**Pushpa 2 becomes first film to cross 1100 cr in India**

**UNI Mumbai:** Tollywood superstar Allu Arjun's film 'Pushpa 2: The Rule' has become the first film to earn Rs 1,100 crores in India. Pushpa 2: The Rule, directed by Sukumar, was released in theatres on December 5. It has been 21 days since the release of the film Pushpa 2: The Rule, yet the film is back to back made new records at the box office. Pushpa 2: The Rule has made another historic record in its name. According to the report of Saccaanik, 'Pushpa 2: The Rule' has become the first film in India to have a net collection of 1100 crores. The film has earned 1109.85 crores in 21 days.

**DU to introduce PhD in Hindu Studies from new academic session**

**NEW DELHI:** Delhi University is planning to introduce a PhD programme in Hindu Studies from the 2025-26 academic session, according to a proposal by a Standing Committee. The Governing Body of the Centre for Hindu Studies has recommended that the PhD programme be introduced in 2025-26. The programme was earlier intended to begin in the current academic session but was postponed, as per the proposal.

**Pb: Former IAS Pampal Kaur approaches CAT**

**UNI CHANDIGARH:** Former IAS and the BJP candidate for Bathinda parliamentary constituency in the general elections has approached the CAT and urged to withdraw her resignation. She said she should be given benefits and allowances treating her as a VRS optee. Kaur had resigned on May 9 to contest the Lok Sabha elections. She was fielded from Bathinda by the BJP but lost the elections. In her petition to the CAT, she alleged that she was forced to resign as the Aam Aadmi Party government of Punjab had refused to give "No dues" and NOC even though she had opted for Voluntary Retirement.

## Will ask INDIA Bloc to remove Congress from alliance : AAP

AGENCY NEW DELHI, DEC 26

The Aam Admi Party has opened a fresh front against the Congress accusing it of being hand in glove with the BJP in Delhi. Party RS MP Sanjay Singh accused senior Congress leader and party Treasurer Ajay Maken of speaking the BJP language.

The AAP has also given the Congress a 24 hour ultimatum to take action against Maken or they will call for an expulsion of the Congress from the INDIA bloc.

"In Delhi the Congress is standing with the BJP and is doing everything to benefit the BJP in the assembly elections. AjayMaken is reading the BJP's script and on their urging is speaking against the AAP. He crossed the line by calling Arvind Kejriwal Anti-National. Has Maken ever called any BJP leader Anti-national, he said.

"We tried for an alliance with Congress in Haryana, it did not work out and we contested alone. During the entire campaign not a single unparliamentary word was used for any leader of the Congress. Now looking at the Congress list it appears that it has been made at the BJP Headquarters. I appeal to the Congress to take action against Ajay Maken in 24 hours or we will ask the INDIA bloc parties to remove the Congress from the alliance," he added.

Delhi Chief Minister Atishi who addressed the news conference with Sanjay Singh levelled major allegations against the Congress party. She stated that they (AAP) have received information that the Bharatiya Janata Party is funding candidates of the Congress, including that of Sandeep Dikshit.



Congress has fielded Sandeep Dikshit against Arvind Kejriwal from the New Delhi assembly constituency.

"Congress's action makes it clear that the party has made some arrangements with BJP for Delhi elections. Yesterday, Congress's senior leader Ajay Maken said that Arvind Kejriwal is anti-national. I want to ask the Congress party if they have ever levelled the same allegations against any BJP leader. No. But today, Congress is

accusing Arvind Kejriwal of being anti-national. Congress yesterday filed an FIR against me and Arvind Kejriwal. why? Has Congress filed any FIR against any BJP leader ever? We have found through credible sources that Congress candidates are being their election expenditure is coming from the BJP. BJP is funding Congress candidates," she said

"We have heard that Sandeep Dikshit is getting funded by BJP...If Congress thinks we (AAP) are anti-national, then why did they contest Lok Sabha elections in alliance with us? It is clear that Congress leaders have reached some mutual understanding with BJP to defeat AAP and make BJP win in Delhi...If there is no understanding between Congress and BJP, then they should take action against Ajay Maken within 24 hours..." she added.

### BJP protests near Kejriwal's residence over 'Mahila Samman' scheme

**NEW DELHI:** Leaders and members of the BJP Mahila Morcha staged a protest near AAP supremo Arvind Kejriwal's residence here on Thursday, accusing him of "cheating" the women of Delhi with the "Mahila Samman Yojana". The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) claimed that a similar scheme was announced by the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) ahead of the Punjab Assembly polls but the women there are yet to receive Rs 1,100 per month as promised by the party in 2022. The Mukhya Mantri Mahila Samman Yojana for a monthly payment of Rs 1,000 was announced by the Delhi government in its budget for 2024-25. Kejriwal has said the amount would be raised to Rs 2,100 if the AAP retains power in Delhi.

## Virat Kohli fined 20% match fee, demerit point for bumping into Sam Konstas

India superstar Virat Kohli was on Thursday fined 20 per cent of his match fee and handed one demerit point by the ICC following his on-field altercation with Australia debutant Sam Konstas on the opening day of the fourth Test here.

The incident happened in the 10th over when Kohli and the 19-year-old Konstas bumped their shoulders and also exchanged a few words in the first session's play at the Melbourne Cricket Ground here.

"Article 2.12 of the ICC Code of Conduct relates to: "inappropriate physical con-

tact with a Player, Player Support Personnel, Umpire, Match Referee or any other person (including a spectator during an International Match)", the ICC said on its website.

"No formal hearing was needed as Kohli accepted the sanctions proposed by Match Referee Andy Pycroft. On-field umpires Joel Wilson and Michael Gough, third umpire Sharfuddoula Ibne Shahid and fourth umpire Shawn Craig levelled the charge," it added.

While moving across the pitch after the completion of the over, both the players bumped their shoulders and exchanged a few words before Australia opener Us-

man Khawaja and on-field umpires Gough and Wilson intervened.

Konstas later played down the incident after the end of the play, saying "Virat Kohli accidentally bumped into me, that's cricket and can happen with tension."

Speaking to reporters after Stumps on Day 1 of the Boxing Day Test, Konstas said Kohli bumped into him and it wasn't deliberate.

"Virat Kohli accidentally bumped into me, that's cricket and can happen with tension," said the teenager. "I think the emotions got to both of us." Konstas had told 'Channel 7' during the second session.

### Katra observes total shutdown on day 2 in protest against ropeway project

Protesting against the ropeway project, a 72-hour shutdown call given by the Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Sangarsh Samiti on Thursday entered the second day in Katra town of Reasi district of Jammu and Kashmir.

All the stakeholders including pony owners, shopkeepers and other traders are protesting against the proposed ropeway project at Katra--the base camp of the Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine.

The businesses in Katra town remained completely closed since morning on the second day of the 72-hours shutdown call.

On Wednesday, several people were detained by police during a protest.

Instead of finding the solution by holding deliberation, the protestors alleged that the government was derailing the issue and forcing them to come on the roads.

Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Shrine Board last month, announced plans to install the ropeway to facilitate access to the temple for senior citizens, children, and others who find it challenging to trek the 13-km-long path to the cave shrine.

The proposed Rs 250-crore project aims to connect Tarakote Marg to Sanji Chhat, which leads to the shrine.

Among other places in Punjab, Amritsar experienced a cold night at 5.7 degrees Celsius.



### EC data on LS polls: Women outshine men again in exercising franchise

As many as 64.64 crore voters exercised their franchise in the Lok Sabha polls held earlier this year with women voters outnumbering men, according to statistical data released by the Election Commission on Thursday.

The female voter turnout stood at 65.78 per cent as compared to 65.55 per cent for male electors, the EC said.

EC functionaries asserted that such granular data is not shared by any of the election management bodies in democracies across the world.

In Uttar Pradesh, where the polling was held on 14 seats, 58.51 per cent of the women electorate voted compared to 57.60 per cent of men on May 20.

More women than men voted in Amethi, Banda, Faizabad, Fatehpur, Gonda, Rare Bareilly, Kaiserganj, and Kaushambi. In Amethi, 51.26 per cent of its male electorate and 57.75 per cent of the constituency's women electorate

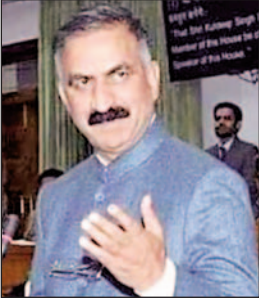

## Monthly payouts to milk producers increased to Rs. 26 crore

Historic hike in milk procurement price has led to a consistent rise in government milk procurement. The HP State Co-operative Milk Producers Federation Ltd is now on an average procuring two lakh litres per day and the monthly payouts to the milk producers have been increased from Rs. 8.70 crore to Rs. 25.62 crore, providing direct financial benefits to milk producers.

Chief Minister Thakur Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu said: "The present State Government has taken numerous steps to bolster the milk based economy.



We are procuring cow milk at Rs. 45 per litre and buffalo milk at Rs. 55 per litre. Since 90 percent of the State's population resides in rural areas, our aim is to ensure money reaches the hands of the villagers, enabling their economic development. The Government will continue to make significant decisions in this direction in the future as well."

To bring transparency in milk procurement, 455



automated milk collection centres have been established across the State through Milkfed. The Milkfed is collecting milk directly from the farmers' doorsteps even in the remotest part of the State, ensuring financial benefits to improve their social and economic conditions. Additionally, Milkfed is also providing farmers with 5 litre capacity cans.

The Federation is also implementing dairy

development programmes in 11 districts of the State forming 1,148 village dairy cooperative societies and registering 47,905 members under this umbrella.

These initiatives aim to enhance the livelihood standards of the rural community and strengthening the State's dairy economy. Sukhu said that the State Government has also initiated a Him Ganga Yojna from the current financial year with

an initial outlay of Rs. 500 crore. He said that the State Government has set up a new milk processing plant with a daily capacity of 50,000 litres at Duttanagar in Shimla district with a cost of Rs. 25 crore.

Additionally, the Government is also establishing a new processing plant with a capacity of 1.50 lakh litres per day at Dhagwar in Kangra district. He said that these initiatives will go a long way in providing remunerative prices to the farmers for their milk production. In order to strengthen rural economy, apart from increasing MSP on milk, the government has undertaken numerous initiatives, including encouraging the farmers to adopt natural farming techniques and shun the chemical farming.

## Amid freezing cold, prediction of light snowfall over higher reaches of J&K

Amid intense cold and freezing temperatures, the Meteorological Department Srinagar has forecast light snowfall over the higher reaches of Jammu and Kashmir during the next 24 hours, officials said. The MeT office said a Western Disturbance (WD) is likely to hit and can cause light rain over the plains of Jammu and light snow over higher reaches of the Chenab Valley and Pir Panjal range towards December 27 late afternoon to December 18 forenoon. "In the Jammu region, higher reaches of Kathua, Doda, Ramban, and Kishtwar districts are likely to



experience snowfall ranging from 1 to 4 inches, with extreme higher altitudes receiving up to 10 inches of snow. The plains of the Jammu region can expect light to moderate rain

showers, while Poonch and Rajouri districts are likely to experience a comparatively lesser impact," an independent weather forecaster, Faizan Arif, told UNI. He said, "For the

Kashmir region, snowfall remains a possibility in parts of south Kashmir, with a 25-30% chance, and the highest probability is for the districts of Kulgam and Anantnag. Additionally, a few weather models indicate the possibility of the system extending to central Kashmir, potentially bringing light rain or snowfall".

The weather will remain dry hereafter till December 30, and another spell of light snow is expected at a few higher reaches in the Kashmir Valley at the end of the year. There was no lull in the bone-chilling cold in Srinagar and other parts of the Kashmir Valley, with night temperatures continuing to fall on Thursday. The harshest

were the three districts of south Kashmir—Pulwama, Anantnag, and Shopian—recording the season's lowest at -9.3°C, respectively, on Thursday, freezing major water bodies, streams, nallas, and taps. Although there was a slight improvement in the night temperature, Srinagar recorded at -7.0°C on Thursday against the -7.3°C the previous night. This was 4.6°C below the average for the summer capital of Jammu and Kashmir during this period of the season.

The relentless cold wave and freezing temperature have seized taps, and several water bodies and a thick layer of ice surface have emerged on the major parts of iconic Dal Lake.

**New weapon**

Manipulating the Earth's natural systems to counter global warming has long been viewed as a last-ditch option by many in the fight against climate change. The fact that most people are already turning to such geoengineering technology reveals just how grave the threat to the planet is. Some of the most influential backers of geoengineering are part of the Bill Gates-led Breakthrough Energy Ventures, which met recently to consider its investment in technology that promises to strip away some of the carbon from the atmosphere. Estimates suggest that companies such as Google and Microsoft — amongst the biggest polluters in the world — have earmarked billions for similar projects that will help them meet their carbon emission targets even as they continue to pollute the Earth. It is ironic that the world's largest polluters are investing in climate change-fighting technology while they continue to contribute significantly to environmental degradation. Their efforts to offset emissions with geoengineering solutions highlight the paradox of addressing the crisis they helped create through technological intervention. Incidentally, India, too, has recently unveiled an ambitious initiative aimed at preparing the country for climate modification experiments. Called Mission Mausam, the project has received approval from the Union cabinet for an investment of Rs 2,000 crore over the next two years. It will involve comprehensive research focused on understanding and applying weather modification techniques, such as reflecting some of the sun's radiation back into space, to combat climate change.

There are several challenges when it comes to using such technology on a global scale. Solar radiation modification that India is investing in, for instance, could affect rainfall patterns and have a devastating impact on its agrarian economy. Further, geoengineering experiments conducted by countries such as the United States of America, Canada and China have seen limited success. It is thus crucial to implement checks and balances to ensure that the potential risks of emerging weather technologies do not lead to harmful consequences. Most important, though, is recognising the fact that there are no substitutes for cutting back on polluting practices. Geoengineering is not a magic wand that can — or should — give big capital a free pass to stay on its exploitative path. It should be used to complement the more reliable methods of battling global warming.

# India surpasses 73,000 startups with women directors

India is home to more than 73,000 startups with at least one woman director, recognised under the Startup India initiative, the Ministry of Commerce & Industry stated on Wednesday.

The ministry, in a release, highlighted that this represents nearly half of the 1,57,066 startups supported by the government, underscoring the crucial role women play in driving innovation and economic growth.

The entrepreneurial spirit in India has undergone a paradigm shift over the last decade. Cities such as Bengaluru, Hyderabad, Mumbai, and Delhi-NCR have become epicentres of innovation.

The widespread availability of affordable internet, coupled with a young and dynamic workforce, has fuelled the growth of startups in diverse sectors, including fintech, edtech, health-tech, and e-commerce.

### Odisha sets example with tsunami-ready villages as 20 years pass since 2004 tragedy

NEW DELHI: Two decades after the devastating tsunami of December 26, 2004, Odisha has emerged as a leader in disaster preparedness. Twenty-four villages across six coastal districts of the state have been officially declared "Tsunami Ready" by UNESCO's Intergovernmental Oceanographic Commission (IOC), making Odisha the first state in India to achieve this milestone.

Dr. T. Srinivas Kumar of UNESCO explained that this international initiative aims to raise awareness about tsunamis and is based on 12 key indicators. Among the 24 villages, three are in Kendrapara, five in Balasore, and four each in Bhadrak, Jagatsinghpur, Puri, and Ganjam districts. Additionally, the "Tsunami Ready" certificates for Noliassahi (Jagatsinghpur) and Venkatraipur (Ganjam), which were first recognized in 2020, have been renewed, bringing the total to 26 villages.

This success is credited to the collaborative efforts of the Indian National Centre

for Ocean Information Services (INCOIS) in Hyderabad and the Odisha State Disaster Management Authority (OSDMA). Through training and capacity-building initiatives, these villages have been equipped with essential skills for emergency response, risk awareness, and tsunami preparedness. The program also includes identifying evacuation routes, establishing safe pathways, conducting mock drills, and installing educational resources, hoardings, and signage to guide residents during emergencies.

INCOIS, which monitors the Indian Ocean round the clock, plays a pivotal role in ensuring quick response capabilities. Dr. Kumar highlighted the importance of this initiative, stating that it can save countless lives in coastal areas through effective training and awareness. The 2004 tsunami claimed the lives of millions, but with these measures in place, Odisha is setting an example for other regions to follow in mitigating such disasters.

### Cyberattack hits Japan Airlines; flights delayed, ticket sales suspended

Japan Airlines (JAL) announced on Thursday that its network had been targeted by a cyberattack, leading to delays of up to an hour for at least 14 domestic flights and disruptions to some international flights as well, Kyodo News reported.

The airline reported that the issues began at approximately 7:25 am, prompting it to suspend ticket sales for all domestic and international flights for the remainder of the day. Passengers who had already purchased tickets were advised that their bookings remained valid.

JAL said it was working to counteract the cyber-attack and determine its source, adding the attack may have a larger effect on



its flights. The airline succeeded in temporarily shutting down the router believed to have been compromised. The Metropolitan Police Department was contacted by JAL and is looking into the matter, investigative sources said, according to Kyodo News.

Earlier in the day, sharing a post on X, the Japan Airlines wrote, "We identified and addressed the cause of the issue. We are checking the system recov-

ery status. Sales for both domestic and international flights departing today have been suspended. We apologize for any inconvenience caused."

In another post, it wrote, "We regret to inform you that our network systems are down. The cause is under investigation. This may potentially affect the operations of both domestic and international flights. We sincerely apologize for the inconvenience."

And the hollow ocean-ridges roaring into cataracts.

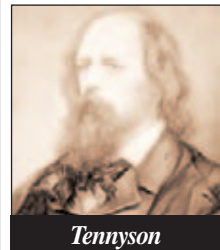
Many a night from yonder ivied casement, ere I went to rest, Did I look on great Orion sloping slowly to the West.

# A supreme sacrifice by Sahibzads of Sri Guru Gobind Singh Ji

A more painful but inspiring story than "Saka Sirhind (Punjab) may not be found on the pages of world history. My tears trickle down when I dare to write few lines about the barbarous massacre of two children of a great father and brave mother, aged five and seven years by Wazir Khan, Nawab of Sirhind, when these two children displayed unique firmness to stick to their faith. Guru Gobind Singh (1666-1708) is among the most revered of Gurus. Right from childhood he showed great brilliance and foresightedness. Guru Sahib was a profound thinker, writer, philosopher, soldier and saint. Guru Gobind Singh ji was blessed with four sons, namely Ajit Singh, Jujhar Singh, Zorawar Singh and Fateh Singh. Two elder sons Baba Ajit Singh and Baba Jujhar Singh attained martyrdom in



the battle of Chamkaur Sahib. Two younger Sahibzads, Zorawar Singh, aged seven and his younger brother Fateh Singh aged five, were with their grandmother, Mata Gujari, at rivulet sirsra near Ropar town.

The imperial army, under the command of Wazir Khan, was pursuing them to capture Guru Gobind

Singh and his followers, after they had evacuated Ananadpur Sahib. It was bitter cold and utter darkness, the whole family of guru got separated from each other and rushed for safety in different directions, under the protection of God alone. Grand mother, mata Gujri along with two sahibzads managed to reach Ropar and there she

met a person named Gangu, their discharged cook. The grandmother agreed to accept his shelter and protection in his village Kheri near Sirhind. But Gangu betrayed and handed them over to Wazir Khan, nawab of Sirhind. The two children and the grandmother were lodged in the prison cell. They were neither given any food nor warm clothing for the night. On the following day the grandmother was asked to prepare the children, as they had to be produced in the royal court. Mata Gujri continued advising them to remain firm to their faith, which alone would bring honour to their father and grandfather, Guru Tegh Bahadur. Zorawar Singh and Fateh Singh clung to her grandmother with a smile and said, "O dadee mann, age does not matter. Our father Guru Gobind Singh, was just nine year old when he asked his father to sacrifice his noble life for the protection of the faith of Kashmiri

Pandits." The Sahibzads were produced before Wazir Khan in his court, he tried very kindly and affectionately to impress upon them for changing their faith and acceptance of Islam on promises of royal honours and gifts. But Zorawar Singh replied in a polite tone, "Our faith is more dear to us than the offered royal gifts. The Nawab retorted, "Then you will have to die." Zorawar Singh remained firm and said, "It will be better to die with our faith intact." On this Wazir Khan changed his attitude to learn that the children were not ready to accept Islam.

Suchanand Khatri, his Dewan (Courtier) infuriated him further, saying, "These children are young ones of a snake and could be bricked alive. Fateh Singh, aged five, younger brother could not follow as to why he was made to stand on bricks and mud was put on his feet. Zorawar

Singh told him that the time of their sacrifice had arrived and they should recite Japuji Sahib. The wall fell when it reached shoulder high. Still the children remained firm in their resolve. They were, therefore, beheaded on 27th December 1704. There is no parallel to the martyrdom of such young boys in the annals of human history.

Todar Mal, a devoted Sikh, learnt about the execution and went to the mother of Guru. With a heavy heart, he broke the sad news to her, regarding the execution of her grandchildren. Hearing the news she looked to God and breathed her last. Todar Mal acquired land for cremation by giving gold coins in lieu of land.

To commemorate the martyrdom of Sahibzads Baba Zorawar Singh and Baba Fateh Singh, every year, "Shaheedi Jor Mela" is being organised at Fategarh Sahib in Punjab on December 25 to 27.

Divulging the details after taking an urgent meeting on this issue with ADC (G) Viraj S/Tidke, ADC (UD) Anmol Singh Dhalwal and District Revenue Officer Amandeep Chawla, Deputy Commissioner Mrs Aashika Jain, said that as per the directions of Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Singh Mann, to ensure the benefit of amendment in Punjab Apartment and Property Regulation (Amendment) Act 2024 effected

from December 1, 2024, wherein Sub Section 5 under Section 20 has been introduced with an aim to give relief to the plot holders for registration of their plots situated in an unauthorized colony, the Sub Registrars and Joint Sub Registrars of all the Tehsils and Sub Tehsils of the SAS Nagar District have been directed to make the people aware of the scheme.

She said that as the exemption of NOCs from Housing and Urban Development and Local

Bodies Departments is valid till February 28, 2025 only, so the beneficiaries must be able to get their registrations done as per the notification before or by the end of the day.

She said that as per the notification, any person, who up to 31st July, 2024, for an area up to 500 square yards situated in an unauthorised colony has entered into a power of attorney or agreement to sell on stamp paper or having any registered document w.r.t title of land shall be entitled to get registration of such plot executed before a Registrar or Sub-Registrar or Joint Sub-Registrar.

Further, the plot holder shall furnish the undertaking to the Sub-Registrar or Joint Sub-Registrar along with application for registration of sale deed of such plots, that the plot does not fall in unauthorized development raised on land falling in restricted areas along Scheduled Roads and National Highways or any other

restricted areas declared under any other Central or State law and the registration and use of this plot does not contravene the provisions of the respective Regional Plan/Master Plan and other mandatory restrictions as applicable on registration of such plots.

Similarly, the Sub Registrars and Joint Sub Registrars while registering such plots will ensure that such plots do not fall in the following categories such as encroachment on public land, unauthorized development raised on area, which is notified under the Land Acquisition Act, 1894, the Right to Fair Compensation and Transparency in Land Acquisition, Rehabilitation and Resettlement Act, 2013, the Forest (Conservation) Act, 1980, the Punjab Land Preservation Act, 1900, ECO Sensitive Zone (ESZ) as per the Wildlife (Protection) Act 1972 and the Works of Defence Act 1903 or an area covered under any other Central or State Act.

## Smartcircuits Innovation a space tech start-up set to create history in space research



**C**handigarh, December 26, 2024: In a ground-breaking stride towards advancing space technology, three young space science researchers and founders of Smartcircuits Innovation, an ISRO-certified Space Tutor and member of International Astronautical Federation from Yamunanagar, Haryana, have developed a path-breaking experiment which is slated to be launched in a satellite being put into orbit by the prestigious Indian Space Research Organisation (ISRO) during the PSLV Orbital Experiment Platform (POEM) C60 mission, on 30th December 2024. The revolution focuses on measuring the temperature profile of a rolling satellite in Low Earth Orbit (LEO) using an external sensor placed at the satellite's outermost surface. Temperature readings will also be taken using a Lux/Ambient sensor.

It is to be noted that the experiment will be part of My Orbital Infrastructure - Technology Demonstrator (MOI-TD), India's first AI Space Lab. MOI-TD will be a payload on the satellite. The MOI-TD project is being spearheaded by Takeme2Space. Raghav Sharma, Director of Technology, Smartcircuits Innovation, said, "This innovative mission will showcase the capabilities of real-time data processing in orbit, eliminating the need for extensive data transmission back to Earth and paving the way for cost-effective space research. The data of this experiment will be helpful for the space agencies for the upcoming space missions, as temperature will be the crucial part for any space mission."

## Fortis Ludhiana Successfully Treats 70-Year-Old Man for Massive Stroke Within the Golden Hour

**L**udhiana : Doctors at Fortis Hospital Ludhiana successfully treated a 70-year-old patient who had suffered a massive stroke. A multidisciplinary team of doctors, including Dr Abhimanyu, Head of Emergency; Dr Vivek Aggarwal, Consultant, Radiologist; and Dr Vaibhav Tandon, Consultant Neurology, Fortis Hospital Ludhiana, performed a mechanical thrombectomy - a minimally invasive procedure to remove blood clots from blocked blood vessels. The procedure was completed without complications, and the patient was discharged in stable condition within seven days. Upon waking in the morning, the patient noticed that one side of his body was paralysed - a clear indication of a severe stroke. He was then rushed to the Emergency Department at Fortis Ludhiana within the golden hour (Golden Hour is the first 60 minutes post a stroke and prompt intervention is crucial for improving recovery outcomes). Dr. Abhimanyu, Head of Emergency, Fortis Ludhiana, ensured swift stabilization of the patient and performed a rapid stroke assessment and initiated treatment. Post this, a detailed physical examination and advanced imaging confirmed the presence of a massive blood clot blocking a major blood vessel in the brain. Acting promptly, Dr. Vivek Aggarwal, Consultant, Radiologist; and Dr. Vaibhav Tandon, Consultant Neurology, Fortis Hospital Ludhiana performed mechanical thrombectomy, which restored blood flow and minimized potential damage.
