NEW DELHI: In response to senior Congress leader Sonia Gandhi's remarks, the Rashtrapati Bhavan, without mentioning her name called it "unacceptable" and said it "clearly hurt the dignity of the high office." The Rashtrapati Bhavan also clarified that President Droupadi Murmu was "not tired at any point", adding that President believes speaking up for the marginalized communities, for women and farmers can "never be tiring". "While reacting to the media on the Hon'ble President's Address to the Parliament, some prominent leaders of the Congress party have made comments that clearly hurt the dignity of the high office, and therefore are unacceptable. These leaders have said that the President was getting very tired by the end and she could hardly speak," the Rashtrapati Bhavan said in a statement. It further said that "it might be the case" that the leaders are not acquianted with idiom and discourse in Indian languages, adding that "in any case, such comments are in poor taste, unfortunate and entirely avoidable.

"Two months ago, we celebrated the 75 years of adopting our constitu-tion and a few days ago, we completed our journey of 75 years... On behalf of all Indians, I bow down to Babasaheb Ambedkar and all others in the Constitution Committee," President Mur-

She in her address also paid respect to Baba Saheb Amedkar. "I pay respect to Baba Saheb Ambedkar and all the makers of constitution."

While expressing grief over the stampede in the ongoing Mahakumbh in Uttar Pradesh's Prayagraj, where 30 people lost their lives, she said, "The historic Mahakumbh is also going on in the country. Mahakumbh is a festival of India's cultural identity and social enlightment



Economic Survey pegs FY26 GDP growth at 6.3-6.8 pc

UNI NEW DELHI, JAN 31

India's real gross domestic product (GDP) is expected to grow at 6.3-6.8% year-on-year in the financial year 2025-26 (FY26), as per the Economic Survey 2024-25 tabled in the Parliament on Friday ahead of the Union Budget

The Survey tabled by Union Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman said that while there are many upsides to domestic investment, output growth and disinflation in FY26, the economy faces equally strong downsides too.

"On balance of these considerations, we expect that the growth in FY26 would be between 6.3 and 6.8 per cent," the Sur-

It further said that navigating global headwinds will require strategic and prudent policy management and reinforcing the domestic fundamentals.

India's GDP growth slowed down to nearly seven-quarter low of 5.4% yearon-year in the July-September quarter (Q2) of current financial year 2024-2 triggering downward revision in annual growth forecast by multiple agencies.

As per the first advance estimates of national accounts, India's real GDP is estimated to grow by 6.4% in FY25. "Looking ahead, India's economic

prospects for FY26 are balanced. Headwinds to growth include elevated geopolitical and trade uncertainties and possible commodity price shocks," the Economic Survey 2024-25 said.

The government's report card noted that domestically the translation of order books of private capital goods sector into sustained investment pick-up, improvements in consumer confidence,

Nearly 7,500 projects completed so far under Smart Cities Mission

NEW DELHI: The Economic Survey on Friday highlighted that under the Smart Cities mission, nearly 7,500 projects worth Rs 1.5 lakh crore have been complet-

The mission, which was launched in 2015, aims to develop smart cities with essential infrastructure, good quality of life and a sustainable environment, it noted "As of 13 January 2025, 8,058 projects worth 1.64 lakh crore have been proposed, with 7,479 projects worth 1.50 lakh crore completed," said the survey, which was tabled in Parliament on Friday.

SC dismisses plea challenging VIP entry to temples

Since we are going into the budget without a pre-budget rally, the probability of a rally post-budget will be high if the budget delivers on growth-stimulating initiatives like cuts in personal income tax. But it is important to understand that the impact of the budget will last only for a few days, at best," said Vijayakumar.

BJP Himachal Pradesh Media Incharge Karn Nanda has accused the ruling Congress government of being antipeople, anti-employee, antiyouth, anti-women, and antifarmer. He claimed that making guarantees before coming to power, the government has failed to fulfill even one.

Chairing the district-level advisory committee meeting under the Food Safety and Standards Act, 2006, he reviewed the implementation of food safety regulations and emphasized ensuring the availability of healthy, safe, and hygienic food products. He also instructed officials to take effective steps to raise consumer awareness.

During the meeting, officials provided an update on enforcement activities and awareness programs related to food safety. The district



business operators registered under the Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI). Between May 2024 and January 23, 2025, a total of 209 new licenses were issued, generating ?13.42 lakh in fees, while 1,050 businesses were registered under the FSSAI Act, contributing ?5.45 lakh in registration fees. The registration and licensing

In 2024, food safety officers tested 91 samples, of which 20 were found noncompliant—2 were unsafe, 5 had misbranding issues, 10 were of substandard quality, and 2 fell under multiple violations. A total fine of

At present, Assistant Librarian Kashmir Chand is handling the duties of the head librarian. He is assisted by Assistant Librarians Sapna Kumari and Vijay Singh. Kashmir Chand emphasized the urgent need to fill the vacant posts of sweeper and security guard. He also urged authorities to restore the library's dedicated Wi-Fi system to enhance digital learning resources.

Editorial

A wish list

his is the time when a lot of comments about the economy abound in anticipation of the forthcoming budgetary announcements. The most important aspect of the performance of the Indian economy has been the slowing down of macroeconomic growth. The final figures are yet to come in for 2024-25 but some economists feel that they could end up even lower than what is estimated currently. Obviously, pundits have started analysing the reasons for this deceleration. A consensus that is emerging from available evidence is that the much talked about Indian middle class seems to be shrinking significantly. This had started from the days of the pandemic but continues unabated. The result has been that the number of people clustered around the poverty line has increased. It is interesting to note that most state governments have increased transfer payments to the poor — the much-debated freebies as these are referred to. But the rich have continued getting richer. In fact, the number of billionaires has increased in India during the recent past. What this means is not just the rise in inequality but that the demand for consumer goods has also slowed down, barring some of the more expensive goods categorised as luxury goods. Since income growth has stagnated. household savings have also dropped as a percentage of

Given this situation, the finance minister, Nirmala Sitharaman, has a challenge to boost growth while keeping fiscal prudence in mind. Stimulating public investment further and incentivising private investment ought to be at the top of the budgetary considerations. It is time to consider a restructuring of the progressive income tax-regime; there should be tax-relief for the lower income groups and higher taxes for the super-rich. There is not much scope for playing around with deficits. First, the Eighth Pay Commission is expected to revise wages upward in the government sector in the near future. This will be followed by hikes in state government wages and in the public sector. The fiscal deficit is bound to be strained by those revisions. The second reason pertains to the large-scale uncertainty surrounding the international trade and investment environment with the advent of the new regime in the United States of America. There are other areas that must be looked into. For instance, India's spending on the social sector, especially on health and education, must be revised to augment growth.


Sunita Williams breaks spacewalking record

ASA astronaut Sunita 'Suni'
Williams surpassed a major milestone on January 30, 2025, when
she broke the record for total spacewalking time held by former astronaut
Peggy Whitson.

The International Space Station (ISS) shared the news on X: "NASA astronaut Suni Williams just surpassed former astronaut Peggy Whitson's total spacewalking time of 60 hours and 21 minutes today. Suni is still outside in the vacuum of space removing radio communications hardware."

Williams was outside the ISS during the spacewalk to maintain the station's hardware and collect surface material samples from Destiny laboratory and Quest airlock for analysis. This spacewalk was part of Expedition 72, and it began at approximately 8 am EST. NASA live-streamed the event on YouTube and their official website, marking the 92nd US spacewalk.

Williams, who was wearing the suit with red stripes, was joined by astronaut Butch Wilmore, who wore the unmarked suit. This was Wilmore's fifth spacewalk and Williams' ninth. The spacewalk was expected to last about six and a half hours. Both astronauts arrived at the ISS in 2024 as part of Expedition 72, which began on September 22



Earlier in the week, SpaceX founder Elon Musk had stirred up controversy by commenting on the situation surrounding two astronauts, including Wilmore and Williams, who have been aboard the ISS since June 2024. Due to technical delays with their Boeing Starliner capsule, their return to Earth was postponed, prompting Musk to say on X, "The President has asked SpaceX to bring home the 2 as-

tronauts stranded on the ISS as soon as possible. We will do so. Terrible that the Biden administration left them there so long."

New drug may help restoring vision for people with nerve damage: Study

Researchers at the University of Colorado Anschutz Medical Campus found a promising therapeutic candidate that could aid in the restoration of vision in those suffering from multiple sclerosis (MS) and other neurodegenerative diseases.

The medicine, LL-341070, improves the brain's ability to repair damaged myelin-the protective sheath that surrounds nerve fibers. Myelin damage is a hallmark of disorders such as MS, as well as a normal consequence of aging, and it frequently causes visual loss, loss of motor abilities, and cognitive decline.

The research, focused on vision, demonstrated that while the brain has some ability to repair itself when myelin is damaged, the process can be slow and inefficient. Researchers observed that LL-341070 significantly accelerated the repair process and improved brain function related to vision in mice, even after severe damage. "This research brings us closer to a world where the brain has the capacity to heal itself" said Ethan Hugh-



es, PhD, co-lead author and associate professor in the Department of Cell and Developmental Biology at the CU School of Medicine. "By harnessing this potential, we hope to help people with diseases like MS by potentially reversing some of the damage, offering people the opportunity to regain their vision and cognitive function." Researchers discovered that the treatment makes the repair process much more effective following serious damage, highlighting the importance of intervention with severe injury.

and another set of parameters for judging those of others. While seeking help and offering help, we wear different masks.



Hospital bill should not be a financial death sentence

A s the Union Budget 2025 approaches, India's healthcare sector stands at a crossroads, demanding urgent reforms and strategic investments. While considerable progress has been made in infrastructure and disease control, persistent challenges such as affordability, accessibility, and regulatory inconsistencies continue to undermine public confidence.

This year's budget presents an opportunity to address these pressing concerns and pave the way for a more equitable healthcare framework.A hospital bill should not be a financial death sentence, yet India's healthcare system is marked by stark disparities in costs and service quality across private hospitals. The absence of a unified regulatory framework has led to unpredictable pricing, leaving patients vulnerable to exorbitant charges for basic and specialized treatments. Strengthening regulatory mechanisms to ensure transparent pricing, uniform service delivery, and standardization of costs is essential. The budget should allocate funds to operationalize independent oversight bodies



modeled on global best practices, such as Germany's standardized pricing system and Japan's insurance-backed medical services, which ensure equitable access.

A nation's health is its true wealth, yet despite India's economic growth, public

healthcare expenditure remains stagnant at 1.9% of GDP, far below the global average of 10.38%. The National Health Policy 2017 had set a target of increasing healthcare spending to 2.5% of GDP by 2025, which has not been adhered to, but the need of the hour is to push for at least 5% of GDP to ensure robust healthcare infrastructure and accessibility. Moreover, a recent SBI report has even recommended an allocation of up to 10% of GDP to meet the growing healthcare demands. If India truly aspires to be a global powerhouse, investing in healthcare is non-negotiable. The upcoming budget must increase this allocation to at least 5% of GDP, prioritizing infrastructure development, digital health technologies such as telemedicine and AI-driven diagnostics, and preventive healthcare initiatives.

Countries like the UK with its NHS model and Singapore's MediShield Life provide valuable insights into efficient public health investment and risk pooling mechanisms that India can adapt. More expenditure is also required as our Country

needs to spend on Research & Development. With this we can produce medicines indigenously which should be available at low cost especially for Cancer & other rare diseases. Insurance should be a shield, not a burden, yet millions remain financially vulnerable due to low insurance penetration

The Employees' State Insurance Corporation (ESIC) income threshold of ?21,000, unchanged since 2016, excludes many lowincome workers from affordable healthcare coverage. At the same time, unregulated pricing of hospital consumables like syringes, implants, and essential equipment further inflates out-of-pocket expenses, even for those insured. Learning from France and Canada, which successfully mitigate these costs through strong public-private insurance models, India must push for regulatory reforms that curb arbitrary pricing and expand insurance coverage. With healthcare costs soaring, tax incentives can serve as a powerful tool to encourage broader insurance adoption. The government should enhance deduction limits under Section 80D. Additional deductions should be introduced for chronic care, offering relief to families managing long-term illnesses, while separate deductions for life insurance premiums can promote financial security. Lowering the current 18% GST on insurance premiums would make policies more affordable, ensuring broader participation. Healthcare should not be a privilege, but a promise fulfilled by the state. By increasing public health spending, strengthening regulatory oversight, and expanding insurance incentives, India can take a decisive step toward universal and affordable healthcare. The Nordic nations provide a strong example of how government intervention can ensure cost regulation and universal coverage. Now is the time for India to make a bold move, implementing meaningful reforms that ensure quality healthcare is accessible to all transforming the dream of equitable healthcare into reality.
