Houses of two LeT terrorists suspected in Pahalgam attack **destroyed** in blast

Twin blasts destroyed the residential houses of two Lashkar-e-Taiba (LeT) militants, suspected to be involved in the Pahalgam terror attack, in south Kashmir's Pulwama and Anantnag districts, officials said on Friday.

According to officials, the houses belonged to Asif Sheikh of Monaghama area in Tral, Pulwama, and Adil Hussain Thokar from Anantnag. The structures were razed to the ground during the intervening night of Thursday and Friday due to explosions.

A senior police officer said the houses were extensively damaged, due to the presence of explosive material.

"During searches by security forces at both locations, some suspicious objects were found. Sensing potential danger, the forces quickly retreated for safety.



Pakistan Defence Minister admits support for terror groups

NEW DELHI: The truth about Pakistan is out of the bag, with its defence minister admitting that Pakistan has been funding and backing terrorist groups. In a video clip that has now gone viral, Pakistan's defence minister is in conversation with Sky News's Yalda Hakim, when she asks him, "But you do admit, you do admit, sir, that Pakistan has had a long history of backing and supporting and training and funding these terrorist organisations?" Khwaja Asif in his reply says, "We have been doing this dirty work for the United States for about 3 decades... and the west, including Britain... That was a mistake, and we suffered for that, and that is why you are saying this to me. If we had not joined the war against the Soviet Union and later on the war after 9/11, Pakistan's track record was unimpeachable."

The Pakistani Defence Minister has also in the interview with Sky News presenter Yalda Hakim warned of an "all-out war" possible with India. Asif's statement lays bare the fact that Pakistan, for many years, has been harbouring these terror groups.

Shortly after, massive blasts occurred, resulting in significant damage to the houses," the officer said. Local residents in Tral, however, claimed that the explosion at Sheikh's house took place after the family had been evacuated by the forces. The two militants whose homes were destroyed are believed to be part of the group that carried out the deadly attack on tourists at Baisaran.

Identify Pak nationals, ensure their return : Amit Shah to CMs

Union Home Minister Amit Shah on Friday called up the chief ministers of all the states and asked them to ensure that no Pakistani stays in India beyond the deadline set for leaving the country, sources said.

India on Thursday announced revoking all visas issued to Pakistani nationals from April 27 and advised Indian nationals residing in Pakistan to return home at the earliest, as tensions between the two countries escalated over the Pahalgam terror attack that killed 26 people, mostly tourists, on Tuesday.

The home minister personally called up the chief ministers of all the states and asked them to ensure that no Pakistani stays in India beyond the deadline, sources said.

The chief ministers



were also told to identify the Pakistani nationals staying in their respective areas and ensure their deportation, the sources said.

The revocation of visas does not apply to the long-term visas already issued to Hindu Pakistani nationals, which "remain valid".

India announced suspending visa services to Pakistani nationals with immediate effect over the cross-border links to the Pahalgam attack, the worst

terror strike targeting civilians in the country since the 26/11 Mumbai terror attack.

In addition, the government on Wednesday announced that Pakistani nationals will not be permitted to travel to India under the SAARC visa exemption scheme (SVES) and any Pakistani national currently in India under the SVES visa has 48 hours to leave the country. The deadline ends Friday.

Supreme Court raps Rahul Gandhi for 'irresponsible' remarks on Savarkar

The Supreme Court on Friday censured Congress leader Rahul Gandhi for "irresponsible" remarks on Vinayak Damodar Savarkar at a rally in Maharashtra but stayed the criminal proceedings against him.

A bench of Justices Dipankar Datta and Manmohan said, "Let's not mock our freedom fighters."

The bench further asked senior advocate Abhishek Singhvi, appearing for Gandhi, whether he knew that even Mahatma Gandhi used the words such as "your faithful servant" in his communications to the Britishers. When Singhvi argued charges of promoting enmity and public mischief were not made out against Gandhi, the bench remarked, "You are most obedient... does your

client know that Mahatma Gandhi also used 'your faithful servant' while addressing the viceroy? Can Mahatma Gandhi be called a 'servant of Britishers' merely because he addressed himself to the viceroy as 'your servant'. In those days, even I have seen, our judges of the Calcutta High Court used to address Chief Justice as writing 'your servant'."



Hry CM flags off 'Drug-Free Haryana Cyclothon 2.0' from Jind

SC refuses to cancel bail of Bikram Singh Majithia

The Supreme Court on Friday dismissed a petition filed by the State of Punjab challenging the regular bail granted to Shiromani Akali Dal leader Bikram Singh Majithia in a high-profile drug case.

A Bench comprising Justice J.K. Maheshwari and Justice Aravind Kumar upheld the Punjab and Haryana High Court's

August 10, 2022, order granting bail, while also issuing strong directions to prevent public commentary on the ongoing investigation.

The Court, while refusing to interfere with the bail order, made it clear that neither should the Special Investigation Team (SIT) nor Majithia make any public statements related to the investigation or court proceedings.

MP Malvinder Singh Kang joins Kar Sewa of Shri Ram Mandir in Kharar

Undeterred by the searing heat, Malvinder Singh Kang, Lok Sabha MP from Sri Anandpur Sahib, demonstrated deep spiritual commitment by participating barefoot in the ongoing Kar Sewa of the Shri Ram Mandir currently under construction in Kharar. In a gesture reflecting devotion and humility, Kang removed his shoes and socks inside his vehicle, far from the temple, and walked barefoot to the site to join the volunteer service.

On reaching the temple grounds, Kang performed a parikrama of the temple-in-progress and took part in the construction activity by pouring concrete into a pillar on the first floor. Accompanying him on the occasion were Advocate Antar Singh Brar, Market Committee Chairman Hakim Singh, Jatinder Rana, Vikas Chadda, Dr. M.S. Sandhu, Rupinder Singh Brar, Sanjay Kumar, Municipal Councillors Ram Swaroop and Vineet Jain, Anil Kansal, and several other supporters.

Speaking to the gathering, Kang expressed happiness over the Punjab Government's efforts in



restoring the historically significant Maharaja Aji Sarovar, believed to be connected to the lineage of Lord Ram. He shared that nearly 8 crore had been allocated for the site's development, which includes the construction of a restaurant, a roundabout, a statue platform for Lord Ram, and a temple. Stone pitching has also been completed around the statue and temple area.

He noted with pride that people from all communities, cutting across caste and political boundaries, are coming together to build the temple. Once complete, he said, the Shri Ram Mandir will become a revered pilgrimage site, attracting visitors from across Punjab and beyond.

Kang affirmed that the Punjab Government stands firmly behind the project and will not permit any interference in its completion. He further mentioned having urged Punjab Chief Minister Bhagwant Mann to personally visit the site. Highlighting the site's historical importance, Kang referred to ancient idols discovered during the excavation of the sarovar—believed to date back to the Ramayana era—which have now been preserved by the temple management.

Former ISRO chief K Kasturirangan passes away in Bengaluru

NEW DELHI: Former ISRO chief and chairperson of drafting committee behind the ambitious new National Education Policy (NEP) K Kasturirangan passed away in Bengaluru on Friday, officials said. He was 84. "He left for heavenly abode this morning at his residence in Bengaluru. His body will be kept at Raman Research Institute (RRI) for paying last respects on April 27," the officials said.

BJP's Raja Iqbal Singh elected new Mayor Of Delhi

NEW DELHI: BJP leader Raja Iqbal Singh has been elected the new mayor of Delhi, winning after getting 133 votes against his Congress opponent's eight. The Aam Aadmi Party had decided to boycott the elections. The Congress nominee was Mandeep Singh. Jai Bhagwan Yadav of the BJP is also the new deputy mayor after the Congress' Ariba Khan withdrew her name. With Friday's victory, the BJP has come to power in the Municipal Corporation of Delhi after two years. The success comes after the party's thumping win in the Delhi Assembly elections in which it won 48 of 70 seats, reducing the AAP to just 22 from its earlier tally of 62. The fact that the BJP is also in power at the Centre has given rise to talk of a 'triple-engine government' of the party in the national capital. The current strength of the Municipal Corporation of Delhi is 238 and 12 seats are vacant because some councillors got elected as MLAs and another as an MP. The BJP has 117 councillors - up from 104 in 2022 - while the AAP has 113, down from 134.

Centre defends Waqf law, says it regulates secular aspects only

NEW DELHI: In a significant development in the ongoing challenge to the Waqf (Amendment) Act, 2025, the Union government has filed its preliminary affidavit before the Supreme Court, strongly defending the constitutional validity of the legislation. Filed through the Ministry of Minority Affairs, the Centre rejected arguments that the amendments violate fundamental rights under the Constitution, particularly those under Articles 25 and 26. The affidavit, submitted by Joint Secretary Shersha C. Saidik Mohiddin, emphasizes that the amendments are aimed solely at regulating the secular aspects of waqf property management, and do not interfere with religious freedoms or Islamic rituals. "The Act pertains only to procedural and administrative dimensions such as record-keeping and governance of waqf properties. It avoids interference with any essential religious practices, rituals, or obligations," the affidavit clarifies.

Morinda city observes complete shutdown in protest against killing of tourists in Pahalgam

MORINDA: In a strong show of solidarity and protest against the brutal killing of unarmed tourists by terrorists in Pahalgam, Morinda city observed a complete shutdown today. Punjab govt suspends vigilance bureau Chief, AIG & SSP after delay in RTO scam action

CHANDIGARH, APR 25

In a strong move against corruption, the Punjab government has suspended the Chief Director of the Vigilance Bureau, SPS Parmar, SSP Jalandhar Range Harpreet Singh and AIG Flying Squad-1 Swarndeep Singh for failing to take timely action in a major scam involving illegal driving licenses.

Earlier this month, the Vigilance Bureau had conducted state-wide raids at several Regional Transport Officer (RTO) offices and driving test centres. It was found that many licenses were being issued without proper driving tests, through agents who were taking bribes from applicants. A total of 16 FIRs were registered and 24 people were arrested, including private

agents and some government staff. Investigations revealed that agents were bypassing the automated driving test system in multiple ways. Punjab has 32 automated tracks where driving tests are recorded on video and scored digitally.

Agents, in collusion with RTO officials, were copy-pasting old video footage of candidates who had passed and uploading it under the names of new applicants who never actually took the test. In many cases, the same vehicle was used multiple times, raising suspicion. Proxy drivers were also used to take tests on behalf of others, using vehicles arranged by agents. Despite having access to this evidence, the Vigilance Bureau failed to escalate the probe to higher-level officers or make timely

arrests. During the investigation, names of senior transport officers also came up. While one officer - Ramandeep Singh Dhillon - was arrested, two others, Pardeep Singh Dhillon, RTO Mohali and Ravinder Kumar Bansal, RTO SBS Nagar, are currently on the run. Despite the availability of evidence, no immediate action was taken against these officers. SPS Parmar, who headed the Vigilance Bureau, was issued a show cause notice for this delay. However, even after the notice, no meaningful action followed. The continued inaction raised serious concerns within the government. It is also suspected that information may have been leaked from within the Vigilance Bureau, allowing the accused to flee.

Army Chief General Upendra Dwivedi
reviews security situation in Srinagar

Amid the rising tension between India and Pakistan over the Pahalgam terror attack, Indian Army Chief General Upendra Dwivedi, for the first time, reached Jammu and Kashmir's Srinagar and reviewed the security situation of the Union Territory.

Upon his arrival, the 15 Corps Commander briefed him about the ongoing security situation and he met with senior Army commanders deployed in the Kashmir Valley, along with officials from other security agencies.

The Indian Army Chief General was also briefed on the actions being taken by the formations against terrorists



inside own territory and Pakistan Army's attempts to violate the ceasefire along the LoC. Earlier today, Pakistan Army troops opened fire at some places along the Line of Control (LoC), prompting an immediate retaliation from the Indian Army, officials said.

"Small Air Firing at

some places on Line of Control initiated by the Pakistan Army. Effectively responded to by the Indian Army. No casualties," Indian Army officials said. Earlier on April 22, terrorists attacked tourists at Baisaran meadow in Pahalgam, killing 25 Indian nationals and one Nepali

citizen while leaving several others injured. The Indian Army is on a high alert, launching several search operations to neutralise the terrorists following the attack in Pahalgam on April 22, in which 26 people were killed. Following the terror attack, the Central government announced several diplomatic measures, such as closing the Integrated Check Post (ICP) at Attari, suspending the SAARC Visa Exemption Scheme (SVES) for Pakistani nationals, giving them 40 hours to return to their country, and reducing the number of officers in the High Commissions on both sides.

"The Defence/Military, Naval and Air Advisors in the Pakistani High Commission in New Delhi are declared Persona Non Grata. They

have a week to leave India. India will withdraw its own Defence, Navy, and Air Advisors from the Indian High Commission in Islamabad. These posts in the respective High Commissions are deemed annulled. Five support staff of the Service Advisors will also be withdrawn from both High Commissions," Foreign Secretary Vikram Misri said.

He also mentioned that the Integrated Check Post at Attari will be closed with immediate effect. India also halted the Indus Waters Treaty signed in 1960 in the wake of the Pahalgam attack.

The incident has sparked nationwide outrage, with widespread protests erupting across the country, demanding stricter action against Pakistan over the Pahalgam attack.

Trade talks formed the core of the visit to India by the vice-president of the United States of America, J.D. Vance. However, another issue — the plight of Indian students facing the brunt of Donald Trump’s assault on immigration and education — demands engagement between India and the US. Indian students form one of the largest constituencies among the fraternity of foreign students in American higher educational institutions. Therefore, it is not surprising that a disproportionate number of students inconvenienced by the interventions of the US state department and the US immigration and customs enforcement in the form of visa revocations as well as the termination of their legal status are from India. It has been reported that of the 327 cases of visa revocations and terminations of student and exchange visitor information system records collected by the American Immigration Lawyers Association from attorneys, students and university officials, as many as 50% pertained to Indian students. A separate data set also indicates that there has been a perceptible drop in the number of Indian students in campuses across not just the US but also the United Kingdom and Canada in the last four years. The tightening of immigration rules, caps on student intake — especially in Canada and the UK — as well as restrictions on dependent visas have been cited as the principal reasons behind this decline.

Hearteningly, in some instances, adversely affected international students — a group of Indian and Chinese students is one example — have mounted a legal challenge against Mr Trump’s purge. They would be encouraged by the fact that as many as 133 foreign students, whose SEVIS status had been annulled, have received judicial relief that has enabled them to get their SEVIS records restored. But legal protection cannot be a way out of the crisis. A resolution necessitates engagement at the highest political level to prevent bona fide international students from being subjected to harassment and unlawful institutional scrutiny; legitimate academic careers must proceed unimpeded. The consequences of a dip in Indian students in American campuses would be felt by both the US and India. More than one million international students, data from NAFSA: Association for International Educators in Washington D.C. suggest, contributed \$40.1 billion to the American economy in the 2022-2023 academic year. Hawkish policies in the US, on the other hand, would deny many Indians a shot at a rewarding educational experience.

Gold will remain most optimal hedge in 2025-26

Global investment banking giant JP Morgan has reaffirmed its bullish stance on gold, projecting it as the most optimal hedge through 2025 and 2026 amid mounting risks of stagflation, recession, currency debasement, and U.S. policy uncertainties.

"For investors, we think gold remains one of the most optimal hedges for the unique combination of stagflation, recession, debasement and US policy risks facing markets in 2025 and 2026.", said the report

The report highlighted the strong momentum in gold prices seen in the first quarter of 2025 as a clear indicator of investor sentiment.

It estimates net gold demand from investors and central banks to average around 710 tonnes per quarter this year, well above the 350-tonne threshold needed to maintain price stability.

According to the analysis, a 100-tonne increase in quarterly demand could push prices up by 2 percent. It also forecasts that central banks will purchase approximately 900 tonnes of gold in 2025, with investor appetite—particularly from exchange-traded funds (ETFs) and Chinese buyers—expected to grow.

As the first responder to the devastating earthquake on March 28, India has provided over 750 metric tons of relief material, including medical aid, food, shelters.

Incessant Pakistan... The Enduring Indian Dilemma

The recent terror attacks in Pahalgam have once again brought to light enduring strategic and cultural challenges deeply embedded within Indian leadership—issues that are ever-present, yet often escape sustained attention in our routine discourse.

The Policy Incongruity .

India’s approach to Kashmir has long suffered from a persistent inconsistency—a dichotomy between policy and execution. While Pakistan’s government and military have displayed a steady and unyielding posture, our own stance has oscillated between tactical improvisation and political indecision basically due to change in govts and their respective ideologies . This ‘trial-and-error’ method has eroded our credibility, undermined strategic clarity and hindered our ability to manage the conflict with wisdom and foresight. In matters of national security, coherence between policy intent and operational action is non-negotiable despite change of guard at the helm.

The Capability-Willingness Antinomy.

The discourse around capability often

serves as a convenient alibi. Veterans, social media pundits and even senior military officials frequently engage in spirited debates about our military capacity to confront Pakistan. For instance, if we were to consider a limited war on the western front—while handling other fronts diplomatically—many would quickly assert our incapacity to deliver a decisive blow. But is that truly the reason we shy away from hard options?

Even if 40% of Pakistan’s forces were engaged with internal challenges—TTP, Afghanistan, the Baloch insurgency—leaving them with only 60% capability against us, would we act? Likely not. The core issue lies not in capability alone, but in the will—the mental and strategic resolve—of our leadership, both political and military. For over 75 years, history offers no dearth of such examples. Hence, the debate over ‘capability-building first or willpower first’ is a false dichotomy. Like the two hands of a clock, capability and will must work in tandem—without either, the mechanism fails.

The Pitfalls of Misplaced Democratic Dogma .

In our eagerness to uphold democrac-

tic values, we often elevate the discredited to positions of power. A diseased body requires treatment, not cosmetic empowerment. Democracy, in and of itself, is not a cure-all—especially when the ailment is strategic myopia festered by mercenary political gains . In such cases, democracy, when misapplied, becomes a placebo—ineffective and, at times, even detrimental as in case of J&K .

Strategic Issues, Tactical Sympt-

oms India’s challenge is fundamentally strategic, yet our reactions remain tactical. We rush to patch operational holes without addressing the strategic void. The misalignment between long-term objectives and short-term actions continues to hinder our ability to respond decisively and shape outcomes proactively.

A problem left to fester doesn’t stay a bruise—it turns into cancer.

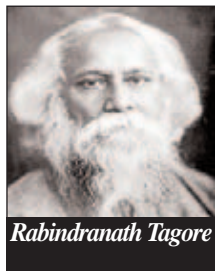

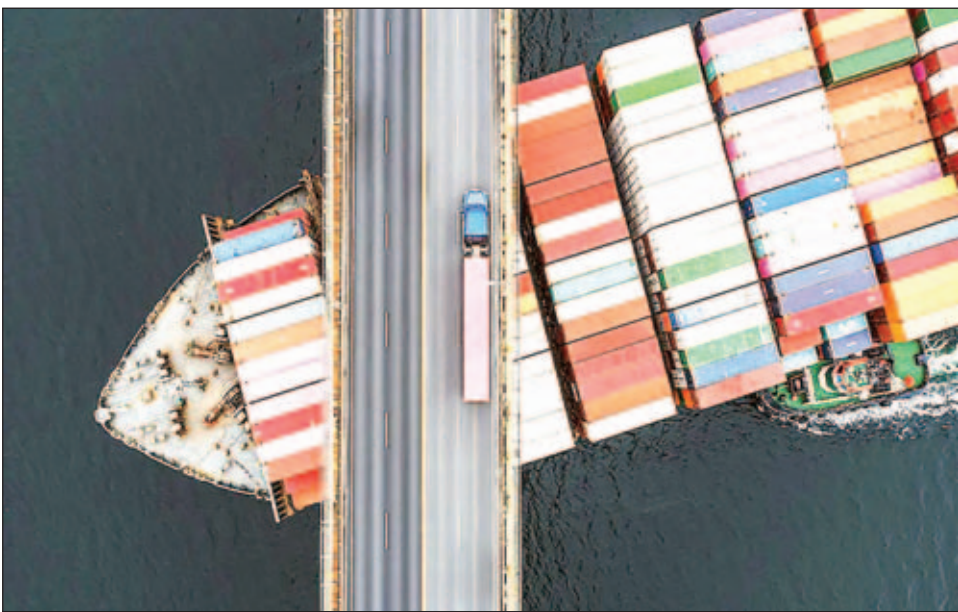
As India halts trade, Pakistan may try to source Indian goods at higher prices

Following the recent terror attack in Pahalgam, India has officially halted all trade with Pakistan, further escalating tensions between the two countries.

However, according to the Global Trade Research Initiative (GTRI), this border closure is expected to stop only formal trade, not demand. Pakistan is likely to try to continue sourcing Indian goods indirectly through third countries, though at a higher cost.

GTRI mentioned that trade relations between India and Pakistan have remained strained since the Pulwama attack in February 2019. At the time, India revoked Pakistan's Most Favoured Nation (MFN) status and imposed a steep 200 per cent duty on its imports.

It said, "In short, border closures halt formal trade—but not demand. Pakistan will continue sourcing Indian goods, just



at a higher cost and through third countries". In response, Pakistan suspended

all bilateral trade with India by August 2019. Since then, formal trade has large-

ly been suspended, with only a few exports from India—mainly medicines—allowed on humanitarian grounds.

Despite the official trade freeze, India exported goods worth USD 447.7 million to Pakistan in the current fiscal year (April 2024 to January 2025), as per official data.

These exports primarily included essential items such as pharmaceuticals (over USD 110.1 million), active pharmaceutical ingredients (APIs) worth USD 129.6 million, sugar valued at USD 85.2 million, auto parts worth USD 12.8 million, and fertilisers worth USD 6 million.

In contrast, India's imports from Pakistan were negligible, amounting to just USD 0.42 million. These imports included niche agricultural items, such as figs worth USD 78,000, and herbs like basil and rosemary, valued at USD 18,856.

Although formal trade channels are now completely closed, pakistan will try to continue the imports through informal routes via third countries. GTRI estimates that nearly USD 10 billion worth of trade still takes place through re-export routes, mainly via the United Arab Emirates and Singapore.

Pakistan reportedly imports several Indian products through these third countries, including pharmaceuticals, chemicals, cotton, tea, coffee, dyes, onions, tomatoes, iron, steel, sugar, salt, and auto parts.

On the other hand, India may receive goods like Himalayan pink salt and dry fruits such as dates, apricots, and almonds from Pakistan through similar indirect routes.

The current move is expected to raise the cost of such goods in Pakistan while also complicating supply chains.

Over 83,000 tobacco farmers to benefit as Centre extends validity of licenses to 3 years

NEW DELHI : The Centre has decided to renew the Certificate of Registration

for Virginia tobacco growers and the license for operation of a barn for 3 years instead of a year as at present in order to

reduce the burden of mandatory yearly renewal for over 83,000 tobacco farmers in the country, the Commerce and Industry Ministry announced on Tuesday.

This means the registrations/licenses will be valid for 3 years instead of the existing practice of renewing them every year as part of the government's policy to facilitate the ease of doing business, the ministry said in a statement.

"To facilitate the growers to renew this registration/licenses once in 3 years, the Government of India has amended the sub-rule(5), (6) and (7) of rule 33 and sub-rule (2) and (3) of rule 34N, of the Tobacco Board Rules, 1976. The amendment to the aforementioned Tobacco Board Rules,1976, was published in the Gazette

of India by the Ministry of Commerce and Industry. The same will be effective from the 2025-26 crop season in Andhra Pradesh," the statement said. The amendment of increasing the periodicity from one to three years will be of great help to around 83,500 farmers covering around 91,000 barns in renewing their registrations/licenses across Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, Telangana and Odisha states, the statement said.

Virginia tobacco is being regulated in India by an Act of Parliament- the Tobacco Board Act, 1975 and the rules notified thereunder. As per the Tobacco Board Act, 1975 and Rules notified thereunder, every grower intending to take up cultivation of Virginia tobacco has to obtain a certificate of registration

as a grower and a license for operation of a barn. Accordingly, the Tobacco Board is facilitating registration and licensing. India is the second largest producer and fourth largest exporter of unmanufactured tobacco

in the World in value terms. Tobacco exports contributed \$1.979 million (Rs 16,728 crore) to the Indian exchequer during the financial year 2024-25, the statement added.

On World Malaria Day, health officials urge prevention during summer season



Ladwa(Vijay Kaushik): A public awareness session was held at the Community Health Centre (CHC) Ladwa on the occasion of World Malaria Day. Senior Medical Officer Dr. Krishan Kant addressed the gathering, emphasizing that the summer season is particularly conducive to mosquito-borne illnesses such as malaria, dengue, and Japanese encephalitis. He highlighted that if a mosquito bites an infected person and then a healthy one, it can transmit the infection. Japanese encephalitis, if it reaches the brain, can even prove fatal. Dr. Krishan Kant urged people to wear full-sleeved clothing, avoid stagnant water near their homes, fill potholes with soil, and ensure regular cleaning of drains. He recommended adding the larvicide Temefos to drains and keeping water tanks, coolers, and plant pots clean. Declaring one dry day every week was also advised to eliminate breeding grounds for mosquitoes. People were cautioned to look out for symptoms such as fever, vomiting, dizziness, chills, and joint pain, and to visit their nearest health centre for blood testing if these appear. Dr. Krishan Kant reiterated that CHC Ladwa offers quality healthcare services and encouraged residents to make full use of them.

He said that the treatment of this disease is 100 percent possible; it can be cured after 6 months of dots of anti-TB medicines.

Measures to prevent malaria: Use mosquito net while sleeping to avoid mosquitoes. Do not allow waterlogging in and around the house. Wear clothes that cover the whole body, use mosquito repellent cream or spray. Ensure fogging around the house. Consult a doctor immediately as soon as malaria is confirmed. Malaria is treatable. The government provides free malaria tests and medicines at primary health centers. Malaria can be completely prevented with timely tests and treatment.
