31 naxalites, two cops killed in Chhattisgarh encounter

AGENCY BIJAPUR, FEB 9

In a major operation against Left Wing Extremism, security forces gunned down 31 naxalites during an encounter in Chhattisgarh's Bijapur district on Sunday, police said. Two security personnel were also killed and as many others injured in the face-off, they said. With this incident, 81 naxalites have been gunned down by security forces in separate encounters in the State so far this year. The latest gunfight took place at a forest in Indravati National Park area in the morning when a joint team of personnel from different security forces was out on an anti-naxalite operation, Inspector General of Police, Bastar Range, Sundarraj P said. "Thirty one Naxalites have been killed in the encounter," he said.

fight and two others suffered injuries, he said. The two injured jawans, reported to be out of danger, were being airlifted to a better medical facility for treatment, he said. Reinforcement has been rushed to the spot and search operation is still underway in the area, he added. Out of the 81



naxalites gunned down in the State so far this year, 65 were killed in the Bastar division comprising seven districts, including Bijapur. Last year, 219 naxalites were neutralised by security forces in separate encounters in Chhattisgarh, according to police.

Will eradicate Naxalism by March 31, 2026: Amit Shah

NEW DELHI: Union Home Minister Amit Shah said on Sunday that Naxals will be eradicated by March 31, 2026 and no citizen of the country has to lose his life due to it. Shah said this after the security forces killed 31 Naxals in Chhattisgarh. "I also reiterate my resolve that before 31 March, 2026, we will completely eradicate Naxalism from the country so that no citizen of the country has to lose his life due to it," he wrote on 'X' in Hindi.

3 militants arrested

Biren Singh quits as CM of Manipur

Manipur Chief Minister N Biren Singh has resigned to quell dissidence in the state BJP against his leadership as his government faces the possibility of a Congress no-confidence motion and a floor test.

The Chief Minister handed his resignation to the Governor this evening. While the BJP has the numbers despite

the withdrawal of support by ally Conrad Sangma's National Peoples' Party, there was a possibility that the MLAs who sought a change in leadership in the state, would have disregarded a party whip in case of a floor test.

To avert that possibility, the Chief Minister stepped down after conferring with the Central leadership.

Mr Singh had gone to Delhi this morning where he met party chief JP Nadda and its

chief strategist, Union minister Amit Shah. Around 12 MLAs are strongly pushing for a leadership change, and there are around six fence sitters, party sources said. The sources also added that the Speaker and the chief minister have had "differences". Sources said given the BJP's success in Delhi polls, the party high command does not want the Manipur situation to overshadow the growing positive political narrative.

Police unearth illegal weapon manufacturing factory

JALANDHAR: Jalandhar Commissionerate police (CP) on Sunday unearthed a factory manufacturing illegal fire weapons. Deputy Commissioner of Police Sandip Sharma told the media persons that acting on confirmed information, a police party conducted a raid on a house in Kot Mohalla of the city. The police party seized 10 country-made pistols from the factory. A grinder used for cutting iron and certain other machinery and a numberless two-wheeler were recovered from the premises of the factory being run by onr Harjinder Singh alias Giani.

Delhi polls: BJP candidates hold victory rallies, distribute sweets

NEW DELHI: A day after the BJP returned to power in Delhi, the party's winning candidates held thanksgiving rallies in their respective constituencies on Sunday. The candidates celebrated their success by distributing sweets, cutting cakes and thanking voters for supporting them. The BJP returned to power in Delhi after more than 26 years, winning 48 of the 70 assembly seats on Saturday. The AAP won 22 seats while the Congress drew a blank in the polls held on February 5.

PM Modi's US visit to focus on trade, tech, and migration

NEW DELHI: Terming Prime Minister Narendra Modi's upcoming visit to the United States as "very important," President and CEO of the US-India Strategic Partnership Forum (USISPF) Mukesh Aghi, emphasised that the trip will focus on strengthening geopolitical alignment, trade relations, technology transfer and the issue of illegal immigration will also be discussed. Aghi highlighted the importance of early discussions between PM Modi and President Donald Trump, noting that alignment on common objectives would help drive the growth of both economies.

Around 8.429 million devotees took holy dip at Mahakumbh 2025 on Sunday, the Uttar Pradesh government said. More than 420 million devotees have taken a holy dip at Mahakumbh 2025 till now. Mahakumbh 2025, which commenced on Paush Purnima (January 13, 2025), is the world's largest spiritual and cultural gathering, attracting devotees from across the globe.

Zero wins, big impact: How Owaisi factor played out in Delhi Election


80% of total candidates, including 67 Congress leaders, lose deposits

NEW DELHI: Congress candidates lost their security deposits on all but three seats in the Delhi Assembly polls as nearly 80 per cent of all contenders, including those contesting independently, forfeited their deposits. All the candidates of the AAP, BJP and its allies, Janata Dal (United) and LJP (Ram Vilas) managed to save their security deposits after the election results were declared on Saturday. Out of the 699 candidates in the fray, 555 (79.39 per cent) candidates forfeited their deposits in the February 5 polls.

NEW DELHI: If the failure of AAP and the Congress to join hands for the Delhi Assembly election helped the BJP score a decisive victory, a Hyderabad factor, too, made its presence felt in the capital contest. The Asaduddin Owaisi-led All India Majlis-e-Ittehadul Muslimeen (AIMIM) did not win any seat, but both its candidates finished second runners-up. In one of the seats, the division of votes paved the way for BJP's win in a constituency with a significant minority population. AIMIM fielded two candidates in the Delhi election - Shifa Ur Rehman Khan from Okhla and Tahir Hussain from Mustafabad. Both its candidates have been named as accused in cases linked to the 2020 Delhi riots and are currently in jail. Both the AIMIM candidates managed to push the Congress to the fourth spot and finished third. In Okhla, AAP leader and sitting MLA Amanatullah Khan won by 23,639 votes. The BJP's Manish Chaud-

hary finished second and Shifa Ur Rehman Khan, currently in Tihar Jail, got 39,558 votes. The Congress's Arifa Khan got 12,739 votes. Despite the division in minority votes, three-time MLA Khan managed to hold on to his seat. But his winning margin dropped by more than 50,000 votes. The Mustafabad seat saw a more exciting contest. In a constituency with a nearly 40 per cent Muslim population, BJP's Mohan Singh Bisht won by a margin of 17,578 votes.

PRAYAGRAJ, FEB 9 (UNI) With the number of visitors from across the country and abroad steadily rising in Maha Kumbh, Prayagraj Railway has decided to extend the single-direction movement plan until further notice to ensure smooth and safe rail travel.

J&K: Police intensify inspections to curb misuse of SIM cards by terrorists



SRINAGAR, FEB 9 (UNI): Police have ramped up efforts to curb the misuse of Subscriber Identity Module (SIM) cards by terrorists and criminal elements and carried out extensive inspections in Jammu and Kashmir, officials said. Police on Sunday said extensive inspections have been carried out across multiple districts, including Srinagar, Ganderbal, Anantnag, Budgam, Pulwama, Shopian, Bhandipora, Samba, and Kishtwar, to ensure strict compliance with Know Your Customer (KYC) norms by SIM card ven-

dors. Over the past year, more than 30 individuals have been arrested for procuring SIM cards in their names and passing them on to terrorists for unlawful activities, police said. These measures aim to prevent unauthorised issuance and misuse of SIM cards, maintaining the security and integrity of communication networks. Agency and district police units continue to take firm action against such violations. 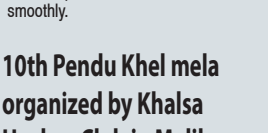

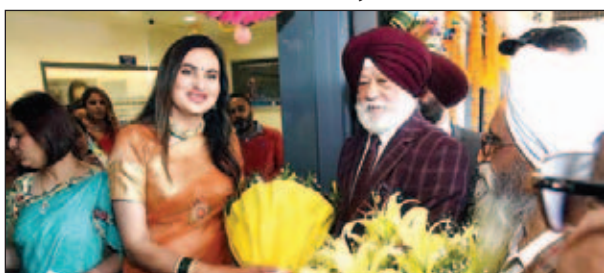

DC Asks for time bound investigation and arrest of the culprits

Deputy Commissioner Jain said that the District Police has been urged for time bound investigation of the case and to book the accused behind this illegal mining.

Seminar organized on health, hygiene, cyber crime and traffic rules



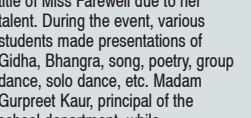

Savrina becomes Miss Farewell



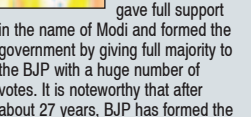

Dr. Baljit Kaur urges Centre to strengthen welfare schemes for Scheduled Castes

Punjab Social Justice, Empowerment and Minorities Minister Dr. Baljit Kaur, while addressing a high-level meeting in Delhi with the Union Minister and Ministers from various States and Union Territories, highlighted the unique challenges faced by Punjab and urged the Government of India to implement key policy reforms for the welfare of Scheduled Castes. She commended the Government of India for this initiative, emphasizing that each state has its own set of challenges and that this platform provides an opportunity for states to voice their specific concerns.



Cabinet Minister Dr. Baljit Kaur highlighted that Punjab has a Scheduled Caste population of nearly 32%, which may have further increased. Given this demographic, she stated that the gap-filling fund, currently set at Rs 20 lakh per project for villages under the Adarsh Gram Yojana, be increased to at least Rs 1 crore, as the existing allocation is insufficient for comprehensive infrastructure development, particularly for road construction. She also pointed out that the Social Justice Department relies on the Rural Development Department for implementing schemes, leading to administrative hurdles. To address this issue, she urged the Government of India to issue detailed guidelines for establishing a dedicated technical unit at the district and state levels under the Social Justice Department to ensure effective monitoring and implementation. Furthermore, she requested an increase in administrative charges from the existing 4% to 10% to cover expenses related to technical units and ensure smooth execution of welfare programs. Dr. Kaur also emphasized that states should be given autonomy in selecting villages for development projects, as they have better knowledge of ground realities. Additionally, she called for the widening of the scope of infrastructure projects, allowing states to decide on the type of development work based on local needs. She further requested that administrative charges be released in advance for selected villages so that necessary preparations can be made beforehand. Dr. Baljit Kaur also addressed concerns regarding the grant and aid component of skill development projects, stating that these projects take considerable time to execute. The existing requirement that 75% of the previous installment be utilized before new funds are released often causes delays in implementation. She urged the Government of India to relax this condition, particularly during election periods when administrative processes may slow down project execution. Another key demand was an increase in financial assistance for beneficiaries, from Rs 50,000 to Rs 1,00,000, as the current amount is inadequate compared to other schemes, such as the Pradhan Mantri Employment Generation Scheme.

Jalandhar commissionerate police uncovers unit of manufacturing illegal weapons

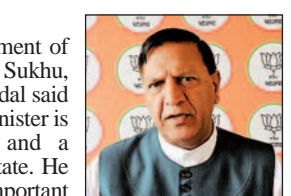
physical gaps but also enabling communities to stay connected to essential services and markets.

The dissolution of the assembly paves the way for the formation of a new

government in the national capital under the BJP's leadership.

"In exercise of the power conferred upon me by subsection (2)(b) of section 6 of the Government of National Capital Territory of Delhi Act, 1991, I, Vinai Kumar Saxena, Lieutenant Governor of Delhi, hereby dissolve the Seventh Legislative Assembly of the National Capital Territory of Delhi with effect from February 8, 2025," the LG order said.

Atishi, 43, had been serving as the Chief Minister of Delhi since September last year. The BJP secured a two-thirds majority bagging 48 out of 70 seats, while AAP's tally saw a massive drop to 22 from its previous tally of

62. Atishi, however, retained the Kalkaji seat after a hard-fought contest and defeated BJP's Ramesh Bidhuri by a margin of 3,521 votes.

Atishi's win in Kalkaji constituency stands out for AAP, especially as several of its top leaders, including former Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal and ex-Deputy CM Manish Sisodia, lost their constituencies.

BJP's Parvesh Verma emerged as a giant-killer in the assembly election with a decisive win of over 4,000 votes over former Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal in the New Delhi seat. The Congress, which was hoping for its revival in the national capital, again failed to win any seat.

Buffalo theft spree in Kalayat and Narwana, owners suspect use of sedatives

KALAYAT: Unknown thieves stole a buffalo and its calf from a cattle shed in Pijnjura village of Kalayat subdivision. Similar thefts were reported in Bhana and Gurthali villages of Narwana subdivision the same night. The incidents occurred between Saturday night and early Sunday morning. In his complaint to Kalayat police station, Pijnjura resident Pawan Kumar reported that he kept three buffaloes and a calf in a shed near his house on Matur Road, close to the National Highway Around 3 AM, he heard noises and upon checking, found the shed's lock broken and one buffalo along with its calf missing. CCTV footage revealed three to four masked men leading the buffalo away, with an Eicher truck parked nearby. The stolen buffalo is valued at approximately Rs. 1.5 lakh. Other cattle owners, including Pawan Kumar, Jai Bhagwan, Saleem, and Rajesh, suspect that the thieves used sedatives to subdue the animals, as the remaining buffaloes were found in a drowsy state for several hours. Investigating Officer SI Rajesh Kumar from Narwana Sadar Police Station confirmed similar thefts in Bhana and Gurthali villages, where two to three buffaloes were stolen. CCTV footage is being examined, and efforts are underway to apprehend the culprits.

EDITORIAL

Trump's bizarre plan

If United States President Donald Trump's statements on buying Greenland, annexing Canada and reclaiming the Panama Canal were not bizarre enough, here is an ultimate shocker from the maverick Republican leader. His latest formulation on the Gaza-American takeover and ownership of the war-torn territory, and packing off Palestinians to Egypt, Jordan and other countries takes the cake among all his weird public remarks. The astonishing proposal was made by Trump in the presence of Israeli Prime Minister Benjamin Netanyahu soon after their bilateral talks. No American President, even in their wildest dreams, could have thought that solving the Israel-Palestinian conflict would involve taking over a chunk of Palestinian territory and evicting its population.

The brazen proposal to 'take over the piece of land, develop it and create employment' is at best comical and at worst a grave violation of international law. No wonder that his plan was met with shock and condemnation across the world, including Arab nations and America's allies. Even for a President who spent much of his first term upending the US Middle East policy, including moving the US embassy from Tel Aviv to Jerusalem and recognising Israeli sovereignty over the occupied Golan Heights, this was an outrageous proposal. It came even as a ceasefire is underway between Hamas and Israel and amid questions about Gaza's post-conflict future. They signal the largest shift in the US policy on the Middle East in decades, upending widespread international consensus on the need for a Palestinian State, comprising Gaza and the occupied West Bank, to exist alongside Israel.

Trump's remarks sound more like opening gambits in a real estate negotiation than expressions of the settled policy of the United States. The plan to push two million Palestinians out of Gaza and take 'ownership' by force is nothing but ethnic cleansing and a death knell for an already fragile ceasefire. The absence of a plan for Gaza's future governance is already a fault line in the present arrangement. It goes without saying that the US has no legal claim to the territory and it is unclear how Trump intends to impose American rule. The international community must work to alleviate the severe suffering inflicted upon the Palestinian people, who will remain committed to their land and will not move from it.

Driven by the special incentive scheme, the production of mobile phones has increased from about 60 million mobile phones in 2014-15 to about 330 million mobile phones in 2023-24. This is more than 5 times increase in number of mobile phones manufactured over the last 10 years.

In value terms, the production of mobile phones has increased from a meagre Rs 19,000 crore in 2014-15 to Rs 422,000 crore in 2023-24 growing at a CAGR of 41 per cent.

"Due to policies of the government for promotion of electronics manufacturing, India has become a mobile phone exporter now from a mobile importing country in 2014-15," the minister said in the written reply.

Further, since the inception of the PLI Scheme for Large Scale Electronics Manufacturing, mobile phone exports have increased from Rs 22,868 crore in 2020-21 to Rs 129,074 crore in 2023-24 growing at a CAGR of 78 per cent.

Further, whereas in 2015,

74 per cent of all mobile phones sold in India were imported, India has now reached a point where 99.2 per cent of the mobile handsets being used in India are made in India.

Apart from manufacturing mobile phones, manufacturing of various electronic components/sub-assemblies for mobile phones such as batteries, chargers, PCBA, camera modules, display module, enclosures, USB Cable, Ferrite, and Glass covers has also started in India, the minister apprised the upper house through his

reply. "This clearly indicates that the complete ecosystem for mobile phone manufacturing is developing in the country. The existing component manufacturers are expanding their existing capacity and new players are also exploring India as a potential market," said the minister.

The government also recognises the contribution of small players producing mainly for domestic markets.

The domestic mobile phone manufacturers under the PLI Scheme have made a cumulative investment of Rs 787 crore, leading to cumulative production of Rs 34,111 crore and generating additional employment of 25,288 (direct jobs) till December 2024.

"As the scheme is performing well, no changes in this scheme are anticipated at present," the minister's reply concluded.

Musk criticises US govt payment systems

Elon Musk, the CEO of Tesla and SpaceX, on Sunday voiced strong concerns about the US government's payment systems, revealing troubling 'inefficiencies' and potential 'fraud' worth over USD 100 billion every year.



To be clear, what the @DOGE team and @USTreasury have jointly agreed makes sense is the following:

In a post on X, Musk said that the Treasury Department and his Department of Government Efficiency have reached an agreement changing reporting requirements for all outgoing government payments.

The government payments will now have a 'payment categorization code' for auditing purposes, he wrote in a post on X.

Highlighting key reforms that need to be implemented, he stated, "Require that all outgoing government payments have a payment categorization code, which is necessary in order to pass financial audits. This is frequently left blank, making audits almost impossible."

"All payments must also include a rationale for the payment in the comment field, which is currently left blank. Importantly, we are not yet applying ANY judgment to this rationale, but simply requiring that SOME attempt be made to explain the payment more than NOTHING!," he added.

Further, Musk raised the implementation of the "DO-NOT-PAY list", which identifies entities involved in fraudulent activities and called for the list to be updated at least weekly, if not daily.

"The DO-NOT-PAY list of entities known to be fraudulent or people who are dead or are probable fronts for terrorist organizations or do not match Congressional appropriations must actually be implemented and not ignored. Also, it can currently take up to a year to get on this list, which is far too long. This list should be updated at least weekly, if not daily," he said.

Centre has no proposal to bring nano fertilizers under PLI scheme

The government has no proposal to bring the production of nano fertilizers under the Production Linked Incentive (PLI) scheme, MoS chemicals and fertilisers Anupriya Patel informed Lok Sabha this week.

As part of its 'Atmanirbhar Bharat' and 'Make in India' plan, the government launched production incentive (PLI) schemes in over a dozen sectors in 2020, to make Indian manufacturers globally competitive, attract investments, enhance exports, integrate India into the global supply chain and reduce dependency on imports.

The minister was asked to respond whether the government intends to bring in a Production-Linked Incentive scheme for promoting the production of Nano Fertilisers by the private sector.

Use of nano urea is promoted through different activities such as awareness camps, webinars, nukkad natak, field demonstrations, Kisan Sammelans and films



in regional languages, the minister supplemented in her written reply.

"Spraying of nano fertilizers through drones has emerged as a cost-effective method. During the Viksit Bharat Sankalp Yatra, farmers had shown interest in adopting this new technology of spraying," the minister said in her written reply. Nano Urea and Nano DAP are made available at Pradhan Mantri Kisan Samridhi Kendras (PMKSKs) by concerned companies.

The minister also said that there is no provision for subsidy on nano urea by the Department of Fertilizers. However, the department is encouraging its companies to set up nano fertilizer plants.

"Nano Fertilizers are still in the initial state of experimentation and the increase in sales and subsequent impact of Nano Fertilizers on conventional Urea depends on the level of adoption of Nano Fertilizers by the farmers.

China: 29 people missing after landslide in Sichuan

As many as 29 people remain missing after a landslide in Southwest China's Sichuan province on Saturday, Global Times reported citing a press conference held on Sunday morning. The number of the missing people is still being verified as rescue operation is being conducted there.

A landslide occurred at Jinping village in Junlian county in China's Sichuan province at around 11:50 am (local time) on Saturday. A press conference was held in Yibin on Sunday to provide updates regarding the rescue efforts.

As of Saturday, 10 residential houses and one production facility were buried and two injured people have been rescued, including one seriously injured and one with minor injuries. The injured people were undergoing



treatment at the Junlian County People's Hospital and are not in life-threatening condition, according to the officials.

Chinese President Xi Jinping has ordered all-out search and rescue efforts to minimise casualties following the landslide, Global Times reported. Xi called for efforts to properly handle the aftermath. He emphasised boosting monitoring and early warning, ensuring the rescue work is conducted scientifically, and preventing the occurrence of secondary disasters.

Xi said that all areas and relevant departments must bolster their efforts to uncover hidden risks related to various kinds of disasters and workplace safety, resolutely stop the occurrence of serious and major disasters and accidents and effectively protect

the lives of people and property.

After the disaster occurred, the local health department immediately activated its emergency response, sending media personnel and ambulances to the spot for medical rescue efforts, according to National Health Commission, Global Times reported. Commission officials and the officials from the State Council have reached the area to strengthen the guidance and coordination of medical treatment.

As of 7 pm (local time) on Saturday, two injured people were admitted to the hospital for observation and treatment. Search and rescue operations are underway at the site. According to initial assessments, the disaster was caused by continuous rainfall and geological conditions, resulting in high-level landslide

that transformed into a debris flow, causing a debris accumulation. The landslide is about 10-20 metres thick and 100 metres wide, with a volume over 100,000 cubic metres.

Over 200 people at risk have been evacuated, with 155 people concentrated at a temporary shelter set up at Junlian County Second Middle School, Global Times reported, citing conference. Emergency dining facilities have been created and 30 emergency generators, 100 cotton tents, 400 disaster relief beds, and 1,100 cotton quilts have been provided to ensure the basic living needs of the people who have been evacuated, including food, accommodation, and heating. Others have been accommodated through staying with relatives or friends.

The Proteas team are currently featuring in the tri-nation ODI series along with Pakistan and New Zealand in Pakistan. Their first match of the series is against the Kiwis side at the Gaddafi Stadium in Lahore on February 10 and after that, they will lock horns with Men in Green at the National Stadium, Karachi on February 12.
