### **Jalandhar: 3** die, 2 injured after car collides with E-rickshaw

JALANDHAR: Three people died and two were injured when an Audi car collided with an e-rickshaw near Vidhipur railway crossing on Jalandhar-Amritsar highway on Tuesday night in the district.SHO Jatinder Singh said on Wednesday that the deceased have been identified as Paramiit Singh Pamma Jagdish Chander and Pankaj. Both the injured were taken to the hospital, where they are undergoing treatment. The driver of the Audi car fled the scene and their identity is yet to be identified. Police said the accident occurred when a speeding Audi car hit an e-rickshaw running on the highway and collided with a divider. In this accident, the rickshaw was badly crushed.

#### **ED** issues fifth summon to **Arvind Kejriwal**

**NEW DELHI:** The Enforcement Directorate ( ED) on Wednesday issued fresh summons to Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal in connection with the Delhi excise policy case. This is the fifth summon to the Aam Aadmi Party chief to join the investigation on Feb 02, as per sources. The AAP chief has previously skipped four summons from the anti-corruption agency. The fourth summon, issued to Kejriwal on January 13, asked him to depose before the central probe agency on January 18.

#### **HC** issues notices to UT admin, presiding officer over Chandigarh Mayoral polls

CHANDIGARH: The Punjab and Haryana High Court on Wednesday refused to grant any interim relief on the AAP's petition seeking fresh mayoral polls, and asked the Chandigarh administration to give their response within three weeks. The Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) has sought the setting aside of Tuesday's election, alleging tampering of ballot papers, and fresh elections under the supervision of a retired High Court judge. The BJP had swept Chandigarh mayoral polls, retaining all three posts, in a setback to the Congress-AAP alliance which has alleged tampering with ballot papers by the presiding officer.

## Hindus allowed to worship in Varanasi's Gyanvapi Mosque AGENCY NEW DELHI, JAN 31

Hindu petitioners can worship inside the previously sealed basement - the 'Vyas ka tekhana' area - of the Gyanvapi mosque complex in Varanasi, a city court ruled Wednesday. The judge also said arrangements, including removal of barricades, are to be completed in a week. The court further said prayers should be conducted by priests from the Kashi Vishwanath Temple.
"Hindu side allowed to offer

prayers... district administration will have to make arrangements in seven days. Everyone will have the right to pray there," Vishnu Shankar Jain, the lawyer for the four Hindu women petitioners in this case, said.

The mosque committee is expected to challenge this order in a higher court. The mosque has four 'tekhana', or cellar, in the basement. One is still in the possession of a family of priests that used to live there. The family had argued that, as hereditary priests, they be allowed to

enter the structure and perform pujas. According to the petition, the priest, Somnath Vyas, used to perform prayers till 1993 when the cellar was closed.

It had earlier been claimed debris from statues of Hindu gods was found during a survey of the area. It had also been claimed parts of a pre-existing



structure - ruled as a temple by the ASI report - including pillars, were used in building the mosque.

Today's order comes a day after the four Hindu women approached the Supreme Court asking for excavation and scientific survey of a 'shivling' reportedly found inside the sealed 'wazukhana' area of the mosque complex.

This area had been sealed in 2022 following a Supreme Court order, but the Hindu side has now asked the court for the ASI, or Archaeological Survey of India, to carry out another survey of the 'wazukhana' area without harming the

Last month, in a crucial judgement, the Allahabad High Court had rejected all petitions by the mosque committee that had challenged civil suits seeking restoration of the temple at the site.

The overall case relates to the Gyanvapi mosque, located adjacent to the iconic Kashi Vishwanath Temple.

The High Court had heard, and rejected petitions, including two from the Uttar Pradesh Sunni Central Waqf Board, challenging the maintainability of a 1991 case before a Varanasi court.

The 1991 suit - filed on behalf of the Adi Vishveswar Virajman deity - sought control of the disputed premises.



## Heavyrain, snowfall likely over North in next 24 hours: IMD

AGENCY NEW DELHI, JAN 31

The India Meteorological Department (IMD) on Wednesday predicted that parts of North India are expected to witness heavy rainfall and snowfall during the next 24

"Wet spell over western Himalayan region and over adjoining plains likely to continue till February 4 with peak intensity on January 31 and February 1," the IMD said.

According to IMD, "Isolated heavy rainfall and snowfall is likely over Kashmir valley, Himachal Pradesh on January 31 and February 1 and over Uttarakhand on February 1.

"Light or moderate scattered to fairly widespread rainfall very



likely over Punjab, Chandigarh, Haryana, Delhi and isolated to scattered rainfall over Uttar Pradesh, East Rajasthan during January 31 and February 1 Light isolated rainfall very

likely over the above regions on 3 and 4 February," it said.
Isolated hailstorms are also likely over Punjab, and Haryana on January 31 and over Uttara-

khand on January 31 and February 1, the IMD said. The weather department further said that the strong and chilly surface winds gusting to 30-40 kmph are very likely to prevail over Punjab, Haryana, Chandigarh and Delhi on January 31 and Feb-

ruary 1.

Arunachal Pradesh during the next 7 days (31st January to 06th February)," it said. "Isolated to scattered rainfall

"Isolated heavy rainfall or snowfall is also likely over Arunachal Pradesh on February " it said. Isolated hailstorm is likely over Arunachal Pradesh on January 31 and February 1, over Sub-Himalayan West Bengal and Sikkim on Ĵanuary 31 and February 2, the IMD added. The IMD further said that significant changes in minimum temperatures and cold wave conditions are unlikely over several parts of the country during the next 5 days.

During the Farewel members of the management committee, dignitaries, principals from various colleges and staff-members praised Dr. Bajpai, each in his/her own way.







"I urge the banks to extend their active support in providing loans for proper implementation of these schemes so that farmers, horticulturists and

youth can avail maximum

As per RBI report none of the districts of the state falls in the category of 'credit deficient' districts. Although the credit flow in these districts is normal, the loan to deposit ratio of the state is 36.39 percent. occur in the next 24 hours and then again over the weekend.

The higher reaches of the valley, including the ski resort of Gulmarg in north Kashmir's Baramulla district, received snowfall, and the snow depth was 26 cm this morning.

The snowfall has been

reported from the upper reaches Ganderbal, Kupwara, Anantnag, Shopian, and Kulgam districts of Kashmir. Due to intermittent light to moderate snow over the past three days over higher reaches, significant snow



has accumulated over the higher reaches of the North and Northwestern parts of Kashmir Division, which has led to the temporary closure of roads in the higher reaches and important passes. The historic Mughal Road connecting south Kashmir's Shopian district with Poonch in the Pir Panjal area of Jammu

Province remained closed due to heavy snowfall. The Srinagar-Leh Highway is also closed. The valley witnessed a prolonged dry spell this winter, with no snowfall in the plains during the 40-day Chillai Kalan—the harshest phase of winter-that ended Tuesday. MeT said there is possibility of light to moderate rain or snow at

afternoon and evening onwards till Thursday morning and forenoon, with chances of heavy snowfall over a few higher reaches of North, Northwestern, and South Kashmir. "Few lower reaches and plains of the North, Northwestern, and South Kashmir regions may receive snowfall depths of 6-8 inches, while plains of Central Kashmir may receive 2-4 inches during tonight and tomorrow morning," the MeT said. Light to moderate rain or snow will continue until February 4. The weather is likely to remain dry from February 5–12. Meanwhile, there was an improvement in the nighttime across temperature Kashmir valley. The summer capital, Srinagar, recorded a low of 2.2 degrees Celsius, against 0.8 degrees Celsius on the previous night.

### **Hurdles in semiconductor race**

ndia's ambitious goal to emerge as a global semiconductor hub has hit hurdles, raising questions over the efficacy of the country's ■ incentive policy. However, these hurdles are not unsurmountable There is a need for a mid-term evaluation of the Design Linked Incentive (DIL) scheme, which is part of the Semiconductor Mission. Despite setting a target of supporting 100 startups over five years, only seven have been approved, prompting calls for a candid reassessment and revamping of the scheme. India aspires to become a global semiconductor hub, but the chip shortage has underscored weaknesses in the supply chain, emphasising the urgency of enhancing domestic manufacturing capacity. While the DLI scheme aims to provide access to design infrastructure and financial subsidies, the uptake has been disappointing. Restrictions on the extent of foreign capital in semiconductor startups pose a significant barrier. Besides, the absence of a mature startup ecosystem for hardware products in India reduces investor risk appetite. Since the semiconductor industry is highly competitive, India would need to compete with countries which have well-established chip manufacturing industries. Gaining a competitive edge and attracting global investments in the face of such competition pose a significant challenge. Building semiconductors domestically is important for India's vision to emerge as an electronics manufacturing hub and eventually reduce its imports from foreign countries especially China, which remains the number one destination for the sector. The global chip supply chain is undergoing massive geopolitical pressure as the US and its allies are trying to rein in their dependence on Chinese semiconductor players and its markets.

Though India traditionally had a strong base for the semiconductor design industry, hardware manufacturing has remained elusive. Over the last two decades, several consortiums made multiple attempts at chip making but things never worked out. The global chips market is expected to grow to \$1 trillion by 2030. Resource-intensive, it requires highly skilled workers and is already facing a competence gap. Besides the US and Japan. India should also explore collaboration opportunities with other countries such as Taiwan and South Korea to promote domestic manufacturing and reduce import dependency. In the current geopolitical scenario, trusted sources of semiconductors and displays hold strategic importance and are key to the security of critical information infrastructure. As India embarks on its silicon journey, semiconductor job openings are set to rise. With its talent pool, India needs to leverage the opportunity and find ways to provide hands-on and industry-relevant training to engineering students. Taiwan provides a cue. Its success is attributed to public-private partnerships that focus on training and certification. As part of the \$10 billion plan, unveiled by the Centre over two years ago, production-linked and design-linked incentives are being offered to companies to establish chip and display industries. Any country that does not learn to make semiconductors wil lag behind in the days to come

## **Tomatoes of tomorrow**

sraeli researchers have successfully utilised genetic editing technology to cultivate tomato varieties that consume less water as they grow without compromising on yield.

This innovation holds significant promise for sustainable agriculture and the pressing need for crops that can thrive in the face of global warming

The researchers, led by Professor Shaul Yalovsky and Dr. Nir Sade of Tel Aviv University focused on the challenge posed by the link between "water transpiration" and carbon dioxide uptake in plants. Water transpiration is the process of water evaporating from a plant's stem, leaves or flowers.

Much of this evaporation takes place through specialized leaf openings called stomata. During drought conditions, plants respond by closing their stomata to reduce water loss. However, this action also decreases the plant's ability to absorb carbon dioxide, a key element in its photosynthesis and sugar production.

To address this issue, the researchers used CRISPR genetic editing technology to target a gene known as ROP9. By eliminating ROP9, the researchers were able to induce a partial stomata closure -particularly at midday, when plants have their highest transpiration rates. However, in the morning and afternoon, when transpiration rates are lower, the stomata remained open, allowing the plants to absorb sufficient carbon dioxide and



maintain sugar production.

Armed with this knowledge, the researchers then conducted an extensive field experiment involving hundreds of plants to assess the impact of the modified ROP9 on

Surprisingly, the results showed that while the ROP9-modified plants lost less water during transpiration, there was no adverse effect on photosynthesis, crop quantity, or

quality, including the sugar content in the fruits

Moreover, the study led to the discovery of an unexpected mechanism for regulating the opening and closing of the stomata. The findings related to the level of oxidizing substances, known as reactive oxygen species, in the stomata. This discovery has practical implications for crop development, the researchers said.

"There is great similarity between the ROP9 in tomatoes and ROP proteins found in other crop plants such as pepper, eggplant, and wheat. Therefore, the discoveries detailed in our article could form the basis for the development of additional crop plants with enhanced water use efficiency, and for a deeper understanding of the mechanisms behind stomatal opening and

closing," said Dr. Sade.

The findings were recently published in the peer-reviewed scientific journal, PNAS.

As global demand for waterconserving crops intensifies, the findings could pave the way for similar innovations in other essential food crops, offering hope for a more resilient and resource-efficient future in agriculture, the researcher

## Study discovers resin element effective against coronaviruses

esearchers are actively creating anti-viral surfaces to help prevent the spread of A recent study discovered that a resin element is highly effective against coronaviruses and significantly

reduces their infectivity on plastic surfaces.



Viruses may remain on solid surfaces for extended periods of time, increasing the risk of infection. Varpu Marjomaki, a Professor of Cell and Molecular Biology at the University of Jyvaskyla, and his team are looking at how different surfaces and materials can help to slow the development of viral illnesses coronaviruses can survive on different surfaces when

For example, they are investigating how long humidity and temperature vary.

This information would be of direct benefit to both consumers and industry. Antiviral functionality could be used, for example, in restaurants, kindergartens, public transport and stores, on different surfaces, where

viruses can potentially stay infective for a long time and spread easily, said Professor Varpu Marjomaki from the University of Jyvaskyla. The researchers of the Nanoscience Center of the

University of Jyvaskyla studied resin-embedded plastic surfaces against both the seasonal human coronavirus and the SARS-CoV-2 virus.

In our recent study, we found that the viruses stayed infective for more than two days on plastic surfaces that were not treated at all In contrast, a plastic surface containing resin showed good antiviral activity within fifteen minutes of contact and excellent efficacy after thirty minutes. Plastic treated with resin is therefore a promising candidate for an antiviral surface, said Marjomaki.

The research is part of the BIOPROT project (Development of bio-based and antimicrobia materials and use as protective equipment) funded by Business Finland and has been done in collaboration with the Finnish company Premix Oy. The project aims to study existing and develop new antiviral solutions in cooperation with companies such as Premix Ov. This will help to create new products for future pandemics and epidemics, said Mariomaki. The BIOPROT project involves a total of six universities research institutes and several companies. The project is coordinated by LUT University and aims to develop new, sustainable and safe material solutions that will be used in the fight against

infections, with a particular focus on respiratory and

Il over the world every year February 2nd is celebrated as World Wetlands Day'. Given the special importance of wetlands in the environment, Wetlands Day is celebrated to raise global awareness of the important role of wetlands for people and our planet.

Wetlands act as kidneys in nature. Impurities in water are separated and wetlands play an important role in maintaining balance in nature. A wetland is a place where the soil is marshy, where water always stands on the ground, whether naturally occurring or the flow of water is blocked by permanent or temporary dams. A wetland is always flooded with water. In wetlands The amount of

Migratory birds are our guests at these wetlands, which migrate from foreign countries and come in large numbers every year. The wetlands provide habitat for many plants, birds, insects, snails, fish, mammals etc. Also, large ones and local wetlands, such as small ponds. Small wetlands are of national and big wetlands are of international fame. Wetlands are rich in biological diversity. Many types of rare plants and animals are found only in water body ecosystems. Wetlands also help in recharging the ground water table.

Punjab has six wetlands of international fame, which have the status of Ramsar wetlands. They are Harike wetland, Ropar wetland, Kanjali wetland, Keshopur-Miani wetland. Beas conservation reserve wetland, Nangal wetland. What is Ramsar wetland? Ramsar is a city in

Where on February 2, 1971, a meeting was organized for the conservation and identification of wetlands and waterfowl. In this meeting, the expansion and importance of wetlands was discussed at the international level. Certain criteria have been set for recognition. Out of which, if any watershed meets even one of the criteria, it is given the status of a Ramsar watershed

Harike Wetland is a man-made wetland. It came into existence in 1952, when a dam was built at the confluence of the Sutlei and Beas rivers. It is 41 square km. It was given the status of a Ramsar wetland in

1990. Many rare species of plants and animals are found here. As soon as winter begins, migratory birds from Russia, Siberia, Tibet and other countries start coming here. There are many migratory birds including spoon bill, greylag geese, shoveler, pintail, bar headed geese, cormorant, darter bird and many other migratory birds come here.

Every year many bird lovers visit Harike wetland for their study and photography. Kanjali wetland is spread over 183 hectares. Many species of birds and fish are found here. Some species of migratory birds are also found here. The area of Ropar wetland is 1365 hectares. This wetland is surrounded by Shivalik hills. There are 318 species of birds and 55 species of fish. are found There are. Rare creatures like pangolin and saraal are also found here. This wetland was given the status of

Ramsar wetland at the national level in 1992 and at the international level in 2002.

Keshopur-Miani Wetland is spread over 850 acres. It is five kilometers away from Gurdaspur city. It was given the status of Ramsar Wetland in 2019. Every year, a large number of migratory birds come here from Russia, China, Tibet, Siberia come from Afghanistan after planning a journey of thousands of kilometers. More than 72 species of birds are found here. An interpretation center has also been built here for bird lovers.

Beas Conservation Reserve wetland is spread over 65 square kilometers. This wetland was given the status of Ramsar wetland in 2019. More than 500 species of birds, more than 90 species of fish are found here. A rare species of dolphin is also found here. 47 seals have also been released in this wetland. Nangal

Wetland is spread over 1.16 square kilometers. It is located near Nangal city. Many species of plants and animals are found here. 9 species of mammals, 35 species of fish and 154

species of birds are found here Wetlands are under threat due to urbanization, industrialization and the greedy behavior of man. The depth of wetlands is decreasing due to silt carried by rainwater. Watercress or watercress is one such aquatic plant, which spreads very fast and is a threat to wetlands. Polluted water due to industrial development is causing damage to wetlands.

Yes. Let's save the wetlands! Let's make the common people aware for their conservation so that this habitat of animals, migratory birds and the kidneys of nature can be saved.




