





Dancing videos of Modi, Mahatma Gandhi posted on social media; case filed

BALLIA (UP): An FIR has been registered against unidentified persons for allegedly posting an "objectionable" video of Mahatma Gandhi, Prime Minister Narendra Modi and Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath on social media. The matter was highlighted by Neha Singh Rathore from her X account @imrowdy_rathore on Tuesday. "The popular and successful Chief Minister of Uttar Pradesh Yogi Adityanath Ji Maharaj has made many efforts for the honour and security and empowerment of women of his state. How some cheap street reeler are using Yogi Ji for a few views."

Sensex settles above record 85,000 level

MUMBAI: Benchmark Sensex closed above the 85,000 level for the first time while Nifty settled at a fresh lifetime high on Wednesday as fog-end buying in banking and power shares helped stock markets recoup early losses. After a see-saw trade during the day, the 30-share BSE Sensex rose by 255.83 points or 0.30 per cent to settle at an all-time high of 85,169.87. During the day, it surged 333.38 points or 0.39 per cent to hit a record intra-day peak of 85,247.42. The NSE Nifty climbed 63.75 points or 0.25 per cent to close at a record high of 26,004.15.

Uttarakhand: 13 people rescued after vehicle crashed near Gaurikund

RUDRAPRAYAG : State Disaster Rescue Force (SDRF) along with Uttarakhand police in a joint operation rescued 13 people after a vehicle crashed near Gaurikund on Shri Kedarnath Yatra route in Uttarakhand's Rudraprayag on Wednesday. After receiving the information that a vehicle had crashed into a ditch on Gaurikund Road, the SDRF team, under the leadership of Inspector Karna Singh, immediately rushed to the spot. The SDRF rescue team reached the spot and conducted a joint rescue operation with the district police and rescued 13 people, including 1 child, from the vehicle that crashed into the ditch. One person is missing, who is being searched by the SDRF team.

Voting for Congress means putting Haryana's stability, development at stake: PM

Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Wednesday launched a blistering attack on the Congress, saying if the party comes to power even by mistake, it will destroy the state.

Voting for the Congress means putting Haryana's stability and development at stake, he said while addressing a poll rally in Gohana in this district for the October 5 Assembly polls.

Modi asserted that as the voting day draws near in Haryana, support for the BJP is growing.

He said under the BJP government, Haryana has made place among top states in industry and agriculture sectors.

"Today, the world's biggest companies are interested in setting up factories in India, he said, adding "when industrialisation increases, its biggest benefit goes to poor, farmers and Dalits".

Modi said B R Ambedkar believed that in empowerment of Dalits, industry plays a big role.

Criticizing the Congress party for sidelining marginalized communities in the state, PM Modi said, "Congress has always kept SC/ST/OBC away from participation. It was Baba Saheb Ambedkar who gave reservation to Dalits, otherwise like OBC, Dalits would also have to wait for Congress' defeat for reservation. Whenever Congress has been away from the government, the poor, SC/ST/OBC



have got their rights. Whenever Congress has been in the government, it has snatched the rights of Dalits and backward classes".

"There is no party more corrupt than the Congress. You also know that wherever Congress got the chance, wherever it set foot, corruption and nepotism are certain there. It is Congress that creates and nurtures corruption in the Indian government system," he further added. Shedding light on the agricultural reforms in the state under the BJP regime, the Prime Minister said that the party has always worked to uplift the farmers. "The BJP government in Haryana has decided to give MSP for 24 crops, but when the Congress was here, it hated

to buy crops on MSP. This is the truth of the Congress party which the farmers need to learn. The BJP government is continuously taking decisions in the benefit of the farmers," PM Modi said. The Prime Minister also reflected on the economic development and infrastructure development in the state, highlighting better connectivity and construction of highways. "Today, the big companies of the world are eager to invest in India and set up their factories here. Just think, when such big companies invest in India, my Haryana, the youth and the farmers here will benefit a lot. The public of Haryana knows the importance of double engine government, therefore it chooses the same government both in the centre and the state," PM Modi said.

Panchayat elections in Pb to be held on 15th Oct

State Election Commission has announced the Election Schedule for the conduct of the general Gram Panchayat Elections, in accordance with the Notification dated 19.9.2024 issued under s. 209 of the Punjab Panchayati Raj Act, 1994 by the Department of Rural Development & Panchayats.

Addressing the press conference, Punjab State Election Commissioner Raj Kamal Chaudhuri said that with the announcement of the Election Schedule, the Model Code of Conduct for Gram Panchayat Elections for the guidance of candidates and State has come into force with immediate effect, which will remain in force till the completion of the electoral process.

He further informed that as per the election schedule, the period for filing of nominations by candidates will commence from 27th September, 2024 (Friday) between 11 a.m. to 3 p.m. in the offices of the concerned Returning Officers. The last date for filing nominations will be 04.10.2024 (Friday). He added that no nominations will be accepted

on 28.09.2024 being a public holiday under Negotiable Instruments Act. Scrutiny of the Nomination papers would take place on 05.10.2024 (Saturday). The last date for withdrawal of Nominations is 07.10.2024 (Monday) upto 03:00 p.m.

Sharing more details, he revealed that the poll will be held on 15.10.2024 (Tuesday)



from 08.00 a.m. to 04.00 p.m. through the use of Ballot Boxes. The polled votes will be counted on the same day at the polling station itself, after the completion of polling of votes.

Furthermore, he added that Polling, wherever required, would be held for 13,237 Sarpanches and 83,437 Panches. Total electorate consists of 1,33,97,922 registered voters consisting of 70,51,722 Males, 63,46,008 Females, and 192 others.

Rahul Gandhi lashes out at BJP in Jammu rally

JAMMU: Stepping up his attack on the BJP-led central government, Congress MP and Lok Sabha LoP Rahul Gandhi on Wednesday said that they snatched statehood of Jammu and Kashmir so that it can be governed by outsiders.

Rahul Gandhi said that for the first time in history, a state was downgraded into a 'union territory' and injustice was served to the people of the territory.

"In the history of India, after 1947 several union territories were turned into states. States

were divided - Telangana was formed out of Andhra Pradesh, Jharkhand was formed out of Bihar, Chhattisgarh was carved out of Madhya Pradesh. But for the first time after independence, a state was turned into a union territory. This was done to Jammu & Kashmir. This is an injustice to you. Your democratic rights have been snatched away from you. Today Jammu and Kashmir, is not run by the people of Jammu and Kashmir, it is run by the people of other states," said Rahul Gandhi.

Around 57 pc voter turn out in J-K 2nd phase

A voter turnout of 57 percent was recorded till 5pm in the second phase of polling in six districts of the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir, according to the Election Commission of India. reasi led the individual districts with a polling percentage of 63.91%. Poonch recorded 61.45%, Rajouri recorded 58.95%, Budgam 49.44%, Ganderbal 61.45% and Srinagar 22.62%.

Voting for the second phase of Assembly elections in Jammu and Kashmir began at

7 am on Wednesday. Over 25 lakh eligible voters will seal the fate of 239 candidates across 26 constituencies in six districts of the Union Territory. In this phase, 25,78,099 lakh voters are eligible to cast their ballot, comprising 13,12,730 lakh male voters, 12,65,316 lakh female voters and 53 third-gender voters.

Kejriwal writes to RSS chief Bhagwat on BJP's politics, PM's actions

AAP supremo Arvind Kejriwal wrote to RSS chief Mohan Bhagwat on Wednesday, seeking answers to five questions on the BJP's politics and Prime Minister Narendra Modi's actions.

Expressing concern, Kejriwal said the direction in which the Bharatiya Janata Party-led Centre is taking the country as well as its politics are harmful for India.

"If this continues, our country and democracy will be finished," he said in the letter to Bhagwat.

Kejriwal asked, "You had



a law that leaders will retire after 75 years... Amit Shah is saying that this rule will not apply to Modi. What applied to Advani ji, why will it not apply to Modi ji?"

He also raised a question regarding JP Nadda's statement about the RSS saying, "JP Nadda said during the Lok Sabha elections that he does not need RSS. Has the son

grown so much that he has started showing his might to his mother? Didn't you feel sad when he said this?"

He further alleged that the BJP is using ED, CBI for

threatening opposition parties and put the emphasis on the need for ethical governance and political stability.

"Parties are being broken by threatening ED, CBI, governments are being toppled, is this right? Does RSS accept this?" Kejriwal asked in his letter.

Arvind Kejriwal is currently out of jail on bail in connection to Excise Policy Scam. The case alleges multiple irregularities in the formation and implementation of the Delhi excise policy (2021-22) by the Central Bureau of Investigation. The policy was withdrawn after allegations of corruption.

Two AAP councillors join BJP in Delhi

Kangana Ranaut withdraws remarks on farm laws

A day after the Bhartiya Janata party distanced itself from Kangana Ranaut's recent remarks on the farm laws, the actor-turned politician on Wednesday issued a public apology and expressed "regret" over her statement.

Mandi Lok Sabha MP Kangana Ranaut had suggested that the three farm laws that were repealed following prolonged farmer protests should be brought back.

The actor-turned-politician was quoted as saying, "I know this statement could be controversial, but the three farm laws should be brought

back. Farmers themselves should demand it."

After the BJP stated that her comments were "not authorized", Kangana retracted her remarks and issued an apology. She added that moving forward, she will ensure her views align with the party's stance rather than representing her personal opinions.

"When farmers laws were proposed, a lot of people came out in support of them, but with a lot of sensitivity, our Prime Minister retracted those laws, so it is the responsibility of all the workers of his party to respect his words. I will also have to keep one thing in mind that now I am not an artist but a BJP worker. My opinions



will not just be mine but will represent the party's stand. So if I have hurt anyone's sentiments with my thoughts, I regret it and take my words back," Kangana said in a self made video, posted on X.

This comes a day after BJP spokesperson Gaurav Bhatia in a statement on Tuesday, said the remarks are "personal statement" of Ranaut and doesn't depict BJP's view on farm bills.

"On the social media platforms, BJP MP Kangana Ranaut's statement on the farm bills that was withdrawn by central govt, is going viral. I want to make it clear that this statement is a personal statement of her," Bhatia said.

"Kangana Ranaut is not authorised to make such a statement on behalf of the BJP, and it doesn't depict the BJP's view on the farm bills. We disapprove of this statement," he added.

The Mandi MP has drawn ire over her remarks on farm laws. Punjab Congress President Amarinder Singh Raja criticised the actor, calling her "habitually controversial." "I think she is mentally unstable. Some people are accustomed to creating controversy, and the BJP benefits from her statements. She talks about farmers, Punjab, the Emergency, and Rahul Gandhi. There are other MPs who never make such remarks," the Congress leader said.

FIR against 4 for burning stubble

In the warm weather the entire administration has come into action mode after some incidents of stubble burning by farmers harvesting early crops came to light. To control stubble burning in the district, Deputy Commissioner Uttam Singh visited several villages of the district on Wednesday with a team of several officials of the administrative and agriculture departments. During this, the Deputy Commissioner ordered the concerned police station in-charge to register FIRs against farmer Indra Singh (one acre) of village Makhumajra, farmer Jaiprakash (two acres) of Baragon, farmer Gurnam Singh (one acre) of village Sangoha and farmer Jagjit Singh of the same village, who were found burning stubble in 4 acres. The Deputy Commissioner gave a strict warning to the farmers and said that stubble burning will not be tolerated under any circumstances. If any farmer violates these orders, not only will he be fined, but appropriate legal action will also be taken by registering an FIR. He appealed to the farmers to adopt crop residue management and



instead of burning the stubble, make it a source of their income. During his tour on Wednesday, the Deputy Commissioner went to villages Naval, Baragon, Makhumajra, Ramba, Sangoha and Sangohi of block Karnal and warned the farmers not to burn the stubble. Along with this, strict instructions were given to all the officers and employees on duty that no negligence should be done to prevent burning of stubble.

He said that the government has completely banned burning of stubble, so under no circumstances farmers should set fire to the stubble, rather

they should either dispose of it in the field itself or make bundles of stubble and sell them through various agricultural equipment being provided under the government's crop residue management scheme. This will give double benefit to the farmers and will also prevent the environment from getting polluted. On this occasion, ADC Yash Jaluka, Deputy Director of Agriculture and Farmers Welfare Department Dr. Wazir Singh, Tehsildar Karnal Krishna Singh, Agricultural Scientist Dr. Vijay Kaushik, Agriculture Department officials, District Fire Officer and Police Station Incharge were present.

Deputy Director of Agriculture Department Wazir Singh said that while the administration and agriculture department officials and field staff are already monitoring to completely stop the incidents of stubble burning in Karnal district, after some incidents came to light, Deputy Commissioner Uttam Singh has also issued orders to the clerical staff of the Agriculture Department to reach the field and stop the farmers from burning. It is worth noting that after the weather became hot for several days, incidents of stubble burning have been reported at many places in Karnal by farmers harvesting early paddy crops.

the Hans Foundation aims to provide free-of-cost dialysis facilities and significantly improve access to renal care across the state. He said that by utilizing ABHA ID compliance, any patient can access dialysis services at any centre across the state. In addition to free dialysis, all the essential medications will also be provided at free of cost, he said, while adding that the program adopts a holistic approach, addressing both the medical and financial challenges faced by kidney disease patients. "Initially, the dialysis centres have been established in eight government facilities benefitting thousands of needy patients,

while, the program plans to expand to all the government health facilities, ensuring accessible and quality healthcare for all," said Dr Balbir Singh.

He said that with the establishment of 872 Aam Aadmi Clinics Punjab's primary healthcare facilities have received a significant boost, paving the way for substantial decrease in kidney ailments in the coming years. He attributes the majority of kidney failures to high blood pressure and diabetes, emphasizing that these clinics and free availability of drugs have been instrumental in early diagnosis and treatment of these conditions.


Power supply to industries remains cheaper in state: CM

Chief Minister Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu said that Himachal Pradesh is committed to formulating industry-friendly policies to promote investment in the State. In a statement released here today, Sh. Sukhu said that the state government has rationalized the electricity subsidies being provided to industries. Himachal Pradesh still supplies power on cheaper rates to the industries as compared to the neighboring States.

He said that large industries with supply voltage ranging from 33 KV to 220 KV will be offered electricity at rates which are cheaper than the neighbouring States of Punjab, Haryana and Uttarakhand by more than one rupee per unit.

"This implies that industries in Himachal



Pradesh still enjoy a comparative advantage to neighboring States. There are only 159 industries in the State with supply voltage ranging from 33 KV to 220 KV," he added.

Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu said that in addition to the large industries with supply voltage ranging from 33 KV to 220 KV, there is another set of 2011 industries in the State with supply voltage of 11 KV and 22 KV.

For these industries also the price advantage of more than rupees one continues in

comparison to the neighbouring States. For helping these industries, the Government has in fact reduced the electricity duty from 16.5 percent to 10 percent. He said that the State Government is committed for the promotion of 31,298 small and medium industries in particular. Subsidy for these industries remains unchanged and the energy charges remain untouched.

The Chief Minister said that the rationalisation of electricity subsidies will not harm the interests of industries and reaffirmed the government's commitment to fostering industrial growth.

"These industries provide employment directly and indirectly to thousands of youth of the state and we are determined to support their continued growth and the State is grateful for their contributions," he stated.

HP School Education Board is preparing to make a big change in the pattern of examinations

Under this, a plan is being worked out to put 50 percent ability test i.e. Capability based MCQ questions in a few years after the academic session 2025-26, while only 50 percent will be written question papers in simple form. In the current academic session 2024-25, this percentage will be 20 percent in the final examinations to be held in March, after which the pattern will be changed gradually. Vishal Sharma, Secretary of Himachal Pradesh School Education Board, said that the School Education Board has started the process



under the National Education Policy-2020. In this, tips should also be provided to the education board and the teachers preparing the question papers by the experts of NCERT. For this, about half a dozen special workshops will also be organized at the state level. Earlier, changes have also been made by other big boards of the country ICSE-CBSE. Under this, in

the initial first phase in the state, 20 percent of the questions will be competency based in which multiple choice i.e. MCQs will be asked to the students of class 3rd, 5th, 8th, 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th to be held in March under the academic session 2024-25. This will help in testing the understanding of the subjects in the children instead of rote learning. In the coming three to four years, this level will be increased to 50 percent by the Board of Education. At the same time, the weightage of short answer/long answer questions with traditional exam pattern will be reduced from 80 percent to 50 percent.

Mirror speaks

A working paper on the relative economic performance of Indian states between 1960-61 and 2023-24 has reaffirmed a fact that the Mamata Banerjee government must take note of. Authored by Sanjeev Sanyal, member of the Economic Advisory Council to the Prime Minister, the paper has contended that while maritime states have outperformed other states, West Bengal, despite having a significant head start at the beginning of the study period, has been an exception. The first metric considered was Bengal's share in India's gross domestic product, calculated by dividing the gross state domestic product of Bengal by the sum of GSDP of all states.

The states' relative per capita incomes were also examined. If a state's per capita income was the same as that of the country, it had 100% per capita income relative to the national average. The time series data on these two metrics thrown up by the study revealed that Bengal experienced a continuous decline in its relative economic performance over several decades. Although Bengal's share was 10.5% to the national GDP in 1960-61, which made it the third-largest contributor, it dwindled to 5.6% by 2023-24, much below other states like Maharashtra, Gujarat, Tamil Nadu, Karnataka and Madhya Pradesh. The slide in terms of per capita income has been equally stark: from a relative income of 127.5% in 1960-61, it plummeted to 83.7% in 2023-24, falling below that of even traditionally laggard states like Rajasthan and Odisha.

These numbers drill holes into the claims that Amit Mitra — he steered Bengal's economy for a decade and is now a chief adviser to Ms Banerjee — has been making about Bengal's stellar show under the Trinamool Congress regime. They also highlight that Bengal has a lot to learn from the southern states, which outperformed others after the economic liberalisation of 1991, and collectively accounted for 30% of India's GDP. The working paper did not delve deep to analyse the reasons behind Bengal's fall from a position of pre-eminence. It did not offer any solutions for laggards like Punjab, another state characterised by a steady decline over years, either. The attempt was probably to hold a mirror to policy-makers in the states, especially those at the bottom, to prod them to ponder what went wrong and how a new beginning can be planned. The working paper reconfirmed another known fact; that states like Maharashtra and Gujarat have consistently been the powerhouse of the Indian economy.

India's role in combating synthetic drug threats

External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar highlighted India's role as co-chair of Working Group 1 in global efforts to combat the illicit manufacture and trafficking of synthetic drugs.

He was addressing the Summit for the Global Coalition to Address Synthetic Drug Threats on Tuesday (local time).

Taking to social media platform X, Jaishankar stated that India had faced a lot of challenges due to the nexus between terrorist organisations, narco-trafficking and cross-border rackets. "India's role as co-chair of Working Group 1, focused on preventing the illicit manufacture and trafficking of synthetic drugs, showcases our proactive stance. India has long been affected by the nexus between terrorist groups and narco-trafficking. Cross-border rackets smuggle drugs into our territory, with proceeds supporting terrorism," he said.

To bolster its efforts in enhancing co-operation in combating drug-related issues, the Foreign Minister said that India had signed 45 bilateral agreements and had established a regulatory framework for 27 precursor chemicals.

He also reiterated the India-US partnership has deepened in recent years on this issue and said that the recent conclusion of the bilateral Drug Framework and Memorandum of Understanding in Wilmington was a significant step in collaborative efforts between both countries.

"The deepening partnership between India and the United States must be recognised. Our Counter Narcotics Working Group has met four times, and the



conclusion recently of the bilateral Drug Framework and MoU at Wilmington is a notable step," Jaishankar said.

He further called for increased operational cooperation, intelligence sharing and enhanced law enforcement collaboration among nations to effectively address

the synthetic drug trade.

Jaishankar was joined by US President Joe Biden and US State Secretary Antony Blinken at the summit on the sidelines of the 79th United Nations General Assembly in New York. Following his address, Jaishankar held bilateral talks with

Spanish Foreign Minister Jose Manuel Albares and discussed on bilateral cooperation as well as on Ukraine and West Asia.

He also met Bolivian Foreign Minister Celinda Sosa Lunda as well as EU Commissioner Wopke Hoekstra.

US reaffirms commitment to Taiwan's self-defence amid rising tensions with China

The US has reiterated its commitment to continue supplying the island with essential military equipment and services to bolster its self-defence capabilities.

This assurance was reaffirmed at the annual US-Taiwan Defence Industry Conference, which commenced in Philadelphia on Sunday, showcasing the depth of defence cooperation between the two democracies, VOA News reported. The conference, organised by the US-Taiwan Business Council (USTBC), comes at a critical time as Taiwan faces increasing threats from China, which views the self-governing island as a breakaway province.

The US State Department, citing the Taiwan Relations Act, emphasised that ensuring Taiwan's defence is crucial for maintaining peace and stability across the Taiwan Strait.

Despite China's repeated objections, the United States has maintained that its arms sales to Taiwan are guided by the



Taiwan Relations Act and other US laws, not by Beijing's pressure. "We will continue to work with industry to support Taiwan's self-defence in line with our long-standing policies," a US State Department spokesperson said, underscoring that Washington's "One China" policy has not changed but is based on peaceful resolution. Adding to the tensions, China recently announced sanctions against nine US firms in retaliation for Washington's defence support to Taiwan, including a USD 228 million package of spare parts for Taiwan's air force.

India, Australia strategically aligned as Quad partners

The India-Australia Quad partnership is strategically aligned as Quad partners in their aim to create an open and free Indo-Pacific region, the Australian High Commissioner to India, Philip Green, said on Tuesday.

In an interview with ANI, Green said that the Indo-Pacific region has a great dynamic and that the Quad countries stand with the region to have free trade and also to have sovereignty, which is free from any state.

"Australia and India are Quad partners, who are strategically aligned. We want Indo-Pacific open and free. There are great dynamics in our regions but some things hold us back. We want the region where states



have free trade and what they want in their sovereignty in their own way, which is free from state, can make choices that suit the peoples of each of their countries," he said. Green said that the Quad countries have agreed to work in maritime domain security and also to work in the removal of cervical cancer via vaccines in this region. "We agreed on new

work in maritime domain security; we all understand what is happening in our maritime domain, and secondly, we work harder and try to remove cervical cancer via vaccines. Australian PM Anthony Albanese visited India and met Prime Minister Modi and we talked about good things that include many things," he added.

Study finds how antidepressants have potential for treating brain tumours

Glioblastoma is an extremely aggressive brain tumour that is currently incurable. Cancer doctors can increase their patients' life expectancy with surgeries, radiation, chemotherapy, or surgical procedures. Nonetheless, half of patients die within a year of diagnosis.

Medications that are effective against brain tumours are challenging to find since many cancer medications are unable to cross the blood-brain barrier and enter the brain. This reduces the number of available treatments. Neuro-oncologists have thus been working hard for some years to identify better medications that can reach the brain and eradicate the tumour.

Researchers led by ETH Zurich Professor Berend Snijder have discovered a chemical that, at least in vitro, successfully combats glioblastomas: vortioxetine, an antidepressant. Scientists understand that this affordable medicine, which has already Snijder's postdoc and



lead author of the study, Sohyon Lee found it using pharmacoscopy, a special screening platform that the researchers have developed at ETH Zurich over the past years. The study findings were recently published in the journal Nature

Medicine. In this study, the ETH Zurich researchers worked closely with colleagues from various hospitals, in particular with the group under neurologists Michael Weller and Tobias Weiss at the University Hospital Zurich (USZ). With

pharmacoscopy, ETH Zurich researchers can simultaneously test hundreds of active substances on living cells from human cancer tissue. Their study focused primarily on neuroactive substances that cross the blood-brain barrier, such as antidepressants, Parkinson's medication and antipsychotics.

In total, the research team tested up to 130 different agents on tumour tissue from 40 patients. To determine which substances, have an effect on the cancer cells, the researchers used imaging techniques and computer analysis. Previously, Snijder and his team had used the pharmacoscopy platform only to analyse blood cancer (see ETH News) and derived treatment options from this. Glioblastomas are the first solid tumours that they have systematically investigated using this method with a view to use existing drugs for new purposes. For the screening, Lee analysed fresh cancer tissue from patients who had recently undergone surgery at the University Hospi-

tal Zurich. The ETH Zurich researchers then processed this tissue in the laboratory and screened it on the pharmacoscopy platform. Two days later, the researchers obtained results showing which agents worked on the cancer cells and which did not.

The results made it clear that some, but not all, of the antidepressants tested were unexpectedly effective against the tumour cells. These drugs worked particularly well when they quickly triggered a signalling cascade, which is important for neuronal progenitor cells, but also suppresses cell division. Vortioxetine proved to be the most effective antidepressant. The ETH Zurich researchers also used a computer model to test over a million substances for their effectiveness against glioblastomas. They discovered that the joint signalling cascade of neurons and cancer cells plays a decisive role and explains why some neuroactive drugs work while others don't. In the last step, researchers at the University Hos-

pital Zurich tested vortioxetine on mice with a glioblastoma. The drug also showed good efficacy in these trials, especially in combination with the current standard treatment. The group of ETH Zurich and USZ researchers is now preparing two clinical trials. In one, glioblastoma patients will be treated with vortioxetine in addition to standard treatment (surgery, chemotherapy, radiation). In the other, patients will receive a personalised drug selection, which the researchers will determine for each individual using the pharmacoscopy platform. "The advantage of vortioxetine is that it is safe and very cost-effective," says Michael Weller, Professor at the University Hospital Zurich, Director of the Department of Neurology and co-author of the study published in Nature Medicine. "As the drug has already been approved, it doesn't have to undergo a complex approval procedure and could soon supplement the standard therapy for this deadly brain tumour."





A total of thirty-two places were blocked in the district even today. It is noteworthy that three companies of paramilitary had arrived in August and five companies have arrived now. The District Superintendent of Police addressed the actions taken by these companies before and on the day of voting and was encouraged to work as a team and conduct the elections successfully. Inter-state checkpoints were already installed at six places in the district. Apart from this, 36 flying squads and 12 static surveillance teams are working in the district and searching suspicious vehicles so that no one can make any attempt to lure or threaten the voters illegally.
