's efforts to take advantage of its Belt and Road Initiative (BRI) to widen its economic and geopolitical clout has put at risk the already burdening yet developing countries having unsustainable debt by increasing their dependency on Communist China.

China is a major African trade partner and from 2012 to 2017, Chinese loans to countries in sub-Saharan Africa grew tenfold to more than USD 10bn per year. From 2012 to 2017, Chinese loans to countries in sub-Saharan Africa grew tenfold to more than \$10bn per year, it reported.

London-based international affairs policy institute Chatham House stated that 22 low-income African countries are either already in debt distress or at high risk of debt distress.

Chatham House in its recent report said that Africa's total external debt increased more than fivefold between 2000 and 2020 to US\$696 billion - with Chinese lenders accounting for 12 per cent. "China did not cause African debt distress in most cases, but it is key to finding a solution," it said. An estimated 20 percent of African govern-

ments' external debt is owed to China, according to the Jubilee Debt Campaign, a charity that wants the debts of developing countries to be written off. Around 40 percent of African countries are in debt distress compared with 2013, when 20 percent of African countries were at high risk of debt distress, World Finance reported.

Meanwhile, China has refuted accusations that its loans to African countries have created a "debt trap", saying multilateral lenders and commercial creditors should carry the biggest blame for Africa's debt troubles. Foreign Minister Qin Gang recently said that China's projects and cooperation in Africa have contributed to the development of Africa and the improvement of people's livelihood.

In Africa, Ghana is facing debt troubles and has defaulted on its loan obligations, while Kenya plans to renegotiate the US\$5 billion in Chinese loans that it took to build a railway.

Nairobi has asked China Exim Bank to extend the maturity period from 20 years to up to 50 years. Zambia, which in 2020 became the first African nation to default on loans, is renegotiating loan terms for its foreign debt, including borrowings from China.

David Malpass to step down as World Bank President

World Bank President David Malpass on Wednesday announced that he will resign before the end of his term, reported CNN.

"It has been an enormous honor and privilege to serve as President of the world's premier development institution," Malpass said in a statement. "With developing countries facing unprecedented crises, I'm proud that the Bank Group has responded with speed, scale, innovation, and impact."

Malpass will leave his position on June 30, the end of the World Bank's fiscal year, after serving more than four years in the role, said the World Bank.

The World Bank, a group of 187 nations, lends money to developing countries to help reduce poverty. Former US President Donald Trump appointed Malpass as World Bank chief in 2019 for a five-year period. As the largest shareholder, the United States traditionally appoints its president.

During Malpass' tenure, the organization re-



sponded to multiple crises, including a global pandemic and Russia's war in Ukraine. The World Bank said Malpass implemented record surges in finances in response to both. He also focused on policies to increase economic growth, reduce government debt burdens, and help reduce poverty.

But his tenure has been controversial, reported CNN.

Malpass' exit comes months after calls grew for him to step down after he declined to acknowledge the scientific consensus that fossil fuels were warming the planet.

Malpass faced criticism from climate activists in September after he refused to confirm during a climate panel whether he accepted the scientific consensus that burning fossil fuels were dangerously warming the planet, reported CNN.

Meanwhile, Treasury Secretary Janet Yellen thanked Malpass for his service and said, "While we all must continue to raise our collective ambitions in the fight against climate change, during President Malpass' tenure the World Bank has made important recent advances in this area."

Top United States lawmaker Chuck Schumer expected to visit India

US Senate Majority Leader Chuck Schumer is expected to visit India with a high-profile delegation of Senate Democrats for meetings with the Indian leadership. The details of his visit are being worked out, sources familiar with the deliberations told a news agency.

An official said Democrat Senator Schumer's office is eyeing his travel to India as early as next week and the top lawmaker will be visiting multiple countries. The Senator's trip to India is not currently on Schumer's public itinerary and comes at a time when US-India relations are at a high point. Schumer's office didn't respond to request for a comment.

"This high-profile visit will spread across several countries including India. Schumer and the delegation are expected to stay more than a day or two and will also visit other cities apart from New Delhi," a senior official told. Apart from the political engagements, Schumer is also expected to meet with some Indian business leaders.

"This visit is a personal visit but it certainly will accelerate the steady upward momentum between the two democracies using strategic partnership, defence, trade and diaspora," the official further added.

Earlier, had reported on the US Department of State is looking at the first week of March for a possible visit by Secretary of State Antony Blinken and meetings in New Delhi, which would be a run-up to US Pres-

ident Joe Biden's meeting with leaders of the Quadrilateral Security Dialogue, commonly known as the Quad. Apart from this US Commerce Secretary Gina Raimondo is scheduled to travel to India in March to co-chair the US-India CEO Forum and US-India Commercial Dialogue meetings with her

Indian counterpart Commerce and Industry Minister Piyush Goyal. On January 31, National Security Advisors and other agency heads from the United States and India met in Washington, DC for the inaugural meeting of the initiative on Critical and Emerging Technology, which allows the US to partner with a country looking to compete with China's technological advances. On Tuesday, the White House announced that Air India has agreed to a historic purchase of airplanes from Boeing. A phone call between US President Joe Biden with PM Narendra Modi took place following the "landmark announcement."

According to a statement by the PMO, the two leaders expressed satisfaction at the deepening of the India-US. Comprehensive Global Strategic Partnership, which has resulted in robust growth in all domains. They also expressed a keen desire to strengthen bilateral cooperation in space, semi-conductors, supply chains and defence co-production.

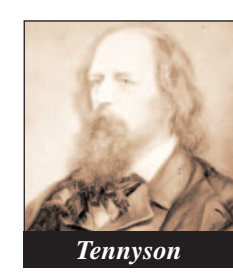

During this, special committees of the Legislative Assembly will study the budget proposal. This unique experiment of its kind has been started in Haryana. These decisions were taken in the meeting of the Business Advisory Committee (BAC) held at the Legislative Assembly Secretariat on Thursday. Before this, a meeting was also held regarding security arrangements.

In the BAC meeting headed by Vidhan Sabha Speaker Gian Chand Gupta, Chief Minister Manohar Lal, Deputy Chief Minister Dushyant Chautala, Parliamentary Affairs Minister Kanwar Pal, Home Minister Anil Vij, Deputy Speaker of the Legislative Assembly Ranbir Gangwa were present. Congress



MLA Bharat Bhushan Batra attended the meeting as the representative of the Leader of Opposition Bhupinder Singh Hooda who is recovering from his illness.

Talking to reporters after the meeting, Vidhan Sabha Speaker Gian Chand Gupta said that the Haryana Vidhan Sabha is starting new traditions from this budget session. The Business Advisory Committee (BAC) decided that the session would begin on February 20 with the Governor's address. After this, there will be a discussion on this address in the House on February 21 and 22. The Chief Minister will give his answer on this only on February 22. The budget will be presented the next day on February 23.

There will be a session break from 24 February to 16 March. During this, committees of legislators will be constituted for detailed study on the budget. These committees will study thoroughly and give their suggestions to the Chief Minister. There will be a comprehensive discussion on the budget on March 17. March 18 and 19 are state holidays. On March 20 and 21, there will be discussion only on the budget. The Chief Minister will give a detailed answer on this only on March 21. March 22 has been fixed as the day for legislative business.

Significantly, to make the budget session effective, the Speaker Gian Chand Gupta has made elaborate arrangements. In

this connection, setting a new tradition, he has started calling the meeting of the Business Advisory Committee (BAC) several days before the commencement of the session. Earlier this meeting was usually held on the first day of the session itself. Vidhan Sabha Speaker Gian Chand Gupta said that 328 starred questions from 51 MLAs and 184 unstarred questions from 20 MLAs have been received by the Vidhan Sabha Secretariat for the budget session. The draw for the first 3 days of the session has been done. Along with this, 30 calling attention notices, 2 adjournment motions, 2 private motions, 2 short duration motions have also been received from the MLAs.

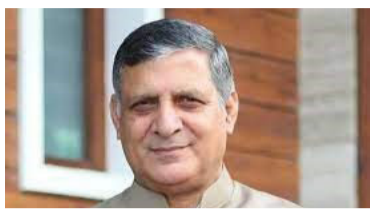
2 head constables suspended
