## NEWS BRIEFS

**31.52 lakh MT wheat, 4.93 lakh MT mustard procured in Hry**

**CHANDIGARH:** The procurement of crops is progressing rapidly during the Rabi marketing season in Haryana. A total of 31.52 lakh metric tonnes (MT) of wheat has been procured across the state since April 1. Out of this, 8.59 lakh metric tonnes of wheat has been lifted. A government spokesperson said till now, wheat has been procured from more than 2 lakh farmers and an amount of Rs 1400 crore has been transferred directly to the farmers' bank accounts. Last year, 18.24 lakh metric tonnes of wheat was procured till April 16. The purchase of mustard has been started in the state from March 15 during the Rabi marketing season 2025-26. The work of purchasing mustard is being done by two procurement agencies in the state - HAFED and Haryana Warehousing Corporation.

## Waqf Act case: SC directs Centre to file response within a week

The Supreme Court on Thursday directed the Centre to file its stand within a week in the challenge to Waqf (Amendment) Act, 2025 after it was assured by the union government that 'waqf by user' or 'waqf by deed' properties won't be denotified till the next hearing.

A bench comprising Chief Justice Sanjiv Khanna and Justices Sanjay Kumar and K V Viswanathan also recorded the assurance of solicitor general Tushar Mehta, representing the Centre, that no appointments in the central Waqf council and boards will be made in the meantime.

Mehta said the government won't denotify "waqf by deed" and "waqf by user" properties till the next hearing.

The CJ said if registration of any waqf property had taken place under the erstwhile 1995 Act, then those properties can't be denotified till the next hearing on May 5.

The bench passed the order after Mehta sought a week's time to file a preliminary response to the pleas against the new-



ly-amended waqf law.

"If your lordships will say something about 'waqf by user', what will be the fallout?" he asked.

The bench, on the other hand, said it was impossible to deal with a number of pleas on the issue and clarified it would only hear five of them while asking lawyers to decide among themselves who would argue.

The petitioners, the bench said, could file their rejoinders to the Centre's reply within five days of the service of the government's response.

On behalf of the petitioners against the amendment, senior counsel Kapil Sibal, AM Singhvi, Rajiv Dhavan wanted the Bench to ensure that waqf under waqf-by-user should also be protected.

Finally, the CJ dictated the order that recorded the Solicitor General's assurance given to the top court.

"During the course of hearing Solicitor General Tushar Mehta states that the respondents (Centre and others) would like to file a short reply within

seven days and assured that till next date no appointment shall take place to the (waqf) board and (waqf) councils under the 2025 Act. He also assures that waqfs including waqf-by-user already declared by notification or gazetted .. their status shall not be changed. We take the statement on record. Let the reply be filed within seven days. Reply to that be filed within five days of the service," the Bench ordered. Noting that it's impossible to deal with 100 or 120 petitions, the Bench said it will only deal with five petitions and would treat others as "disposed of" or as "applicants".

**CRPF 'backbone' of mission to rid country of Naxalism by March 2026: Shah**

**NEEMUCH :** Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Thursday said that Naxalism, which is confined to just four districts in India, will be eliminated by March 31 next year, and the CRPF is the "backbone" of this mission. He was addressing the Central Reserve Police Force's (CRPF) 86th Raising Day function in Madhya Pradesh's Neemuch district.

"Naxalism has been confined to just four districts in India. The menace will end in the country by March 31, 2026, as stated by Prime Minister Narendra Modi. The CAPF (Central Armed Police Forces) and the CRPF, especially its CoBRA battalion, are playing a major role in eliminating Naxalism from the country," he said. The Commando Battalion for Resolute Action (CoBRA) is a specialised unit of the CRPF, known for its proficiency in guerrilla .

**Amid language row in Tamil Nadu, Hindi made compulsory in Maha**

The "Hindi imposition" row has spread from the south to Maharashtra, with the state government's move to introduce Hindi as a compulsory third language for the primary section in Marathi and English-medium schools. The Opposition Congress and Raj Thackeray's Maharashtra Navnirman Sena had voiced strong objections.

MNS chief Raj Thackeray, in a post on X, slammed today's order as well as the Centre's

three-language policy. Mr Thackeray - whose party wants a "Marathi first" policy - had spoken out about south's resistance against Hindi earlier too, saying Maharashtra should follow their example. Today's post from the MNS chief, though, was far sharper and directly targeted the Centre. "Whatever your trilingual formula is, limit it to government affairs, do not bring it to education," he wrote. The MNS, he added, "will not allow the Central government's current efforts to 'Hindi-ify' everything, to succeed in this state".

## Robert Vadra appears before ED on 3rd day

**NEW DELHI:** Robert Vadra, the businessman brother-in-law of Leader of Opposition in Lok Sabha Rahul Gandhi, appeared before the ED on the third straight day on Thursday for questioning in a money laundering case linked to alleged irregularities in a 2008 Haryana land deal case. The 56-year-old has been questioned for over ten hours in the last two days as part of the investigation and the recording of his statement process under the Prevention of Money Laundering Act (PMLA) will continue Thursday, officials said. He reached the ED of office in central Delhi shortly after 11 am accompanied by his wife Priyanka Gandhi Vadra, who is MP from Wayanad.

## Gold hits all-time high at Rs 98,100



**NEW DELHI:** Gold prices soared by Rs 1,650 to hit an all-time high of Rs 98,100 per 10 grams in the national capital on Wednesday amid a global rush for the safe-haven asset triggered by an escalated trade war between the US and China. According to the All India Sarafa Association, the precious metal of 99.9 per cent purity had finished at Rs 96,450 per 10 grams on Tuesday. Gold prices logged the highest single-day gain since April 11 when the spot rates skyrocketed by Rs 6,250 per 10 grams -- the record steepest single day rise so far -- in the local markets.

## SAD names PS Ghuman for Ludhiana West assembly bypoll

**CHANDIGARH:** The Shiromani Akali Dal on Thursday announced Parupkar Singh Ghuman as its candidate for the Ludhiana West assembly bypoll. Ghuman is a lawyer and the former president of Ludhiana bar association, party leader Daljit Singh Cheema said. He said party president Sukhbir Singh Badal had a detailed discussion with senior party leaders including all sitting and former municipal councilors of the area before announcing Ghuman's name.

## Markets surge for 4th day; Sensex reclaims 78k-level


**MUMBAI:** Benchmark indices Sensex and Nifty surged nearly 2 per cent on Thursday, registering their fourth day of rally as investors turned buoyant after foreign investors returned to domestic equities amid expectations of a breakthrough in US-Japan trade negotiations over reciprocal tariffs. The 30-share BSE benchmark Sensex jumped 1,508.91 points.



VB unearths scam involving bribes for issuing fake dope test reports

Acting on a complaint filed on the Chief Minister's Anti-Corruption Action Line, the VB arrested two accused – Manpreet Singh alias Sonu, a ward attendant, and Bholu alias Ismail, a contractual computer operator, for accepting Rs 10000. The role of Dr. Mohitpal, posted in the said hospital and a contractual laboratory technician, Maan Singh, is under investigation. Disclosing this here today an official spokesperson of the state VB said investigation has revealed that the aforementioned accused had demanded and accepted Rs. 10,000 from the complainant to issue him a negative dope test report. Further probe indicated that the accused were routinely accepting bribes to manipulate dope test results, which were then used for arms license applications or during renewals. The complainant provided evidence of the bribe demand and both the positive and falsified negative reports. He further added that in this regard a case FIR No. 19 dated 17/04/2025 has been registered under Sections 7 and 7A of the Prevention of Corruption Act and Section 61(2) of the BNS at the VB police station, Jalandhar range.

# Aman Arora slams Bajwa for irresponsible remarks, demands clarification from Congress

In a strongly-worded press conference, Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) Punjab President Aman Arora sharply criticized Congress Leader of Opposition (LOP) Partap Bajwa for making reckless statements that threaten Punjab's peace and align with the agenda of the state's adversaries. He further called out the Congress party and the BJP for their failure to clarify their positions on these provocative remarks, particularly those endorsed by controversial figures like Gurpatwant Pannun.

Arora, addressing the media with AAP senior spokesperson Neel Garg, said that certain political leaders (Referring to Partap Bajwa), desperate to revive their fading political relevance, are resorting to reckless and dangerous statements. "These politicians, instead of addressing the



real issues of the people, are engaging in baseless rhetoric to further their own political agendas. He pointed out that such actions not only undermine the state's security but also create fear and panic among the people.

Arora criticized Pratap Bajwa for his statements regarding grenades allegedly entering Punjab, which he had earlier claimed in a media in-

terview. Bajwa had linked these claims to intelligence reports, asserting that his sources were credible, though he later admitted that his information had come from a newspaper report. Arora stated, "If Bajwa had simply acknowledged that his source was a news article from 'Dainik Bhaskar,' the situation would have ended there. Instead, he chose to make sensa-

tional claims and spread fear." Arora further expressed disappointment that Bajwa, despite being a seasoned politician, failed to act responsibly and undermined public trust in state institutions. "Bajwa's comments have fueled fear and confusion. He also highlighted the High Court's direction for Bajwa to cooperate with the Punjab Police and refrain from making further inflammatory statements.

Aman Arora also condemned the fact that extremist elements such as Gurpatwant Pannu had used Bajwa's comments to justify their own anti-national rhetoric.

Arora pointed out that Pannu, who had previously threatened to destroy statues of Dr. B.R. Ambedkar in Punjab, had now echoed Bajwa's claims. "When leaders like Bajwa make such statements, it emboldens anti-national forces like Pannu, who then use the opportunity to further their

own divisive agenda," Arora stated. Arora issued a strong challenge to both Congress and BJP, demanding that they clarify their positions on the issue. "Congress must answer whether they stand with Bajwa's dangerous remarks and the support shown by Gurpatwant Pannun. The BJP, meanwhile, must take action against those who are actively working against the peace and stability of the country," he said. He also raised concerns about the silence of the Indian government, particularly Narendra Modi who claims to be friends with Donald Trump, regarding the actions of Gurpatwant Pannun, who resides in the United States and continues to incite violence against Punjab and its people. "Why hasn't the Indian government raised this issue with the U.S. authorities? Why has there been no diplomatic pressure to bring Pannun to justice?" Arora questioned.

Earlier, the lack of indoor facilities at veterinary polyclinics presented challenges for livestock farmers, particularly after major animal surgeries. The risk of damaged stitch lines, opened stitches, toxemia, and even animal death was a significant concern. Farmers often lacked suitable means to get their animals treated. To

Power generation begins from all four units of NHPC's Parbati Hydroelectric Project, Stage-II

CHANDIGARH: NHPC has successfully achieved the commercial operation of the fourth and final unit of the Parbati-II Project on 16th April 2025 at 00:00 hrs. Earlier, on 1st April 2025, three units of the project had successfully commenced commercial operation. With this, NHPC has completed the construction of this ambitious national project.

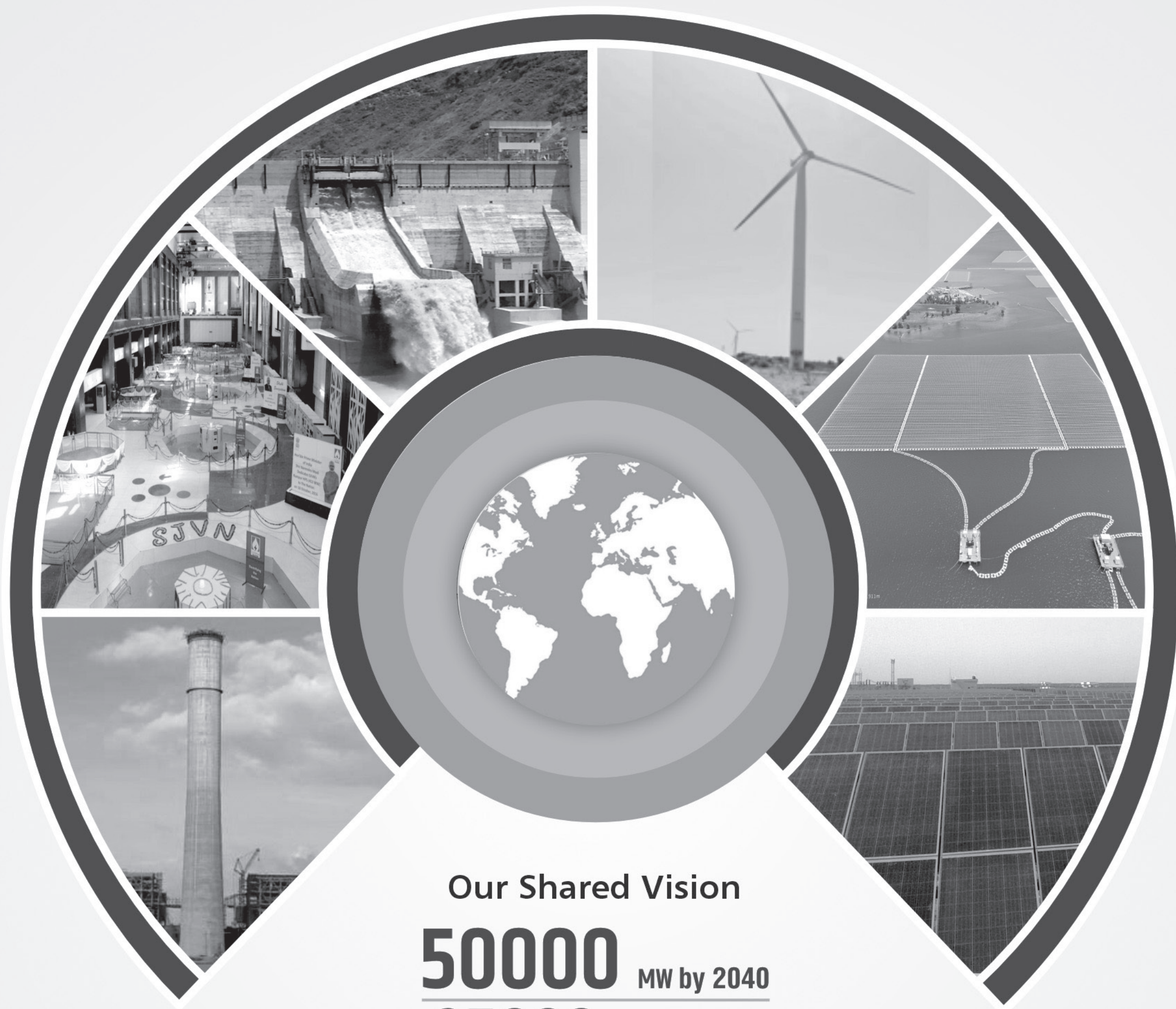
The Parbati HE Project, Stage-II with an installed capacity of 800 MW (4 X 200 MW) is a run of the river scheme with small pondage constructed on river Parbati in Dist. Kullu of Himachal Pradesh. The river Parbati has been diverted by constructing a 83.7 m high concrete gravity dam near Village Pulga in Manikaran valley and water is being carried through a 31.56 km long Head Race Tunnel to Sainj valley where the Power House has been constructed at village Siund. A gross head of 863 m between Pulga and Siund is being utilized for generating 800 MW power. Discharge of five Nallahs falling along the HRT alignment has further augmented the discharge of the river Parbati. The Power House has 4 Pelton turbines of 200 MW each. The 31.56 km long HRT of the Project is the longest hydropower tunnel in India.

# 130.69 MT of wheat reaches Sadhaura grain market

wheat has been sold. The arrival may increase in the coming days. For this reason, lifting is also going on continuously in between so that the farmers do not face any problem in bringing the crop to the market.

## Officers should work with the aim of zero incidents of crop residue burning: Kapil Kumar

**YAGYADUTT SHASTRI PEHOWA:** Sub-Divisional Officer Civil Kapil Kumar said that a FIR would be registered against those who set crop residues on fire during the Rabi season. Along with this FIR, a fine of rupees five thousand to thirty thousand will also be imposed for setting fire to crop residues.

SDM Kapil Kumar said that the administration has been working with the aim of not allowing even a single incident of crop residue burning in the Rabi season. A complete plan has been prepared to achieve this goal. Under this scheme, the BDPO will ensure that every Gram Panchayat buys a super seeder machine and rolling machines at the cluster level. He said that if machines were available to farmers then incidents of burning residues will definitely de-

crease. All officers will keep a close watch on those villages where more cases of crop residue burning have been reported in the past years. He said that crop residue burning not only has an adverse effect on the land but also harmful to animals, birds, plants, trees and human life.

He said that as per the order of the Supreme Court, an FIR will be registered against anyone who sets fire to crop residues. Along with FIR, the administration will also impose fine against those who set fire to crop residues. As per the government order, a fine of Rs. 5000 will be imposed for setting fire to crop residues up to two acres, Rs. 10000 for setting fire to crop residues from two to five acres and Rs. 30000 for setting fire to crop residues more than five acres.

Instead of putting teachers on duty in this program, this work should be done by unemployed and educated youth or NGOs so that teachers can give more time to schools and the education level can be improved.

Editorial

Twin concerns

The right to privacy safeguards individuals against unwarranted intrusions while the right to information enables citizens to hold State officials accountable. Both rights are fundamental pillars of a functioning democracy. Yet, these two rights can be pitted against each other. For instance, there is now concern that Section 44(3) of the Digital Personal Data Protection Act, 2023 — it will come into effect once the rules are notified — intends to change Section 8(1)(j) of the Right to Information Act, exempting all “personal information” from disclosure. This means that any public information that also contains ‘personal information’ — the name of a contractor who gets a government tender to build a public bridge, for instance — will no longer be made public. The vague definition of ‘personal information’ might be further exploited to issue blanket refusals for RTI queries. But the Supreme Court had, in its right to judgment on privacy, made it clear that the rights to privacy and transparency must be reconciled in law. This is exactly what Section 8(1)(j) of the RTI Act does by setting up a ‘public interest test’ for all information. Anything that requires transparency in public interest thus cannot be kept private. Of course, attempts to weaken the RTI Act are not new; India’s powers that be are allergic to transparency. In 2019, the conditions for appointing the chief information commissioner were changed to make the position indirectly dependent on the goodwill of the ruling regime. Reports suggest that vacancies in the various Information Commissions across the country are not filled, slowing down responses to RTI queries. Budgetary constraints — the sum allocated to the Central Information Commission was cut by 63% in 2018 and a further 44% in 2021 — also curb the effectiveness of the RTI Act.

Dealing a blow to the RTI Act ostensibly in the name of privacy merits scrutiny. That the DPDP Act itself gives short shrift to citizens’ right to privacy should not evade examination either. One of the most troubling provisions of the DPDP Act is Section 17(2)(a). This allows the Centre to exempt its agencies from the law’s provisions, thereby giving the latter unfettered access to citizens’ personal data. This, in turn, undermines the core principle of protecting the data of individuals. Clause 18(4) further exempts any State authority from deletion of data after use; this, in effect, allows it to store personal data indefinitely, tilting the law against the interests of individual privacy. The DPDP Act’s protective architecture towards the concept of privacy must be reassessed along with its conflict with the RTI.

California Governor, Attorney file lawsuit to end Trump’s tariffs

California Governor Gavin Newsom and California Attorney General Rob Bonta filed a lawsuit in federal court challenging United States President Donald Trump’s authority to impose sweeping tariffs.

Newsom and Bonta have filed a lawsuit in the United States District Court for the Northern District of California, requesting that the court declare the tariffs imposed by Trump void and enjoin their implementation.

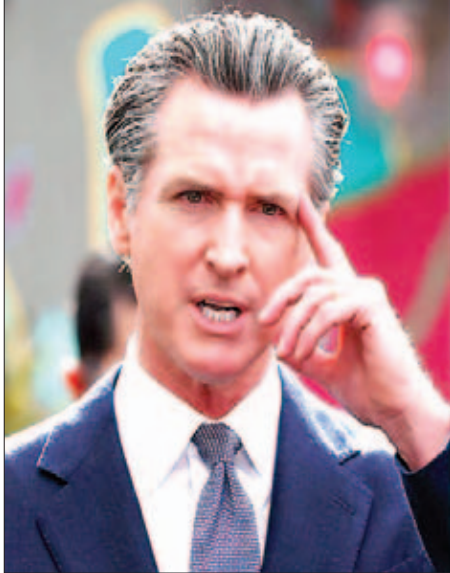
The lawsuit argues that Trump lacks the authority to unilaterally impose tariffs through the International Economic Emergency Powers Act, creating immediate and irreparable harm to California.

The statement issued on Wednesday said, “Governor Gavin Newsom and California Attorney General Rob Bonta today filed a lawsuit in federal court challenging President Trump’s use of emergency powers to enact broad-sweeping tariffs that hurt states, consumers, and businesses.”

“The lawsuit argues that President Trump lacks the authority to unilaterally impose tariffs through the International Economic Emergency Powers Act, creating immediate and irreparable harm to California, the largest economy, manufacturing, and agriculture state in the nation,” it added.

According to the statement, these tariffs have disrupted supply chains, inflated costs for the state and people of California and caused damages worth billions on California’s economy.

In the statement, Newsom said, “President Trump’s unlawful tariffs are wreaking chaos on California families, businesses, and our economy — driving up prices and threatening jobs. We’re standing up for American families who can’t afford to let the chaos continue.”



Rob Bonta stressed that Trump’s implementation of tariffs is “deeply troubling and illegal.” He said that people of California are bracing for fallout from the effect of choices made by US President.

“The President’s chaotic and haphazard implementation of tariffs is not just a game. Californians are bracing for fallout from the impact of the President’s choices — from farmers in the Central Valley, to small businesses in Sacramento, and worried families at the kitchen table — this game the President is playing has very real consequences for Californians across our state. I am proud to go to bat alongside Governor Newsom to fight for California’s vibrant economy, businesses, and residents,” Bonta said in a statement.

The statement said, “The lawsuit argues that President Trump lacks the authority to unilaterally impose tariffs against Mexico, China, and Canada or create an across-the-board 10% tariff. The President’s use of the International Economic Emergency Powers Act (IEEPA) to enact tariffs is unlawful and unprecedented.”

The IEEPA gives Trump authorities to take certain actions if he declares a national emergency in response to a foreign national security, foreign policy, or economic threat. Enacted by Congress in 1977, the law specifies many different actions the President can take. However, tariffs is not one of them. In fact, US President has for the first time tried to rely on this law to impose tariffs.

iffs, according to the statement.

The statement said, “The lawsuit invokes the US Supreme Court’s major questions doctrine, which holds that in novel matters of vast economic and political significance, federal agencies and the executive branch must have clear and specific authorization from Congress. In recent years, the Court has applied this standard to strike down major initiatives, including President Obama’s Clean Power Plan and President Biden’s student loan forgiveness program, ruling that novel executive actions with broad impacts on the national economy cannot rest on vague statutory authority.”

Earlier this month, Donald Trump imposed reciprocal tariffs on dozens of countries with which the country has a trade deficit. Later, he decided to pause the tariffs for 90 days after many countries initiated talks with the US administration for a trade deal.

According to a fact sheet released by the White House, China’s retaliatory actions have resulted in up to a 245 per cent tariff on imports to the United States. Prior to the latest revision, a 145 per cent tariff was being levied on Chinese exports to the United States.

Trump unveiled the “Fair and Reciprocal Plan” on trade to restore fairness in US trade relationships and counter non-reciprocal trade agreements. Trump’s reciprocal tariffs have led to a broad-based fall in financial markets globally, with markets plunging in Asia and Europe. The reciprocal tariffs have set off a sell-off in equities globally, and the US itself is no exception.

Since assuming office for his second term, President Trump has reiterated his stance on tariff reciprocity, emphasising that the United States will match tariffs imposed by other countries, including India, to ensure fair trade.

Literature & Health

Historical artefacts of 16-17 centuries found in Moscow

Near the Church of Elijah the Prophet of Obydenny in the centre of the capital, archaeologists have discovered the rarest find of the 16th-early 17th century - a double-sided seal-matrix. This is reported by the official portal of the Moscow Mayor and Moscow Government, according to TV BRICS.

On one side it shows a lion, on the other - a warrior with a sword and dagger, but not in full height, as it was customary, and at the waist.

This format is extremely rare and may shed light on the peculiarities of local symbolism of the late Middle Ages.

In Obydenskie street the researchers also found an overlay of coloured metal of the XVII century with the image of a lion. According to experts, such elements could have served as decorations for belts or bags. All artefacts will be transferred to

museums. According to Moscow Mayor Sergey Sobyanin, over the past 14 years, the



capital’s researchers have found more than 120 thousand unique items, with more than 47 thousand of them added to the museum fund over the past five years.

Fitch Ratings lowers world growth forecast due to escalation in global trade war

Fitch Ratings has sharply lowered its forecasts for world growth in response to the severe escalation in the global trade war, lowering world growth in 2025 by 0.4pp and China and US growth by 0.5pp, according to its quarterly Global Economic Outlook report.

The report added that the US annual growth in 2025 is expected to remain positive at 1.2 per cent but will slow to a crawl through the year to just 0.4 per cent y-o-y in fourth quarter of 2025. China’s growth is forecast to fall below 4 per cent this year and next while eurozone growth will remain stuck well below 1 per cent, the report said.

As per the report, the



world growth is projected to fall below 2 per cent this year, which would be the weakest since 2009, excluding the pandemic.

The Fitch ratings said that the US ‘Liberation Day’ tariff hikes were far worse than expected. While subsequently paused and replaced with a near-universal 10 per cent rate for 90 days, the shock prompted several rounds of retaliatory moves between China and the US, taking bilateral

tariff rates over 100 per cent, the report added.

The US average effective tariff rate (ETR) has risen to 23 per cent, the highest since 1909 and well above the 18 per cent we assumed in March. It is hard to predict US trade policy with any confidence, but we now assume the US ETR on China remains above 100 per cent for some time, before falling back to 60 per cent next year, the report added.

Why India's first national cooperative university matters

The passage of the bill for India’s first national cooperative university, Tribhuvan Sahkari University, in Parliament marks a historic milestone in the journey of the Indian cooperative movement. That this development comes during the 2025 International Year of Cooperatives only adds to its significance. As Union Minister for Cooperation Shri. Amit Shah noted, this university is poised to become a powerful vehicle in realizing the vision of “Sahkar Se Samridhih”- “Prosperity Through Cooperation.”

India is home to the largest cooperative movement in the world, comprising over 800,000 cooperatives and 287 million members. Deeply embedded in the daily lives of people-from roti, kapda, to makan (food, clothing, and shelter) - cooperatives are more than just economic institutions; they represent an expression of community-driven development, economic equity, and social justice. The establishment of the Ministry of Cooperation (MoC) in 2021 signaled a renewed national commitment to this sector, aimed at expanding its reach, improving its efficiency, and integrating it as a cornerstone of inclusive development.

Ministry of Cooperation has taken commendable steps: allocating ₹2,516 crore to computerize 67,390 Primary Agricultural Credit Societies (PACS), introducing model byelaws adopted in 32 states to enable over 25 business activities, creating 2 lakh new multipurpose cooperatives, support-

ing 1,100 Farmer Producer Organizations (FPOs), and transforming 44,000 PACS into Common Service Centers. Tax incentives, easier access to credit, and decentralized storage solutions are enhancing cooperatives’ operational capacities. The establishment of three new national federations for seeds, exports, and organic products further signal that cooperatives are being positioned as key agents of India’s development.

Yet, for all its scale and reach, the cooperative sector’s education and training infrastructure remains fragmented, underdeveloped, and unevenly distributed. The demand for qualified professionals-from managerial and administrative to technical and operational-is far outpacing the available supply. Equally critical is the need to invest in the capacity-building of existing employees and board members, many of whom lack access to regular training or structured learning opportunities. Without standardized curricula, quality assurance, and institutional coherence, the sector cannot fully realize its potential or sustain its growth. There is also a pressing need to attract newer and younger generations to the cooperative movement-individuals



who are not only professionally equipped but also inspired by cooperative values and driven to innovate within the sector. This is where Tribhuvan Sahkari University can play a transformative role: by serving as a hub for education, training, and research that builds capacity across all levels while fostering a new generation of cooperative leaders.

Named after Shri. Tribhuvandas Patel, the visionary architect of the AMUL model, and based in Anand, the cradle of India’s dairy cooperative revolution, the university is as much a symbolic tribute as it is a strategic intervention. The choice of the Institute of Rural Management Anand (IRMA)-an institution that has pioneered cooperative management education for decades-as the foundation for this university is both practical and inspired. With IRMA designated as a Centre of Excellence, the university will build on a strong legacy of producing professionals equipped to address the challenges and opportunities of cooperative enterprises.

The vision of the university will go further, beyond just those seeking formal management degrees. It will extend its reach to board members of primary and secondary cooperatives, employees across functional areas, and the new generation of

youth interested in ethical, sustainable, and inclusive business models. The university will support this through flexible learning modules, certification programs, degree offerings, digital access, and field-based research-all rooted in cooperative values of self-help, democratic control, and mutual responsibility.

Importantly, the university can also serve as a national knowledge platform, facilitating dialogue among stakeholders, providing evidence-based policy insights, and supporting innovations tailored to rural realities. With India’s diverse cooperative landscape-spanning dairy, credit, housing, fisheries, textiles, and more-the university has the potential to act as a converging space for multidisciplinary expertise, linking academia, practitioners, and policymakers.

Globally, cooperative education has been foundational to the success of cooperative movements. As far back as the Rochdale Pioneers in 1844, the original rules of conduct included allocating a portion of profits to education. The fifth Cooperative Principle-Education, Training and Information-remains a core pillar of the movement, ensuring that members, leaders, and the broader community understand and uphold the cooperative model. It is this deep-rooted educational tradition that sustains cooperative governance, fosters innovation, and strengthens accountability.

In this context, Tribhuvan Sahkari University

can be more than just an academic institution-it can become a national and global knowledge hub for cooperative development, a space where practice meets policy, and learning fuels leadership. At the ICA Global Cooperative Conference held in New Delhi, Prime Minister Shri. Narendra Modi called on India to lead the Global South in uniting cooperatives to build shared platforms, tackle common challenges, and collectively chart a path forward. The national university offers just such a platform-capable of nurturing dialogue, sharing best practices, and strengthening south-south cooperation among cooperatives.

In a world that is increasingly seeking inclusive, democratic, and sustainable economic models, India’s cooperative movement-and now its first cooperative university-offers not just inspiration but direction. The university must rise to this moment by being accessible, innovative, and impact-driven, fostering leadership at every level of the movement. The foundation has been laid; it is now time to build an institution worthy of the vision it represents-one that will educate, empower, and energize generations to come through the enduring power of cooperation - and ensure cooperatives build a better future for all.

Anil Vij unveils new vision for discoms to transform Haryana's energy sector

In an effort to bring quick transformation to Haryana's energy sector and take it to new heights, Energy Minister Anil Vij has given new mantras to the state's discoms and issued various directives to concerned officers/officials. These directives aim to ensure uninterrupted and full-voltage electricity is available to citizens 24/7. Vij said that 39,477 wrong bills were generated by UHBVN and 18,240 by DHBVN. These will be corrected within the next month. Additionally, an online portal will be developed to track the status of pending electricity theft cases and facilitate their payments, including options like SMS-based payment. An awareness campaign will also be launched soon in rural areas to encourage timely payment of electricity bills, he asserted.

Vij shared that the total defaulting amount is Rs.538.13 crores for UHBVN and Rs.1,500 crores for DHBVN. Targets have



been set for their recovery under which Rs.100 crore in April, Rs. 200 crore in May, Rs.238 crore in June 2025 by the UHBVN and Rs. 300 crore in April, Rs. 600 crore in May, Rs. 600 crore in June 2025 by the DHBVN. During the review meeting, Sh. Vij gave directives related to reducing power company losses, preventing electricity theft, replacing faulty transformers, ensuring consumer facilities, recovering pending dues, tracking defaulter connections, linking consumer Aadhaar numbers with electricity connections, correcting wrong bills, organizing Bijli

Adalats, improving infrastructure, monitoring call centers and spreading awareness through various mediums.

Presiding over the meeting, Sh. Vij instructed officers/officials to coordinate with relevant government departments and submit files at the HQ level for the swift recovery of defaulting amount from government connections. He also directed that in the case of old PDCO (permanent disconnection order) legacy defaulters, notices should be issued in the first phase to those who owe over Rs. 80,000 in UHBVN and over Rs.1 lakh in

DHBVN under the Land Recovery Act. In old PDCO cases (Legacy defaulters), it has been reported by the field officers that actual pending amount is far less than the amount reflected in the statement due to duplicate bills in R-APDRP system. It has been directed that duplicate bills/ inflated bills be identified and corrected on priority.

The Energy Minister directed that defaulter consumers who have taken new connections in other subdivisions while staying at the same premises be traced. He also emphasized that there should be no defaulters in the industrial, NDS, and DS (urban) categories and that Aadhaar linking for all domestic consumers must be ensured. Regular field checks should be carried out for PDCO consumers to prevent unauthorized use or theft of electricity. To resolve bill-related grievances, Sh. Vij directed that Bijli Adalats be held at the circle level every Tuesday. Each Superintending Engineer must ensure that all billing complaints are addressed and resolved.

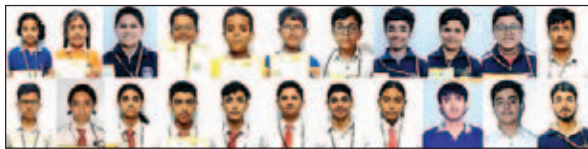
Surprise inspection conducted at Ladwa extension mandi following farmers' complaints

According to PWD officials, the contentious land was legally acquired by the department in 1974 and officially recorded in its name. The acquisition papers bear the name of an elderly woman who is still alive, affirming the transaction. However, in 2009, Rajkant's mother, Seema Devi, allegedly purchased this land, despite the road having already been expanded into a double lane — a clear indication, claim officials, of its public utility status. PWD officials blame the Revenue Department for transferring ownership to Seema Devi, despite the land being earmarked for road infrastructure. "The fault lies in the revenue records.

FRA uproar in Himachal: After activists, leader Deman, PCCF withdraw letter

The Forest Rights Act (FRA) implementation in Himachal Pradesh has ignited statewide backlash after a controversial letter by the state's Principal Chief Conservator of Forests (PCCF) was sent to district officials questioning the recognition of forest rights. Environmental and social organisations, along with forest rights activists, have slammed the letter as "misleading, colonial in tone, and contrary to the constitutional spirit of the FRA." In a powerful show of



dissent, over 20 grassroots and environmental groups have demanded the immediate withdrawal of the letter, warning it undermines the constitutional authority of the Ministry of Tribal Affairs and the State Level Monitoring Committee (SLMC). They argue that the Forest

Department's objections to recognising community rights—especially of Other Traditional Forest Dwellers (OTFDs)—are legally baseless and socially divisive. Adding political weight to the protest, Former Parliamentarian and FRA drafting committee member Vrinda Karat has written to Chief Minister Sukhvinder Singh Sukhu, urging him to withdraw the PCCF's communication. Karat called it a direct assault on the FRA's integrity and a violation of the Supreme Court's directives and state's own affidavit submitted in 2016.

Disorder in bus routes at Uhal Chowk leaves passengers stranded

A new bypass road passing below the Tehsil building in Tauni Devi may have streamlined traffic for some, but it has created significant confusion and inconvenience for daily commuters at Uhal Chowk. According to passengers Kamal Chandel, Bihari Lal, Manoj, Kamlesh, Kamla, Surendra, and Banwari Lal, all buses bound for Kakker, Awah Devi, and Hamirpur should continue to pass through the old Uhal Chowk. Commuters expressed frustration over the fact that several long-route and private buses—including those to and from Hamirpur, Awah Devi, Delhi, Jungleberi, Shimla, and Haridwar—are bypassing Uhal Chowk entirely by taking the new road. While some buses on the



Shimla-Jungleberi and Jungleberi-Haridwar routes pause briefly along the bypass to pick up passengers, locals insist these buses should loop through Uhal Chowk as before. Passengers said they are most troubled by the unpredictability of bus stops. With no clear information about which side buses will arrive from or where they will halt, people are left guessing—often standing for hours by the roadside. The bypass lacks

even basic amenities like rain shelters, exposing passengers to harsh sun or rain. Local shopkeepers at the old Uhal Chowk have also voiced their concern, demanding urgent repairs and resurfacing of the link road in the area. They urged authorities to open the road fully, improve its condition, and issue strict directives requiring all local and long-route buses to pass through the original Uhal Chowk route.

# BKU delegation meets DC about irregularities in wheat weighing

A delegation of officials of Bhartiya Kisan Union (BKU) reached the Mini Secretariat and met the District Deputy Commissioner and Additional Deputy Commissioner separately to inform them about the irregularities detected in wheat weighing in the grain markets last day. After meeting the officials, BKU State President Ratanman while talking to the journalists said that the government machinery is proving unsuccessful in advocating the interests of the farmers during the current wheat procurement season in the grain markets. The government machinery is sitting comfortably and watching the spectacle of farmers being looted. It seems that there is no one to take care of the farmers. The farmers included in the delegation gathered in the Mini Secretariat premises and also demonstrated vigorously by raising slogans of Kisan Ekta Zindabad. The farmer leaders said in one voice that every worker of BKU will not let the interests of the



farmers be harmed.

Recently a team of BKU officials had checked the wheat weighing work going on in the grain market of Karnal and Kunjpura. The sacks of wheat were found to be more than the weight prescribed by the government. Ratanman said that the government machinery is making frequent visits to the mandis every day in connection with the pur-

chase of wheat. But even after this, the commission agents and other people who overweigh are not stopping in any way. He said that instead of showing off in the mandis, the government machinery should go to the mandis honestly and work on the ground. Ratanman appealed to the farmers to be alert at the time of weighing in the grain mandis and get their heaps weighed. There is

no need to get unnecessarily pressurized by anyone. Farmer leader Maan said that the BKU teams of all the districts have been put on high alert. Expressing apprehension, he told the DC that mischievous people in the grain mandis may get angry with the BKU teams over the issue of weighing etc. and create a quarrel.

DC Uttam Singh assured the BKU delegation that farmers will not be allowed to face any kind of problem. Departmental action will also be taken against the concerned employees for overweighing. DC Uttam Singh has authorized the district's Additional Deputy Commissioner Yash Jaluka to take action in the matter of weighing irregularities.
